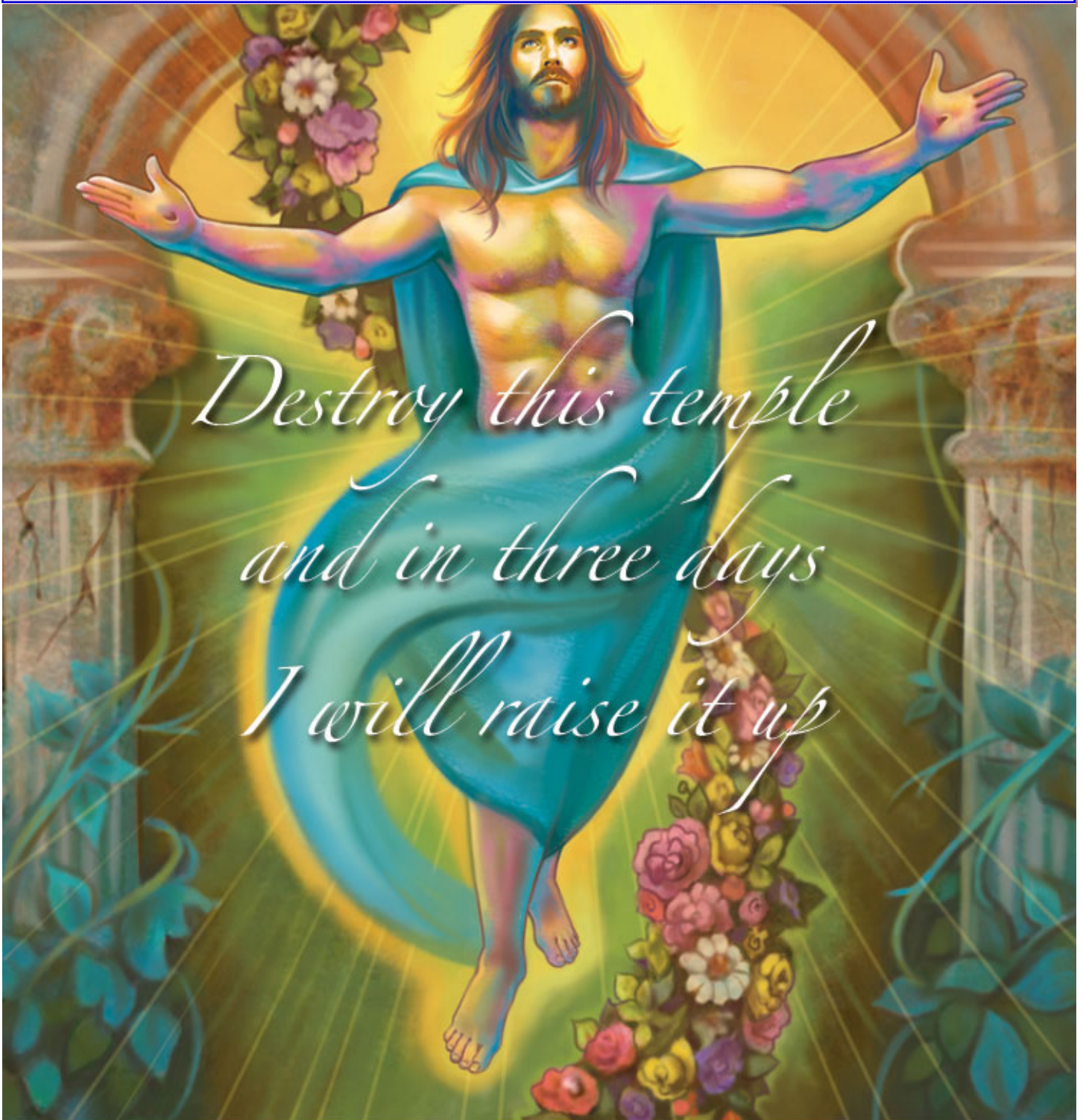

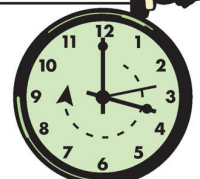

FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Good Friday are days of **Fasting**. Catholics between the ages of 18-59 are permitted one full meal and two lesser meals per day (which together should not equal one full meal). With no eating between meals.

All Fridays of Lent are days of **Abstinence**. Catholics who are 14 years or older should abstain from meat entirely. Soups and gravies made from meat are permitted.

Mediterranean-Style Eggplant Pasta

- 1 eggplant, cut into 3/4-inch slices salt as needed
- 9 ounces pappardelle pasta (wide fettuccine noodles)
- 3 tablespoons olive oil, divided
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 teaspoons dried oregano
- 1 (18 ounce) can crushed tomatoes
- 1 tablespoon red wine vinegar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon white sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 pound fresh buffalo mozzarella cheese, torn into pieces
- 1/2 cup chopped fresh basil, or more to taste

**Directions**

Prep 10 mins Cook 35 mins Ready in 55 mins

1. Arrange eggplant slices in a colander and sprinkle with enough salt to lightly coat; drain for about 10 minutes. Rinse eggplant and pat dry with paper towels. Chop eggplant into cubes.
2. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Cook pappardelle at a boil until tender yet firm to the bite, about 10 to 11 minutes; drain.
3. Heat 1 1/2 tablespoons olive oil in a skillet over medium heat; cook and stir eggplant, adding more oil if eggplant gets dry, until browned, 5 to 10 minutes. Transfer eggplant to a bowl, reserving oil in the skillet.
4. Heat remaining oil in the same skillet; cook and stir onion and garlic until golden, about 10 minutes. Return eggplant to skillet and season with oregano; cook and stir for 1 minute more.
5. Mix tomatoes, vinegar, salt, sugar, and black pepper into eggplant mixture; cover skillet and simmer sauce until eggplant is softened, about 10 minutes. Mix sauce with pasta in a bowl; top with mozzarella cheese and basil.

Cook's Note:

Salting the eggplant in the colander can be skipped, but will ensure that any bitter taste is removed and will reduce the amount of oil absorbed during frying. It's not necessary to peel the eggplant. Substitute 2 tablespoons from oregano for the dried, if desired. Balsamic vinegar can be used in place of red wine vinegar, if desired.

Liturgical Corner**Could you walk a mile in Jesus's shoes?**

The Stations of the Cross bring us closer to Christ as we meditate on the great love He showed for us in His most sorrowful Passion!

You can pray the Stations of the Cross (also known as the Way of the Cross) alone at any time, but people most often pray them in a group setting Friday nights during Lent.

Tradition traces this loving tribute to our Lord back to the Blessed Mother's retracing her son's last steps along what became known as the Via Dolorosa (the Sorrowful Way) on His way to His Crucifixion at Calvary in Jerusalem.

Pilgrims to the Holy Land commemorated Christ's Passion in a similar manner as early as the 4th century A.D. The Stations of the Cross developed as a devotion in earnest, however, around the 13th to 14th centuries.

It became a way of allowing those who could not make the long, expensive, arduous journey to Jerusalem to make a pilgrimage in prayer, at least, in their church! Although the original number of stations varied greatly, they became fixed at 14 stations in the 18th century.

The Stations of the Cross themselves are represented by a series of 14 sculptures covering our Lord's Passion and they are meant to be "stopping points" along the journey for prayer and meditation.

When we give up our favorite foods, we empty ourselves and make room for God.

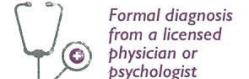
