Bishop Felipe Estévez Provides Update on Coronavirus Response for Catholics in the Diocese of St. Augustine

Jacksonville, Fla. – Bishop Felipe Estévez has announced new liturgical accommodations to limit the spread of the COVID-19 (coronavirus) among the faith community of the 17-county region of the Diocese of St. Augustine. His response follows:

“Out of pastoral concern for the health and wellbeing of our Catholic community, and by my authority as the bishop to dispense from universal ecclesiastical laws, I dispense from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass:

- All who are sick and those who are caring for them
- Those who because of age or infirmity are at higher risk for contracting the coronavirus
- Those who have been exposed to the coronavirus because of travel or other circumstances.

This dispensation is valid for as long as any of the above-referenced conditions continue. And to further protect public health and calm fears, I also dispense all the Catholic faithful from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass during the remaining weeks of March. This dispensation will allow any who are concerned to stay home and avoid public gatherings of 10 or more people in cooperation with civil authorities. As this continues to be a fluid situation, additional updates will be available on the diocesan website (dosafl.com), social media, and news releases to local media.”

The coronavirus is causing hardship for our people and our parishes, both spiritually and financially. Our churches will remain open during the day for the faithful who want to visit and pray. Your parish brings you the light of Christ. Please help keep the light shining by giving through your parish’s online program, app, or mail an offering to your parish office.

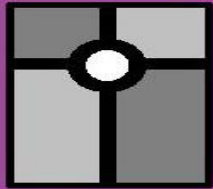

No Public Stations of the Cross Until further Notice

All Fridays in Lent are days of **Abstinence**. Catholics who are 14 years or older should abstain from meat entirely.

Good Friday is a day of **Fasting**. Catholics between the ages of 18-59 are permitted one full meal and two lesser meals per day (which together should not equal one full meal). With no eating between meals.

LENT IS HERE!!

As we prepare for Lent, let's focus our hearts on the three most important aspects: prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Through **PRAYER**, we encounter Christ, present in the faces of every member of our human family, so often still walking that long road to Calvary.

Through **FASTING**, we encounter our own obstacles, those things about ourselves that prevent us from loving God and neighbor.

Through **ALMSGIVING**, we encounter our brothers and sisters around the world, asking what we can give up so that others might have life to the fullest.

Did you know?

Did you know that you can obtain a particular indulgence by visiting our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament for any length of time.

- ◆ Why not give your **TIME**?
-Make a Commitment to spend time, even a few minutes in Adoration, before the Blessed Sacrament, once a week.

- ◆ Give your **TREASURE**!
-Give something (money) extra to those in need.

- ◆ Your **TALENT**!
-Whatever Talents God has blessed you with, should be shared with others.

- ◆ Your **FOOD!** (Fasting)
-When we give up our favorite foods, we empty ourselves and make room for GOD.

This **LENT** – do **ANY OF** or **ALL** on this list and watch your growth in Holiness!

Today's Gospel asks, 'who is really blind?' The beggar has been blind from birth. He is now an adult. He is a symbol of us all. We find ourselves existing. But what is the purpose of life? Is there any reason for my birth or is it an accident? What should I do with my life? What happens when I die? Is there anyone to whom I will have to give an account?

The list of questions goes on. No answers are given. We have to look for the answers ourselves. Different philosophies give different answers, like dropping a coin into a blind man's begging bowl. Is there anyone who can give us sight?

Jesus puts clay on the blind man's eyes and sends him to the pool of Siloam. He comes back with sight. He doesn't know Jesus, only his name. His neighbors can't believe their eyes and discuss whether he is the beggar or not. He settles the issue, 'yes, I am'.

It was a Sabbath. 'It is forbidden to make clay and put it on his eyes'. Yet something doesn't strike his neighbors: never had a man born blind received sight by washing in Siloam. They are worried about breaking the Sabbath and take him to the Pharisees. They ask him how it happened. He tells them but they begin to argue among themselves. 'He has broken the Sabbath. He must be a sinner'.

The man sees light after a lifetime of darkness. He can now see and keeps on repeating his story. When asked his opinion about Jesus, he draws the conclusion: 'he is a prophet'. The Jewish authorities rather than agreeing prefer to deny the blindness. They call his parents. Weak and fearful as they are, they admit that he was blind. So, what to do now?

The authorities refuse to draw the obvious conclusion. They call the man again. They say, we know he is a sinner, but he sticks to his experience. He sees a prophet in Jesus. Seeing they can't deny the evidence and not wishing to accept Jesus, they abuse him and ridicule him and throw him out.

Jesus looks for him. 'Do you believe in the Son of Man?' He says; who is he Lord that I may believe in him'. "I am", Jesus says. Then he falls down and worships Jesus.

He progressed from physical blindness through physical sight to spiritual sight and the adoration of Jesus as Lord. Whereas the authorities have passed from 'sight' as Moses' disciples to spiritual blindness because 'they hardened their hearts as at Meribah, as on the day of Massah in the desert.'

Have we 'seen' Jesus? Though we may have 'faith', have we met Jesus? Have you experienced Him? Have you experienced the opening of your eyes by Jesus? He says, "I am the light of the world."

I have an earnest appeal in the context of the Epidemic of Corona Virus forcing the world 'House arrest' and 'shut down' of all community activities. Every department of Government, NGOs and Voluntary bodies are doing their might to fight against and protect people from its possible attack. The current 15 days are said to be very critical for the world. As Catholics we have, not only more responsibility but also more privilege to intercede through fervent prayer. As part of our spiritual contribution we should contribute our mite by praying for the world, for our Nation, our Diocese and our Parish.

"Let us pray for all who are sick, as well as doctors, nurses, caregivers, and all those working hard to combat the disease. We should also remember those whose lives have been otherwise disrupted, especially anyone who has lost income from a loss of work during this difficult time."

Parish Youths will be hosting an Easter Egg Hunt for the little ones on Easter Sunday immediately following the 11AM Mass.

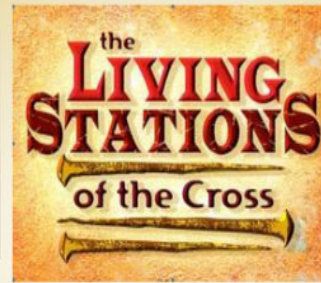

Did you know with the help of a Step Up For Students scholarship, you could afford to send your child to a Catholic school near you?



Step Up For Students has scholarship programs for Florida schoolchildren, including scholarships for children from lower-income families and for children with certain special needs.

Income-Based Scholarships

Two scholarships are available for lower-income students: the **Florida Tax Credit Scholarship** and **Family Empowerment Scholarship**. Both scholarships give students an option to find the best schools to meet their K-12 learning needs.

Special Needs Scholarship

The **Gardiner Scholarship** helps Florida families customize education for their children with certain special needs who are ages 3 through 22. The scholarship covers 17 diagnoses, including autism spectrum disorder, Down syndrome, intellectual disability, spina bifida and traumatic brain injury. Parents can use scholarship money toward a combination of approved programs and providers that best meet their children's unique learning needs.

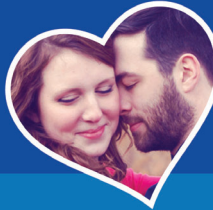
