PLENARY INDULGENCE

The Granting of Special Indulgences to the Faithful in the Current COVID-19 Pandemic

As Vicar of Christ and the Holy Father, Pope Francis on 20 March 2020 promulgated through the Apostolic Penitentiary a decree which provides for the faithful to gain a **plenary indulgence** as the world faces the Coronavirus pandemic.

In summation, the **plenary indulgence** is granted as follows:

- To the faithful who are suffering from the Coronavirus
or
Who are being quarantined by order of health authorities in hospitals or in the own homes
 - (1) When with a spirit detached from any sin can be spiritually united through any media with the celebration of the Mass or by praying the Holy Rosary, the Way of the Cross or any devotion;
 - (2) Recite the Creed, the Lord's Prayer and any invocation to the Blessed Virgin Mary;
 - (3) Offering this trial in a spirit of faith in God and charity to others

and fulfill the usual conditions to obtain a plenary indulgence (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according the Holy Father's intentions as soon as possible

- To health care workers, family members of those who are ill, indeed all who expose themselves to the risk of contracting the disease as they care for the sick are granted a **plenary indulgence** under the same conditions as cited above.
- To all the faithful
 - (1) Who read Holy Scripture for at least 30 minutes, or reciting the Holy Rosary, or by making the Way of the Cross, or praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy
and
 - (2) imploring God to end the pandemic, provide relief to those who are afflicted and eternal salvation for those whom the Lord has called to Himself

are granted a **plenary indulgence** under the same conditions cited above.

- To those who find themselves unable to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and *Viaticum*, the Church entrusts each and every one to divine Mercy by virtue of the communion of saints and grants a **plenary indulgence** at the point of death provided making a recommendation for use of a cross or crucifix

the person is duly disposed and having recited a few prayers during their lifetime (In this case only, the Church makes up for the three usual conditions required.)

SUNDAY REFLECTION FROM FR AMAR

5TH SUNDAY OF LENT:

FATHER LOVED US AND SENT JESUS TO GIVE US ETERNAL LIFE.

Death is the ultimate enemy. It puts an end to everything. Let a man be king or president, terrorist or thief, death will destroy him. No one escapes. Our bodies are weak even when strong. Sickness, paralysis, decrepitude and loss of mental power are just some of the precursors of death. It looks hopeless. But Jesus is Lord and he is Savior too.

He saves from death, the death you and I must undergo, the death our loved ones have undergone. He constantly spoke of life, life in abundance. He promised 'the light of life', 'to give life to whomever he wishes' (John 5:21). He declared, 'I have come that you may have abundant life' (John 10:10). 'God sent his Son so that those who believe in him may have eternal life' (John 3:16).

Today's Gospel proclaims that Jesus conquers death and gives life. The family of Martha, Mary and Lazarus are close friends. Jesus loved them. Strange that he did not rush to save his friend but waited two more days. We cannot put God into our categories.

By the time he arrived Lazarus had been dead four days. The enemy was truly entrenched. But Jesus had said, "The dead will hear the voice of the Son of God and those who hear will live" (John 5: 28). Death itself cannot resist his Word.

When Jesus arrives, Martha goes out to meet him. She is symbolic of most of us. She believes but something is lacking in her faith. Like the Jews of her time she believes in a general resurrection 'on the last day'. It doesn't touch her. She doesn't understand who Jesus is and how he saves. He tells her 'I am the Resurrection and the Life'. Those who are close to Jesus do not taste death but enjoy life in abundance. Jesus doesn't talk of 'the last day'. He talks of the present: whoever believes has eternal life' (John 6:47).

Mary on the contrary when told Jesus is there rises immediately and rushes to him. She recognizes him as Lord and kneels at his feet. Jesus deeply moved, groans in his spirit and weeps. He is part our human situation but he intends to transform it. He will change weeping into joy – for all who come to him like Mary.

Jesus offers us so much to those who will believe in him. From our viewpoint we see one small corner of the tapestry of existence. We have no idea of what Jesus will do. With a word he called Lazarus, dead for four days. He will do far greater things for those who believe in him.

Do you know Jesus as Mary, sister of Martha, knew him? Have you experienced 'eternal life' in you now? Do you know Jesus as friend?

From our Pastor's Desk

We are all fixed in our attention on COVID – 19. It is shocking to see how the world has changed in a short time. The ‘coronavirus’ global pandemic has affected and disrupted every aspect of our lives.

The governments across the globe continue their struggle to contain the disease. The Church has also taken steps to prevent the disease by promoting self-quarantine, social distancing, and good hygiene.

The Church around the world is proclaiming the message to halt the spread of the coronavirus: nourish your spiritual life with Mass and prayer, but do it from home (we do live stream our Mass every day on Facebook and website). Catholics around the world joined Pope Francis in praying the Rosary on Thursday night to ask God to end COVID – 19. Last Sunday, Pope ventured into deserted Rome to pray at two shrines for the end of coronavirus outbreak

As the situation unfolds, nobody is in a position to tell us what to think and how to feel about this pandemic. But one thing is certain. The entire world is in a teachable moment. There is more solidarity in the world after the outbreak of coronavirus regardless of religion, nation, race, caste, color, and gender.

God uses everything that happens in our lives to teach us. God wants us to experience global solidarity. This is the time to feel solidarity. This is the time to feel someone’s pain and allow that pain to influence us and transform us. God reaches us when we allow suffering to wound us. It is by touching the wounds that we are transformed like St. Thomas the Apostle. Suffering has the potential to bring us together and to force our attention to the suffering of the most vulnerable.

Of course, these are difficult times for all of us. As we monitor through the media, we need to take the matter seriously. We cannot treat the present crisis casually and lightly. However, we should not panic either. We need to take appropriate measures to prevent the spread of this illness.

We shall weather the storm together. How? We shall acknowledge our struggle with anxiety

and fear. We shall choose to trust in the Lord. We shall spend time with the Lord in prayer, devotion, and reading the Word of God.



We shall combat fear with faith. This is what Maccabaeus said to his troops: ***“They (enemies) come with confidence in their weapons and their boldness, but we trust in the almighty God, who is able to wipe out in one stroke all who invade our land and even the whole world” (2 Mac. 8: 18).*** In Him is our strength. ***“Happy the man who trusts in the Lord, and whose confidence is in him!” (Jeremiah 14:7).***

This is the moment for us to have an unshakeable trust in God. Jesus modeled for us that unwavering trust at the time of his excruciating pain and death on the cross.

What we need to do at this time:

1. Be proactive: Let us try to be proactive in every way possible by taking necessary measures though we may not like them. It is our call today to protect ourselves and others. It is time to be vigilant and diligent in every action of our daily lives.

2. Build up your own immune system: Our community consists of people of different ages and our immune systems vary. So, it is our personal responsibility to do all what is possible within our limit to build up our immune system by taking supplements, making healthy choices, staying hydrated, and getting enough rest for the body and mind.

3. Let us pray for one another: Prayer for others and ourselves will certainly help us as people of faith. It will also build up our spiritual and emotional immunity which is very necessary at this dark time of human history.

I am praying for each of you. All of you are in my thoughts and prayers. Be assured that you are remembered in my daily Mass and prayers.

LETTER FROM BISHOP ESTEVEZ



A Letter from Bishop Felipe J. Estévez to the Catholic Community Regarding Father John H. Dux March 23, 2020

Today, I am sad to announce that I have removed the priestly faculties of Father John H. Dux, who was accused of sexual abuse of a minor when he served as a parochial vicar of St. Patrick Parish in Gainesville. Father Dux is retired and living in South Carolina. The Diocese of Charleston and the Archdiocese for Military Services-USA has been notified of his status.

The diocese received the complaint in May 2019 from an attorney acting on behalf of his client. Father Dux's faculties were suspended immediately, pending the outcome of an investigation. Information about the claim was provided to the state attorney for the 13th Judicial Circuit (Hillsborough County), where the abuse allegedly occurred in 1976. Due to the statute of limitations in Florida, the state did not initiate an investigation.

To determine the truth, and to ensure the safety and well-being of our vulnerable populations, the Diocesan Review Board conducted a thorough review of the claim. They determined there was a semblance of truth and found the allegation to be credible.

We have had no prior credible allegations of sexual misconduct with a minor against Father Dux. He was ordained to the priesthood on April 14, 1973. And while he has not been found guilty in a civil court of law, the matter is still under canonical review by the church.

If anyone has been harmed by Father Dux or any other employee of the diocese, please contact law enforcement or the Florida Department of Children and Families by calling 1-800-962-2873. You can also contact the Diocesan Victim Assistant Coordinator, Tina Nugent, by calling (904) 208-6979 or email inquiries@dosaf1.com.

The U.S. bishop's *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People* calls for a "zero tolerance" policy regarding clergy who have a confirmed or proven allegation of sexual misconduct with a minor child. I am committed to providing a safe environment for children and vulnerable adults, and no clergy or other employees will remain in ministry who is a danger to them.

I apologize for the publicity that will surround this announcement. I invite all of us to come together as a family of faith, ready to be a healing people – a forgiving and loving people as Christ calls us to be.

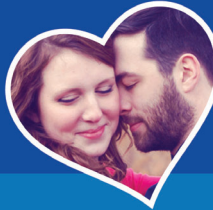
