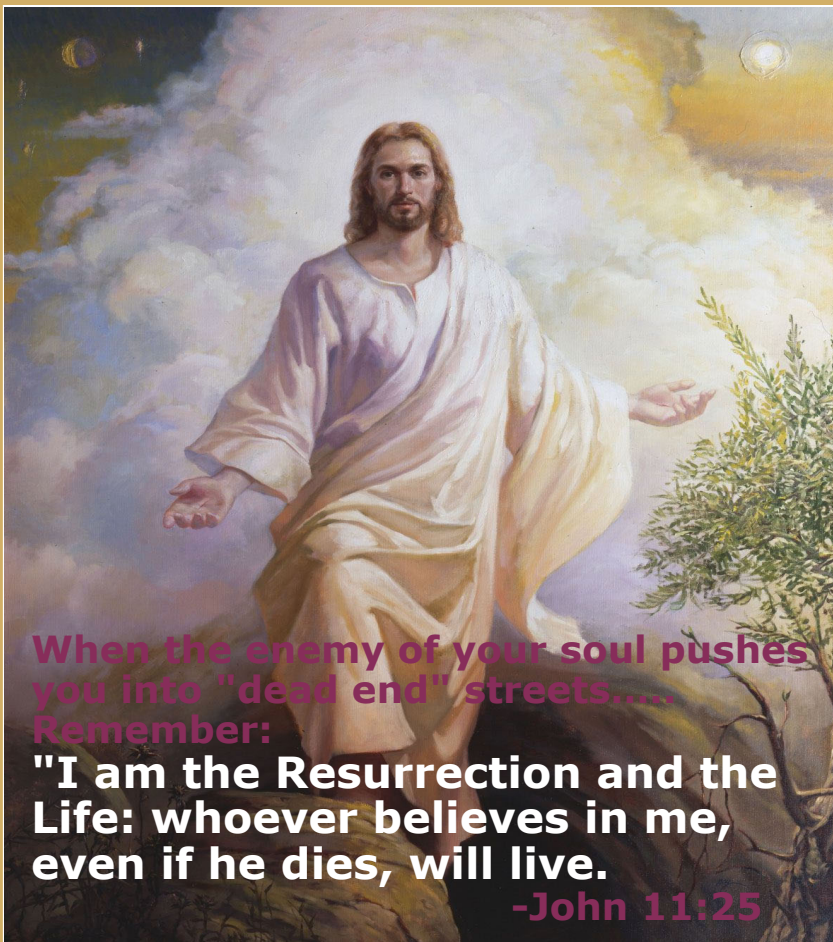

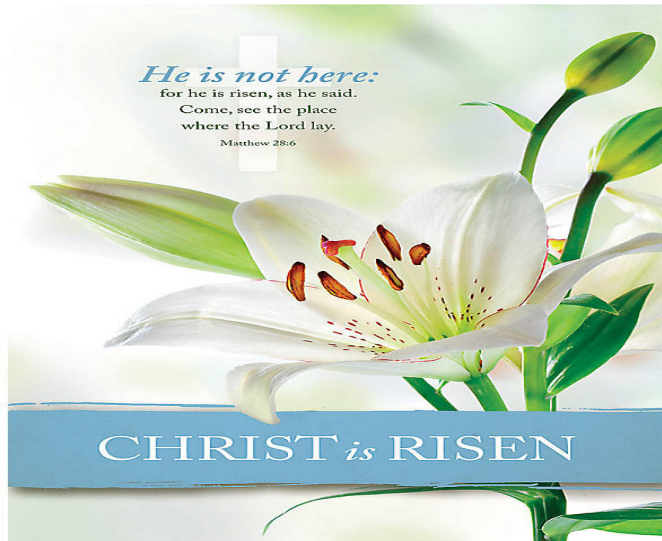

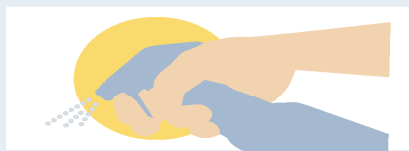

SUNDAY REFLECTION FROM FR AMAR

Someone thought up of a conversation between Pontius Pilate and Joseph of Arimathea.

Pilate: Joseph, I don't understand. You're one of the richest men in the region. You have made this brand-new tomb for yourself, and now you are going to let Jesus be buried in it. I don't understand.

Joseph of Arimathea: Oh, come on, Pilate. He is just going to be in there for the weekend.

So, the word "weekend" now has another shade of meaning. And more than that, the word "tomb" now also has another shade of meaning.

As we look at the gospel accounts over this weekend, we heard of women going to the tomb where Jesus was buried, and then there was an earthquake and an angel came and rolled away the stone and sat on it.

The impression that the women had was that someone had taken the body of Jesus out of the tomb. And just when the women were wondering what had happened, Jesus appeared to them. Yes, Jesus is alive! Or to be more exact, Jesus rose from the dead.

The tomb was just His weekend resting place, and it is now an empty tomb with the stone rolled away. Yes, Jesus had died but now He is risen! And it is for us to believe in it.

This weekend is not an ordinary weekend. This is more stressful and sadder weekend than ever for we are not able to celebrate the biggest reason of our faith; the Resurrection of our Lord. The day when we together renew our Baptismal promises, and when we sprinkle the newly blessed holy water, and wish each other Happy Easter.

We are still going to profess our faith in God and are going to do it in our own homes with our families as we watch the Mass live stream. It's already a month, we have taken the journey of faith in this way and we have "seen" Jesus in our homes.

We don't have the feet of Jesus to clasp but we will have to offer our hearts to each other to help them continue their journey by a phone call or text message or an email, so that together we will experience the Risen Christ and grow in faith.

That is our commitment to each other as we ourselves renew our baptismal promises. And that is also our commitment to Jesus as we renew our baptismal promises.

The stone covering the tomb of sin and death is once again removed so that the Risen Christ can bring us forgiveness and healing.

The Risen Christ wants to empower us to go forth and remove the stones covering the tomb of sin and death so that the light of the Risen Christ can shine in and bring about new life for those who are searching for the truth and the real meaning of life.

This weekend is certainly not an ordinary weekend. It is a weekend of faith, hope and love. That the stone of COVID 19 that lock us down in our homes, that restrict all our activities needs to be removed.

It is with faith, hope and love that the stones of sin and evil, the stones of selfishness and greed, the stones of doubt and pessimism and stones of fear and uncertainty will be removed.

Yes, there are stones to be removed. And the Risen Christ is sending us out to do that.

That is what the profession of faith and the renewal of baptismal promises are about.

And it is not just for this weekend. It will be for every day.

From our Pastor's Desk

My Dearest Parishioners,

It is not a secret that our Churches have been closed in an attempt to protect us from the pandemic affecting our world. It is also not a secret that our lives have changed drastically within days and we no longer enjoy the things we used to do. It almost seems as if time has stopped.



While we are not yet able to fully understand why this is happening, something we may be able to recognize is that this change of pace has allowed us to reevaluate our everyday lives. Perhaps this “standstill” has allowed us to notice that we were going too fast, trying to get ahead of everything, desiring God’s love, but never fully pondering on this love. This change has reminded us of the importance of stopping to recognize God’s presence. He is with us and wants to be with us in our homes, right now, every day.

Perhaps we are finding it hard to trust in God right now, or perhaps even finding it difficult to pray. We are longing to receive the sacraments, and as much as it can be frustrating not to be able to, let us not forget that we have been indelibly marked with the sacrament of baptism, by which we come to be part of the Church. We are a living piece of this Church and although we may not be able to visit a physical church, it can transcend into our homes through each one of us. Pope John Paul II referred to it as the domestic church, the place where we first encounter love “in such a way that in its own way is a living image and historical representation of the mystery of the Church” (Familiaris Consortio, #49).

Rest assured that God is working within our family right now, whether we recognize it or not. God is present during our daily activities such as morning breakfast, while home-schooling or even video-conferencing with a friend or co-worker. He is especially present when we open ourselves to His grace, through participating in the Mass from home or praying the rosary for all those affected by COVID-19. Despite the tragedy that we are living, if we open our hearts to Him during this time, He will enter. As we read in Matthew's Gospel ***"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you"*** (Matthew 7:7).

Even though we cannot attend Mass as a parish family during this most holy season, we can celebrate it spiritually. I have attached the schedule of Masses, Holy Hour of Adoration, the Rosary, and Chaplet of Divine Mercy that are available to you via live streaming. I want to assure you that you are in my prayers and all your intentions are included at the Masses which I celebrate daily.

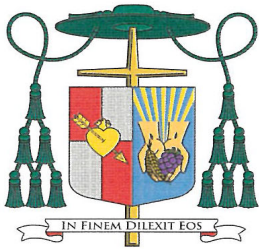

LETTER FROM BISHOP ESTEVEZ - PT1

Dear Faithful in the Diocese of St. Augustine,

The last few weeks have caused many difficulties as daily life has been disrupted so dramatically. Moreover, the circumstances we have experienced and will experience during the coming days may well prevent us from gathering for the Liturgies of Holy Week which lead to our celebration of Easter.

I am also aware that during the Lenten season, many seek the Sacrament of Reconciliation by attending parish penance services and partaking in regularly scheduled confessions. Regrettably, the access to the Sacrament of Penance has been considerably restricted during this Lenten season, as we continue to adhere to the national and local governments' procedures to protect the common good.

Mindful of this difficulty, as your Bishop, I wish to propose to you the other means of reconciliation, forgiveness and mercy that our Church provides for these extraordinary circumstances. Since an individual confession has become almost physically impossible, please be attentive to the following other means of reconciliation (*CIC* 960):

1. The Church envisions a pastoral situation when the faithful are unable to partake in the sacrament and yet receive God's mercy. The gift of mercy is offered when, motivated out of love for God, the faithful express sorrow for their sins through a **Perfect Act of Contrition**. This act of perfect contrition provides forgiveness for mortal and venial sins until the faithful again have the opportunity to participate in the Sacrament of Penance (*CCC* 1452)
2. Pope Francis as the Roman Pontiff has granted the plenary indulgences to the faithful in the current COVID-19 pandemic. A plenary indulgence is a remission before God of the total temporal punishment due to sin (*CIC* 992 and 993). The Holy Father granting the indulgences to those who are subject to quarantine by order of the health authority in hospitals or in their own homes; health care workers, family members and all those who, following the example of the Good Samaritan, exposing themselves to the risk of contagion, care for the sick of Coronavirus; all faithful who pray for end of the epidemic as well as for those who are sick and have died as a result of the virus. In addition, Pope Francis extended plenary indulgences to Those who are unable to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and of the *Viaticum*. Also, in the context of this letter, it is important to understand that the current situation lends itself for a pastoral provision of receiving the Holy Communion without prior sacramental confession (CIC 916): “Anyone who is conscious of grave sin should not celebrate or receive the Body of the Lord without prior sacramental confession, except for grave reason when the possibility of confession is lacking; in this case he will remember that he is bound by the obligation of making an act of perfect contrition, which includes the intention to confess as soon as possible” (*Redemptionis Sacramentum*, 81).

May I ask that all who wish to make “a perfect act of contrition” please do so. On this occasion make that contrition concrete by prayer for those who currently need it most or some special act of charity towards the needs of others. Then when we are able to gather for the Eucharist again, discern appropriately as to receive the Holy Communion, and as soon as possible, avail yourself to the individual celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

It is my sincere hope that this letter brings great spiritual consolation to many. While the doors of our churches for the communal celebration of sacraments seem to be closed, no one should feel that the doors to the loving mercy and forgiveness of Christ will ever be closed.

Along with all of you, I long for the day when all our parishes can return to our usual celebrations of the sacraments. Our missing having Mass and other sacraments tells us all more about the mystery of our faith and what it means to us as the Body of Christ, the Church.

SCAMS RELATED TO THE CARES ACT



Dear Parishioners,

An important reminder to be particularly vigilant and protective with your personal information and financial resources during this difficult time.

Nothing brings out the scammers like “free money,” and the recent decision on Economic Impact Payments (or “Stimulus Checks”) being sent out by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) as tax credit under The "*Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act*" or the "CARES Act" has scammers already coming up with schemes to defraud taxpayers and small businesses of their money and important personal identification data. Specifically, identity thieves are using confusion over the stimulus checks and associated bank loans. You should know that scammers are using every communication source in the book including emails, telephones and text messages, as well as all types of social media to gain your confidence. They are also appealing to faith groups and individuals offering special aid for churches that are scams and Catholics are prime targets.

When it comes to the IRS and taxes, remember that **the IRS WILL NEVER:**

- Call to demand immediate payment over the phone, nor will the agency call about taxes owed without first having mailed you a bill.
- Threaten to immediately bring in local police or other law-enforcement groups to have you arrested.
- Demand that you pay taxes without allowing you to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.
- Require you to use a specific payment method for your taxes, such as a prepaid debit card, gift card, or wire transfer.
- Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.

If you should be contacted by anyone representing the IRS (or anyone representing a government agency) and looking for your personal information, suspicion is warranted. When in doubt, assume it's a scam.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Notice

For the awareness of the faithful, please be aware that there are churches that call themselves “Catholic” but are not in full-communication with the Holy Father Pope Francis nor do they recognize his authority.

St. Michael the Archangel Catholic Church, located at 1950 Bartram Rd in Jacksonville is one such church.

St. Michael the Archangel is a church of the Society of St. Pius X, often referred to as “SSPX.” SSPX churches and priests are considered *schismatic* because they refuse submission to the Supreme Pontiff in Rome and the diocesan bishops who are in full-communication with him. Masses offered by SSPX priests, though valid, are not legal (i.e., *illicit*). As such,

- Attending an SSPX Mass does not satisfy the requirement of a Catholic to attend Mass Sundays or other holy days of obligation.
- Though not a sin to merely attend these Masses as an occasional visitor; taking part in Holy Communion and embracing other schismatic acts reasonably draws into question one’s own communion with the Church.
- If it is the *extraordinary form* of the Mass one seeks, one does well to attend Masses offered by parishes of the diocese and celebrated by a priest who is in good standing with the Roman Catholic Church.

Although Pope Francis continues initiatives in order to bring the SSPX into full-communication, we are not there yet. In the meantime, we hope and pray for that day when we all shall be one.

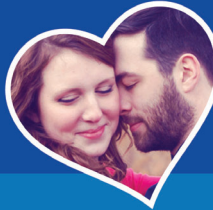
