While this is a blessing for all in our Parish, we must remain conscious that the dangers from the Coronavirus are still with us. So, it will come as no surprise that things are going to look a little different for the foreseeable future.

There is NO OBLIGATION to attend Mass in the Diocese of Saint Augustine until further notice.

Our Live Stream Masses will remain available.

The church will remain open daily for private prayer until 4:00pm



Even though Mass will be celebrated in our Church, the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues.

- Please **DO NOT** come to Mass if you are sick or not feeling well.
- Anyone over 65 and/or those with pre-existing medical conditions are advised to remain at home.
- All Masses will continue to be live streamed.
- For those who participate in Mass via live stream, Holy Communion will be distributed by the Ten Commandments in the Portico for 30 minutes following each weekend Mass. The mask requirement, explained below, will also apply to those coming for Communion.
- The capacity of our Church will be significantly reduced, so parishioners should not expect to attend Mass every weekend.

Dear Holy Spirit Family,

We are very glad that Bishop Felipe Estevez, Bishop of St. Augustine, has granted us permission to reopen public Masses! **However, the dispensation from the obligation to attend is still in effect.** There is no obligation to attend Mass in the Diocese of St. Augustine until further notice. Our Live Stream will remain available for the 11am Sunday Mass and the weekday Masses.

As we are able to come together again, under modified guidelines, you know it's very different and lots of inconveniences. But I am still glad to be able to celebrate the Holy Mass with you again physically present. Thank you to all that could join us for Mass today. Thanks everyone who made this possible. Everyone did an amazing job staying spiritually close but socially distant. This has been very hard journey, still a long way to go. And we can make it together.

In today's Gospel Jesus makes the firm promise that after his departure we will not be left alone. "The Father will give you another Advocate to be with you forever, the Spirit of Truth". Jesus says I will not leave you orphans, but I will come back to you", "You will see me".

This return of Jesus is not just being with us but "you in me and I in you". Then he makes the supreme promise that if we love him and keep his commandments then both he and the Father will love us and that he, Jesus, will show himself to us.

We will have another Advocate, Jesus will come back to us, he in us and we in him, we will see him and he will reveal himself to us. Is it true?

Our faith and our religion are not just words, not just some kind of imagination, a hope based on make-believe. These promises are to become real in our life. They are to be an experience.

The question is: have I experienced the presence of Jesus? Have I seen Jesus? Do I feel the strength of the Holy Spirit?

MASS RESUMPTION GUIDELINES - 1

As of this week Bishop Felipe Estevez, Bishop of St. Augustine, has granted us permission to begin the re-opening of public Masses! However, the dispensation from the obligation to attend is still in effect. There is no obligation to attend Mass in the Diocese of St. Augustine. Our Live Stream will remain available for the 11am Sunday Mass and the weekday Masses.

Our first public Masses at Holy Spirit will begin on Saturday, May 16th at 5:00pm and Sunday 8:15am and 11am.

Daily Masses will resume the regular schedule i.e. at 8:30am on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and at 7pm on Wednesday.

These procedures will be re-evaluated weekly depending on the COVID19 situation in the state of Florida and country. If you would like to attend Mass, please read through this message. Thank you for your patience and compliance.

CAPACITY & SEAT RESERVATION

- ◆ For now, Masses will be limited to 25% capacity.
- ◆ In order to accommodate this limited seating, parishioners must reserve their seats **ONLINE ONLY** before each weekend.
- ◆ Registrations for each weekend will open the prior Monday at 10am, and ends on Thursday 4pm or when we meet our maximum capacity.
- ◆ Seat reservations for May 16/17 Masses are now open at the bottom of this post.

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE

- ◆ Wash your hands.
- ◆ For ages 2 and up, face coverings are required on our campus and for the duration of Mass.
- ◆ Bring your own hand sanitizer or wipes that can be used before receiving Holy Communion.
- ◆ Please **DO NOT** bring items that contain bleach into the church as this will damage the pews.

ARRIVAL PROCEDURES

- ◆ Masks (for ages 2+) should be worn as soon as you exit your vehicle. In case that you will not have a mask, the parish will provide you what you need by donation.
- ◆ Arrive at least 15 minutes before Mass begins to stand in line 6 ft. from each other.
- ◆ The main doors of the church will open 15 minutes prior to the start of Mass.
- ◆ The church will be seated to fill the open pews from front to back. An usher will direct you to your seat.
- ◆ You may be sharing a pew with another household, but social distance is required between the households (6 ft).
- ◆ The holy water fonts remain empty.

MASS RESUMPTION GUIDELINES - 2

MASS PROCEDURES

- ◆ Masses will be celebrated as you have seen on the Live Stream with reduced volunteer lay ministers. There will be no altar servers.
- ◆ Communion will be distributed by clergy and assigned Eucharistic Ministers of Holy Communion.
- ◆ Please wear your face mask on for the entire duration of Mass.
- ◆ There is to be no physical contact between different households at the Sign of Peace or hand-holding during the Lord's Prayer.
- ◆ Baskets will not be passed during the offertory. You will be able to place your weekly gift in a basket at the exit doors of the Church but we strongly encourage online giving through our website link

COMMUNION PROCEDURES

- ◆ Bishop Estevez has asked that communion be received in the hand only for the time being.
- ◆ The precious blood will not be offered to the congregation.
- ◆ Use of personal hand sanitizer before communion is strongly encouraged.
- ◆ There will only be two communion lines in the church maintaining a 6ft. distance between households.
- ◆ Ushers will guide the communion line.
- ◆ Masks should be worn in the communion line. After the priest offers you communion, please step to the side, remove your mask, consume the Eucharist, and then re-mask your face as you return to your pew.
- ◆ For those who participate in Mass via live stream, Holy Communion will be distributed by the Ten Commandments in the Portico for 30 minutes following each weekend Mass. The mask requirement, explained above, will also apply to those coming for Communion.

DEPARTURE PROCEDURES

- ◆ After the final blessing, parishioners must remain in their pew. Each person will depart the church after Mass in an orderly manner, from the back to the front. And the Ushers will guide your way out.
- ◆ You can drop your weekly offertory in the special baskets when you come in for Mass or when you depart.
- ◆ Clergy will not shake hands; they will wave as you exit.
- ◆ Please do not congregate outside after Mass.

CHURCH CLEANING PROCEDURES

- ◆ Our church will be completely sanitized with a viral disinfectant on Friday May 15 prior to re-opening. Thanks to our parishioner, Mark Tolleson, owner of Process Master.
- ◆ We will continue to implement cleanliness and sanitation practices, including disinfecting pews between every Mass.
- ◆ Disinfecting will be done for bathrooms, door handles, and other frequently touched surfaces that occur throughout the day.
- ◆ Please follow the CDC recommendations regarding your own health. If you fall into an "at-risk" category, please stay home and join us by Live Stream.
- ◆ Any weddings, funerals, and baptisms that are scheduled will all be in accordance with the Diocese of St. Augustine and the protocol.

STATEMENT FOR THE RESTORATION OF PUBLIC MASSES

Statement for the Restoration of Public Masses within the Diocese of St. Augustine

The Catholic community of the Diocese of St. Augustine has made some big and, yes, painful sacrifices over the past several weeks in order to live out Christ's call to love our neighbor as we have attempted to combat the COVID-19 pandemic, prevent our health care workers from being overwhelmed, and uphold all elements of the common good.

As health restrictions begin to ease in Florida, Bishop Felipe Estévez has approved safety guidelines to provide direction and recommendations for clergy as we progress toward resuming public Mass and the sacraments in our parishes the weekend of May 16-17, and May 18 for weekday Masses. Keep in mind that some parishes in our diocese might not be ready to resume public Masses this weekend because of their unique circumstances.

The safety guidelines and recommendations reflect the most current guidance from civil and public health authorities and are aligned with the bishops of Florida. They will be updated as needed to reflect the guidance from our governmental leaders as we pass through different phases of recovery from the pandemic.

As we resume the celebration of public Mass soon, it is crucial that we approach this next phase with a patient, loving and charitable hearts.

Here are some things you will want to know and can expect:

A general dispensation from Sunday Mass will remain. Bishop Estévez has indefinitely dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice. Those who are most at risk of serious infection or illness, as well as their caregivers, are strongly encouraged to stay home and participate in live-streamed or televised Masses. The risk of the coronavirus is still very real, and even with the best health practices and strict physical distancing in place, anyone attending public events, such as the Mass, is increasing their risk of exposure to COVID-19.

Physical distancing will limit seating availability for Mass. Pastors must abide by state and local laws and restrictions that pertain to physical distancing. This physical distancing will determine how many seats can be made available for Mass in the church or other parish buildings, so pastors will define a fair method for determining how many can attend any one Mass and ensuring the greatest potential for participation. Unfortunately, this may mean that by ensuring everyone has at least some opportunity for attending Mass, no one should expect to be able to attend Mass every Sunday or with guaranteed regularity. It is very important that you are registered with your parish to receive updated information regarding Mass times and who can attend. Please make sure your contact information is current so that you can receive updates through sign-up systems or via the myParish App.

STATEMENT FOR THE RESTORATION OF PUBLIC MASSES

There will be changes from what you are used to at Mass:

- *Masks or suitable face coverings will be required to attend Mass.* To ensure the protection of those around us, the faithful are required to bring with them a mask or suitable face covering in order to attend Mass – parishes will not provide these. The mask or face covering must be worn at all times except at the moment of consuming holy Communion. Due to the cost and availability of hand sanitizers, those attending Mass will be expected to bring their own.
- *Holy Water* stoups will be empty, but you can still make the sign of the cross when entering and exiting the church to remind yourself of your baptismal vows.
- *Seating* will ensure physical distancing. Although families can sit together, separate families and individuals must sit at least 6-feet apart. Your parish will guide you in where to sit.
- *Worship aids and hymnals will be removed and not be available.* Those attending Mass may bring their own missals/missalettes to follow along or devices to access one of the many worship aids available from online sources.
- At the *Offertory*, collection baskets will not be passed. Instead, there will be baskets available in the church where you can place your gift.
- During the *Lord's Prayer*, handholding will not be permitted.
- The *Sign of Peace* will also be different. The presider might omit this altogether. But if the deacon or priest invites you to exchange a sign of peace, a simple bow or nod to those around you will suffice.
- The *Distribution of Communion* will be different too. Holy Communion will only be distributed in the form of the host and will be received in the hand only. Out of care and concern for ministers and communicants, the reception of holy Communion on the tongue is temporarily suspended during this difficult time. The common communion cup of the precious blood will not be shared. Masks or suitable face coverings must be worn while moving to and from Communion; however, they are removed to consume the host. Gloves are not required to attend Mass but, if they are worn, they must be removed to receive Communion in the hand.

Your pastor has been provided substantial *guidelines* to inform his decision making with regard to the Mass and the sacraments. Each pastor must determine for his parish the schedules, policies and protocols that will work best. For more information on how this will work at your parish, please contact your pastor or parish office.

Thank you for your patience through all of this. Please continue to pray for our diocese, our parishes and schools and our local communities as we navigate this next phase of recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic.

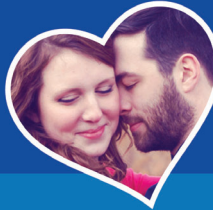
