From our Pastor's Desk

Happy Father's Day to all fathers, grandfathers, and stepfathers. Five weeks ago, we observed Mother's Day and offered Mass for our mothers. Today, on this Father's Day, we are doing the same – offering our dads, living or dead, on the altar of God during the Holy Mass and invoking our Heavenly Father's blessings on them.



In our efforts to honor, offer thanksgiving, and pray for fathers, it is also important to remember that Father's Day can be a difficult holiday for some, such as those who have lost or are estranged from their fathers, couples who are struggling with infertility, and fathers who have lost one or more children through miscarriage, abortion, or in some other way. I invite you to pray for them.

In our Gospel reading for this Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Jesus told his disciples not to be afraid.

What is there to be afraid of? Plenty! There is the fear of going to the dentist, fear of losing the job, fear of failure, fear of COVID-19, etc. Every fear we have is grounded in the knowledge that we have something or someone to lose. I can lose my job, family, house, money, health and even life itself. Fear comes from the fact that we feel insecure. We feel insecure because we think that God does not care about us and that He does not come to protect us in times of trouble and danger. And that is because there are times when we think that our prayers are not answered.

So how do we pray when we come face to face with troubles and difficulties? We need to look at how Jesus prayed. Let us see how He prayed when He was in the Garden of Gethsemane.

At first, He asked His heavenly Father to take that cup away, meaning to save him from suffering, pain and the cross. After that, He prayed that God's will be done and not His will. Jesus trusted that when He does God's will, then God will protect and save Him. Jesus went on to face the Cross with courage.

So, when we pray, let us reflect on what we are praying. If we are telling God what He should be doing for us, then it seems that we do not trust God to know what we need. Hence our prayer already shows our distrust and insecurity. So even when we pray, we are having fears.

But when we pray that God's will be done, we surrender ourselves courageously into God's hands. Because courage is fear that has said its prayers and surrendered to God's will. And no matter what happens, even if the worst should happen, we know that God is watching over us and protecting us.

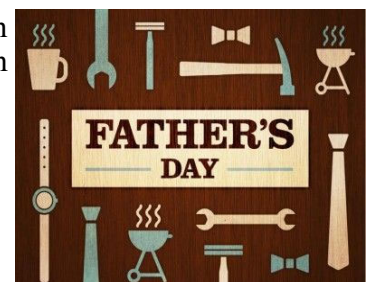
When we put God's will first, then God assures us that everything will turn out for the good of those who trust God.

To trust God means to love Him. But more importantly we must believe and trust that God loves us more than we can ever love him. And we can discover what our enemy fears most by observing the means he uses to frighten us. The devil will deceive us by saying: You can't withstand the storm. But Jesus will declare: Do not be afraid. I will silence the storm.

In life there are many dangerous storms. We can react with fear, or we can decide to have courage. Because it takes courage to believe and trust in Jesus who declares to us: Do not be afraid. I have conquered the world.

Let us decide to listen to Jesus, and we will have the courage.

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE SACRED HEART

THE MONTH OF JUNE IS DEDICATED TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS By Holy Mother Church

Jesus exhibits to the world His Sacred Heart as the symbol of God's infinite love - the symbol of His own generous self-sacrificing love for men. Jesus, shows His Divine Heart as a furnace whose burning rays of love are able to reanimate faith and rekindle love in hearts grown cold and ungrateful. But why His Heart? Because in every language, in every age, the heart is regarded as the natural symbol of love and affection. What more natural and expressive symbol is there, then, of the excessive love of Jesus than His Sacred Heart?

Devotion to the Sacred Heart is the real, physical Heart of Jesus - the Heart of flesh. The living and loving Heart of our Blessed Lord. The Heart that beats in His Divine breast at the moment of the Incarnation. The Heart that loved us during the life of Jesus on earth, that poured forth its blood to the last drop on Mount Calvary. The Beatified Heart now glorious in Heaven and still dwelling among us in the Blessed Sacrament.

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque was a French Visitation nun and a mystic. She received several private revelations involving a series of visions of Christ [1673-1675] as she prayed before the Blessed Sacrament. Jesus, informed her that she was His chosen instrument to spread devotion to His Sacred Heart. He instructed her in a devotion that was to become known as the First Nine Fridays and Holy Hour and asked that the Feast of the Sacred Heart be established. The Feast of the Sacred Heart occurs on the Friday that follows the Second Sunday after Pentecost.

The Two Elements of Devotion to the Sacred Heart: Consecration & Reparation

We consecrate ourselves to the Sacred Heart by acknowledging Him as Creator and Redeemer and as having full rights over us as King of Kings, by repenting, and by resolving to serve Him. We make reparation for the indifference and ingratitude with which He is treated and for leaving Him abandoned by humanity. To carry out these general goals of consecration and reparation, there are quite specific devotions authorized by the Church.

The Devotion To These Promises Are:

- **Receiving Communion frequently:** attend Mass and receive Holy Communion often.
- **First Fridays:** going to Confession and receiving the Eucharist on the first Friday of each month for nine consecutive months. Many parishes will offer public First Friday devotions; if they do, you must perform First Fridays publicly. If it isn't so offered in your parish, you can do this privately, going to Confession, receiving the Eucharist, and offering your prayers for the intention of the Holy Father.
- **Holy Hour:** Eucharistic Adoration for one hour on Thursdays. ("Could you not watch one hour with me?") Holy Hour can be made alone or as part of a group with formal prayers.
- **Celebration of the Feast of the Sacred Heart:** the Friday that follows the Second Sunday after Pentecost is the Feast of the Sacred Heart which brings to mind all the attributes of His Divine Heart mentioned above. Many Catholics prepare for this Feast by beginning a Novena to the Sacred Heart on the Feast of Corpus Christi, which is the Thursday of the week before. On the Feast of the Sacred Heart itself, we can gain a plenary indulgence by making an Act of Reparation to the Sacred Heart.



Act of Reparation to the Sacred Heart

Most sweet Jesus, whose overflowing charity for men is requited by so much forgetfulness, negligence and contempt, behold us prostrate before Thee, eager to repair by a special act of homage the cruel indifference and injuries to which Thy loving Heart is everywhere subject.

St. Margaret Mary wrote; ***“He promised that, in response to those who consecrate themselves and make reparations to His Sacred Heart:***

- ◆ He will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- ◆ He will establish peace in their homes.
- ◆ He will comfort them in all their afflictions.
- ◆ He will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
- ◆ He will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- ◆ Sinners will find in His Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- ◆ Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
- ◆ Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- ◆ He will bless every place in which an image of His Heart is exposed and honored.
- ◆ He will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- ◆ Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in His Heart.
- ◆ In the excessive mercy of His Heart, His all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy
- ◆ Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in His disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. His divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

To all dads, step-dads, grand-dads, soon to be dads, acting dads, father figures, pet dads - Thank you all for your love, care, leadership and support. Hope you know how much you are loved, respected and appreciated, that's why we are celebrating you today.

Happy Father's Day with God's Love and Blessings!

Fatherhood has its origins in God, who chose to reveal Himself to us as Our Father, sending his only Son for the sake of our salvation. Fathers therefore have a special role “in revealing and in reliving on earth the very fatherhood of God” (*Familiaris consortio* 25). Indeed, the role of the father “is of unique and irreplaceable importance” (FC 25).

Although society increasingly tells fathers that they have no say in the lives of their children before birth and fails to recognize the dynamic and critically important role of fatherhood, it is both a biological and spiritual reality. Pope Saint John Paul II said fathers are called to exhibit “generous responsibility for the life conceived under the heart of the mother” (FC 25). They are uniquely entrusted with the protection and defense of both mother and child and, in this way, in safeguarding the sanctity of human life. Yet research continues to show that the top reasons women seek abortions include lacking support from the child's father and financial challenges, which are only exacerbated by a father's absence.

As a Church community, we need to encourage and support men to follow the example of St. Joseph and embrace their various roles as father. Even if a man is not a parent, he is still called to spiritual fatherhood—a fatherhood that fosters others' relationship with God, protecting them from evil and providing an example of Christ's love.

St. Joseph, himself, was unexpectedly called to both practical and spiritual fatherhood, and amid very difficult circumstances. But despite all obstacles, Joseph was faithful. He welcomed life, offering care and protection to Mary and Jesus. We pray that each expectant father will find courage in the example of St. Joseph and offer loving, life-affirming support to the mother of his child.

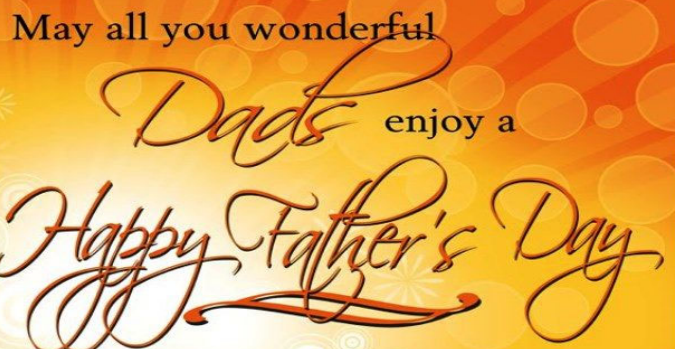

We are glad to let you know that we have resumed our traditional schedule for the public celebration of Mass.

**Week day Mass Schedule:** Mon - 8:30am, Tue - 8:30am, Wed 7:00pm w/Miraculous Medal Novena, Thu - 8:30am, Fri - 8:30am

**Weekend Mass Schedule:** Sat - 5:00pm, Sun - 8:15am & 11:00am

Although we are very appreciative of the opportunity to celebrate the Eucharist and other sacraments together, our priority remains to be the safety and wellbeing of all of us.

### Important to know:

- The Bishop's dispensation of the Sunday obligation will continue until further notice.
- Those with health risks and concerns should remain home as well as anyone who is ill.
- Holy Spirit parish will continue to provide livestream Mass for those unable to attend in person.

### Proper Social Distancing:

- ❖ Those who wish to participate in public Mass at Holy Spirit must wear a face mask or suitable face coverings.
- ❖ The church has been prepared to accommodate the faithful with proper social distancing of 6ft. between individuals. Please be mindful that families can sit together in a pew.
- ❖ Bring your own hand sanitizer or wipes that can be used before receiving Holy Communion.
- ❖ Please **DO NOT** bring items that contain bleach into the church as this will damage the pews.
- ❖ The main doors of the church will open 15 minutes prior to the start of Mass.
- ❖ An usher will direct you to your seat.

### Mass Procedures:

- ❖ The holy water fonts remain empty.

- ❖ After the final blessing, parishioners must remain in their pew. Ushers will guide your way out.
- ❖ **Please do not congregate outside after Mass.**
- ❖ We will continue to implement cleanliness and sanitation practices, including disinfecting pews between every Mass.
- ❖ Please follow the CDC recommendations regarding your own health. If you fall into an "at-risk" category, please stay home and join us by Live Stream.
- ❖ For those who participate in livestream Mass, Holy Communion will be distributed by the Ten Commandments in the Portico for 30 minutes after the Mass.

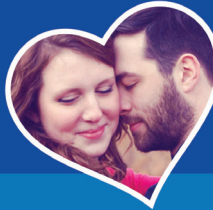
