From our Pastor's Desk

Happy Fourth of July. Soon we will celebrate the most important day in American history. July 4th, Independence Day, is an American national holiday. This great national holiday is not connected with the feast of a saint, or with a festival of the Church. And yet can it be said that the anniversary of the birth of a nation is ever an entirely secular affair? In this case we do not believe it is so. Because in man's aspirations for freedom, there is always a spiritual element...



This holiday gives us time to thank God for the birth of our nation, and give thanks for gift of life and petition God to preserve our country and rid it of its evils. This is a great day for spending time with family and friends.

On Monday, June 29, Church celebrates the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. Saints Peter and Paul are probably the most known of all the saints in the Catholic Church. It is a feast commemorating their martyrdom. To seek Jesus like Saints Paul and Peter is our greatest task and to find him in the same manner is our greatest human achievement. Come let us pray through their intercession at **8:30 AM Mass.**

On Friday, July 3, Church celebrates the Feast of Saint Thomas the Apostle. Thomas the Apostle, also called Didymus, was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus according to the New Testament. St. Thomas is famous for having doubted the Resurrection of Jesus and for demanding physical proof of the wounds of Christ's Crucifixion... When Jesus showed him the wounds, St. Thomas became the first person to explicitly acknowledge the divinity of Jesus. We celebrate this feast with Mass at **8:30 AM.**

Scripture readings for this Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, remind us that Our Baptism calls us away from sin to live a new life in Christ.

St. Paul remind us of the wonderful gift we received in Baptism. We joined Jesus in his death to sin once and for all and we were given a share in his risen life, a life for God. Paul tells us that we must continue to think of ourselves in light of what happened to us in our Baptism: in Jesus we are dead to sin; we are living for God.

Our Baptism changed us into new people who share in divine life. The challenge for us is to choose each day to live as a redeemed person.

Today's Gospel is Matthew's conclusion to Jesus' great missionary instruction to his disciples – to you and me. Our Baptism commissioned us to be missionaries – to live our new life in Jesus with enthusiasm and to share with others the good news we are experiencing so that they can experience it too.

Jesus reminds us that much of our missionary efforts will be done in little things: giving a cup of cold water in his name. He tells us that there is a profound implication to even the smallest act of unselfish love. In these little acts of kindness, we can mirror the loving kindness of our God. Our God in return gives us a reward immensely greater than our efforts deserve. That is the nature of God's loving kindness.

Let us resolve once again to live more faithfully the new life we were given in our Baptism. Let us be more conscious of the little opportunities we are given to be God's loving kindness to one another each day.

FRANSALIANS

Holy Spirit parish is served by the Missionaries of Saint Francis de Sales. We had Fr. Ananda Prasad Maddineni MSFS, Fr. Anthony Bonela MSFS and now Fr. Amar Nath Nagothu MSFS. Missionaries of Saint Francis de Sales are also known as Fransalian Missionaries (Fransalians).

Who are the Fransalians? The Congregation of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales (M.S.F.S), known as “Fransalians”, is an international Congregation of Latin Rite, founded on October 24, 1838 in Annecy, France by Servant of God, Peter Marie Mermier. The primary patron of the Congregation is St. Francis de Sales and the secondary patroness is Mother of Compassion (Mother of Sorrows). The spirituality of our Congregation is “Salesian” and we belong to the Salesian family though our particular identity is as “Fransalians”. The apostolate of our Congregation is parish mission, foreign mission, education, evangelization and innovative ministries. The Congregation is currently involved actively in pastoral ministry in 33 Countries across 7 Continents of the world. The Generalate (headquarters) of our Congregation is in Rome, Italy.

The Fransalians have been serving the Church in the United States since 1969 beginning with the Archdiocese of Atlanta, Georgia. 72 Fransalian priests currently working in the United States in different capacities. Fransalians are currently engaged in pastoral ministry in different areas of apostolate in 23 Arch/Dioceses of 14 states of the US. Our Provincial House is located at 3887 Rosebud Road, Loganville-Atlanta, Georgia 30052-4656.

We have a lay association called “*Fransalian Associates*” who are men and women who wish to formally associate themselves with the mission and ministry of the religious Congregation of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales. Fransalian Associates are lay Catholics in good standing above the age of 18, or any consecrated diocesan or religious clergy who wish to associate with the Fransalians by following the spirit and spirituality of St. Francis de Sales, the Gentleman Saint.

Who is a Fransalian?: A Fransalian is a man called to be a missionary with a vision; an explorer of the unknown; a builder of communities; a sower of God’s words; an enlightened guide to his students; a formator for the unformed; a joyful herald of God’s reign on Earth in the spirit of St. Francis de Sales by following the 7 principal virtues of Salesian spirituality which are simplicity, humility, charity, optimism, gentleness, humanness, and resignation to the will of God in daily life.

Fransalian Mission: To Witness and Proclaim God’s Kingdom in a spirit of Service to Man. To be effective witness, a Fransalian needs to Read the Signs of Times, Equip himself with Ever Growing Knowledge, be Open to Live the Culture of his People, be Courageous to Respond to their Needs with Missionary Zeal in Solidarity with his Fellow Religious.

Fransalian Vision: Fransalian is a Man of Deep Faith which is Sustained by his Daily Experience of Communion with God and through Realization of God’s presence in his Life, in the Community and in the Events of History. He lives the Fransalian Charism of Joyful Holiness, Confident Optimism, Firm Gentleness, Cheerful Availability, Hospitality, Genuine Humanness and Positive Regard for the others.

Fransalian Prayer: Faith enough to seek You; Regard enough to admire you; Awareness enough to love You; Noble enough to share You; Strength enough to look into Oneself; Affection enough to forsake Oneself; Loyal enough to be honest with Oneself; Ideal enough to inspire the World; Able enough to transform the Community; and Nourishing grace enough to be All to All.

SAINTS PETER AND PAUL



On June 29 the Church celebrates the feast day of Sts. Peter & Paul. As early as the year 258, there is evidence of an already lengthy tradition of celebrating the solemnities of both Saint Peter and Saint Paul on the same day. Together, the two saints are the founders of the See of Rome, through their preaching, ministry and martyrdom there.

Peter, who was named Simon, was a fisherman of Galilee and was introduced to the Lord Jesus by his brother Andrew, also a fisherman. Jesus gave him the name Cephas (Petrus in Latin), which means 'Rock,' because he was to become the rock upon which Christ would build His Church.

Peter was a bold follower of the Lord. He was the first to recognize that Jesus was "the Messiah, the Son of the living God," and eagerly pledged his fidelity until death. In his boldness, he also made many mistakes, however, such as losing faith when walking on water with Christ and betraying the Lord on the night of His passion.

Yet despite his human weaknesses, Peter was chosen to shepherd God's flock. The Acts of the Apostles illustrates his role as head of the Church after the Resurrection and Ascension of Christ. Peter led the Apostles as the first Pope and ensured that the disciples kept the true faith.

St. Peter spent his last years in Rome, leading the Church through persecution and eventually being martyred in the year 64. He was crucified upside-down at his own request, because he claimed he was not worthy to die as his Lord.

He was buried on Vatican hill, and St. Peter's Basilica is built over his tomb.

St. Paul was the Apostle of the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church.

Before receiving the name Paul, he was Saul, a Jewish pharisee who zealously persecuted Christians in Jerusalem. Scripture records that Saul was present at the martyrdom of St. Stephen.

Saul's conversion took place as he was on his way to Damascus to persecute the Christian community there. As he was traveling along the road, he was suddenly surrounded by a great light from heaven. He was blinded and fell off his horse. He then heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" He answered: "Who are you, Lord?" Christ said: "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting."

Saul continued to Damascus, where he was baptized and his sight was restored. He took the name Paul and spent the remainder of his life preaching the Gospel tirelessly to the Gentiles of the Mediterranean world.

Paul was imprisoned and taken to Rome, where he was beheaded in the year 67.

He is buried in Rome in the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls.

In a sermon in the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Sts. Peter and Paul: "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labors, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith."

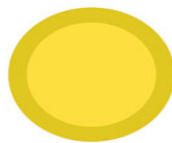

GUIDELINES FOR CELEBRATING PUBLIC MASS

We are glad to let you know that we have resumed our traditional schedule for the public celebration of Mass.

Week day Mass Schedule: Mon - 8:30am, Tue - 8:30am, Wed 7:00pm w/Miraculous Medal Novena, Thu - 8:30am, Fri - 8:30am

Weekend Mass Schedule: Sat - 5:00pm, Sun - 8:15am & 11:00am

Although we are very appreciative of the opportunity to celebrate the Eucharist and other sacraments together, our priority remains to be the safety and wellbeing of all of us.

Important to know:

- The Bishop's dispensation of the Sunday obligation will continue until further notice.
- Those with health risks and concerns should remain home as well as anyone who is ill.
- Holy Spirit parish will continue to provide livestream Mass for those unable to attend in person.

Proper Social Distancing:

- ❖ Those who wish to participate in public Mass at Holy Spirit must wear a face mask or suitable face coverings.
- ❖ The church has been prepared to accommodate the faithful with proper social distancing of 6ft. between individuals. Please be mindful that families can sit together in a pew.
- ❖ Bring your own hand sanitizer or wipes that can be used before receiving Holy Communion.
- ❖ Please **DO NOT** bring items that contain bleach into the church as this will damage the pews.
- ❖ The main doors of the church will open 15 minutes prior to the start of Mass.
- ❖ An usher will direct you to your seat.

Mass Procedures:

- ❖ The holy water fonts remain empty.
 - ❖ Please wear your face mask on for the entire duration of Mass.
 - ❖ There is to be no physical contact between different households at the Sign of Peace or hand-holding during the Lord's Prayer.
 - ❖ Baskets will not be passed during the offertory. You will be able to place your weekly gift in a basket at the exit doors of the Church but we strongly encourage online giving through our website link <https://giving.parishsoft.com/app/giving/holyI166I75>
 - ❖ Holy Communion will only be distributed in the hand for the time being.
 - ❖ Use of personal hand sanitizer before communion is strongly encouraged.
 - ❖ Ushers will guide the communion line.
 - ❖ **Masks should be worn in the communion line. After the minister offers you communion, please step to the side, remove your mask, consume the Eucharist, and then re-mask your face as you return to your pew.**
 - ❖ After the final blessing, parishioners must remain in their pew. Ushers will guide your way out.
 - ❖ **Please do not congregate outside after Mass.**
 - ❖ We will continue to implement cleanliness and sanitation practices, including disinfecting pews between every Mass.
 - ❖ Please follow the CDC recommendations regarding your own health. If you fall into an "at-risk" category, please stay home and join us by Live Stream.
 - ❖ For those who participate in livestream Mass, Holy Communion will be distributed by the Ten Commandments in the Portico for 30 minutes after the Mass.

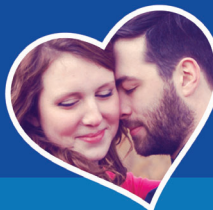
