Gil Hernández Pozo



Father Gil was born on March 31, 1982 in Santa Clara, Cuba. He is the son of Gil Silverio Hernández (Communist Military) and Caridad Pozo (Dentist). He spent his childhood and adolescence with his maternal grandmother, from whom he received

his religious education in a communist, atheist Cuba. Out of curiosity, he entered a Catholic church for the first time at the age of nine. His father chased him and forbid him from attending church. He was able to be baptized at 14 years of age. He completed all his elementary and high school studies in his native city. At the age of 20, he studied philosophy and theology in the Saint Charles and Saint Ambrose seminary in Havana (2002-2007). In 2013, he graduated with a degree in Humanities Education in Cuba and worked as a professor at the University of Cuba. In November, 2013 he immigrated to Miami, Florida where he studied and graduated with a Masters in Sacramental Studies in 2015. In January 2016, he went to Guatemala as a missionary. He was ordained a Deacon on December 16, 2017 and as a priest on May 19, 2018. His parents attended his ordination and his father declared publicly at his first mass: *"Forgive me for not believing in your vocation. I only ask that you are a good priest so that I can be proud of you"*. His priestly motto is ECCE EGO VOCASTI ENIM ME (Latin): "Here I am because you have called me." He was pastor of Tiquisate y Vicario of the Cathedral of Escuintla, Guatemala. Since June 2019, Fr. Gil has served as the resident Priest in Corpus Christi Catholic Church and in Saint Hugh Catholic Church in Miami. He says he has four priorities in his life as a priest: The Holy Mass, Confessions, visiting the sick and to share happiness in the delivery of the vocation given by God.

We are truly blessed and happy to welcome Fr. Gil Hernandez Pozo, who will be working with Father Amar here at Holy Spirit Parish.

From Our Pastor's Desk

THESE ARE THE TRIALS THROUGH WHICH WE TRIUMPH, BY THE POWER OF HIM WHO LOVED US:

In the gospel, we hear about the miraculous multiplication of loaves that fed the crowd of 5000.

But we must not miss the account before that. The gospel passage begins by saying that Jesus received the news of the death of John the Baptist, and He withdrew to a lonely place. The news must have shaken Him and He wanted to be alone. The news of the death of John the Baptist was like telling Him "You're next".

Obviously, the crowds do not know what was happening with Him and the battle He was fighting within. They went after Him on foot, and so as He stepped ashore, He saw a large crowd. But despite His need for solitude and to think about things and to mourn the death of John the Baptist, He took pity on the crowds and healed their sick.

And then when evening came, another situation arose. His disciples asked Him to send the crowds away so that they can get food for themselves. After all, He had already done enough for the crowds and they should leave Him alone.

What else could they expect of Him? His own needs were not met, and He was not obliged to see to their every need. But it was a lonely place, and that crowd of 5000 was getting hungry. And all they had was only 5 loaves and 2 fish.

Obviously, it was not enough and obviously there is nothing that the disciples could do about the hungry situation. And here is where we must believe that when we can't do anything, then God can do something.

As St. Paul in his letter to Romans says: *"Nothing can come between us and the love of Christ, even if we are troubled or worried, or being persecuted, or lacking food or clothes, or being threatened or even attacked. Because these are the trials through which we triumph, by the power of Him who loved us."*

In other words, God will fight our battles for us. And He can only fight our battles for us when we listen to those words of Jesus, those words that He said to His disciples: Bring them here to me. Jesus said that without Him we can do nothing; but it also means that with Him we can do anything.

We remember that when the Israelites came up to the Red Sea, the Egyptians were charging up behind them intending to cut every throat. And the Israelites cried out in fear and distress. And then Moses said: Fear not. These Egyptians that you see today will be no more. Because God will go before you and fight your battles for you. And indeed, God did. And the Red Sea parted and the Israelites crossed into safety and the Egyptians ended up in tragedy.

Yes, God will fight our battles for us. And this is reiterated by the prophet Isaiah when he told king Ahaz as he was surrounded by his enemies: Stand by your God, or you will not stand at all.

All we need to do is to listen to what Jesus said: Bring them here to me. Others may not know the hard battles that we are fighting, but God knows and He will fight our battles for us. In turn, God wants us to help others fight their battles. Because they may not know that God wants to fight their battles for them.

So, like Jesus, we need to be kind and compassionate to others because they have battles to fight every day.

And just like Jesus, even though He had His own needs, He took on the needs of others and helped them fight their battles.

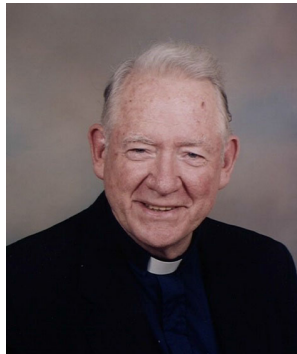
For all we know, when we take on the needs of others and fight their battles, our own needs will be met and God will win our battles for us.

Obituary—Msgr. James Heslin

Well Done Good and Faithful Servant



Msgr. James Joseph Heslin
December 31, 1930 – July 23, 2020

Msgr. James J. Heslin, a retired pastor of Holy Spirit Catholic Church in Jacksonville, and a diocesan leader died Thursday morning, July 23. He was 89.

Like Juan Ponce de Leon and Hernando de Soto, Msgr. James J. Heslin can be considered a Florida pioneer. He retired as pastor of Holy Spirit on June 30, 2006, where he served for more than 20 years. His long and distinguished service began with his ordination at St. Patrick's Seminary, Thurles County, Tipperary, Ireland, in 1954.

He arrived at the Diocese of St. Augustine in Sept. 1954, when the diocese incorporated most of the state of Florida. Except for the Miami area – where he served at Holy Name Parish in West Palm Beach and St. Patrick Parish in Miami Beach – most of Florida back then was mostly rural and unsettled. Msgr. Heslin saw the diocese and parishes in Jacksonville grow from a cluster of small outposts to the sprawling urban landscape it is today. In an interview for his retirement, Msgr. Heslin credited Archbishop Joseph P. Hurley for having the foresight to purchase tracts of land to expand the number of parishes in the diocese.

“He (Archbishop Hurley) saw the growth potential back when there were no people here,” Msgr. Heslin said. “He had the good sense to buy as much land as possible to grow the diocese.”

Msgr. Heslin served during a time of significant growth. He was pastor of St. Paul Parish, Jacksonville Beach from 1958-1969, overseeing

the expansion of the parish school. He was rector of the Cathedral Basilica of St. Augustine for nearly eight years. In 1977, Msgr. Heslin was appointed pastor of Resurrection Parish in Jacksonville, and in 1985, he was appointed pastor of Holy Spirit. He watched that parish grow from a few hundred families to more than 1,000 by 2006.

“There was hardly anything out here when I first arrived at Holy Spirit,” said Msgr. Heslin. “It was literally out in the middle of nowhere. Now there are homes and businesses everywhere.”

In 1988, he opened a pre-school with a class of 12 for four-year-olds. As the area grew, so did the school, and eventually, a new worship space was needed. On Easter Sunday 1992, the first Mass was celebrated in the new church that included an immense stained glass window behind the altar, green marble flooring, and attractive furnishings.

Msgr. Heslin also served as dean of the South Jacksonville Deanery in 1977, a position he held until 1991. And he contributed to the *St. Augustine Catholic* magazine while serving on its editorial board from 1995-2006.

In retirement, Msgr. Heslin volunteered at Arlington Community Services, an interfaith organization. He also continued his steady work protecting the sanctity of life.

In 1989, he was arrested for trespassing as part of an Operation Rescue protest outside a Jacksonville abortion clinic. He blocked the entrance to the clinic, along with other protesters, and refused to leave the property. He pleaded no contest in court and paid a \$100 fine.

“We felt we had a just cause for what we did,” he said. “I’m sure some lives (of unborn babies) were saved that day. Msgr. Heslin said he had no regrets because he was witnessing for the unborn.”

Msgr. Heslin is survived by several nieces and nephews.

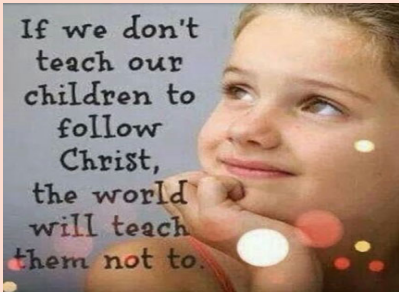

Feast of the Transfiguration of our Lord



FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD

Thursday, August 6, 2020

The feast commemorates the anticipation of the glory of our Lord's Resurrection through His Transfiguration. Christ's face shone like the sun and His clothes became a radiant and gleaming white.

Mass is @ 8:30AM

On August 6, our liturgy invites us to celebrate the feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. Our Gospel for this liturgy in Cycle C is the same as the Gospel proclaimed on the second Sunday of Lent. Recall that on the second Sunday of Lent in each Lectionary cycle the Gospel reading proclaims the story of Jesus' Transfiguration, each time from a different Gospel. This feast calls to our attention the importance of this event in Jesus' life, further affirmed by its report in each of the Synoptic Gospels: Matthew, Mark, and Luke.

The context for Luke's Transfiguration story is similar to that found in both Matthew's and Mark's Gospel. The Transfiguration occurs after Peter's confession that Jesus is the Messiah and Jesus' prediction about his passion. In each of these Gospels, a discussion of the cost of discipleship follows the Transfiguration.

In each Gospel, Jesus takes three of his disciples—Peter, James, and John—to a high mountain. While they are there, Elijah and Moses appear with Jesus. In Matthew's and Mark's Gospel, there is reference to a conversation among Jesus, Elijah, and Moses, but only Luke's Gospel includes the detail that this conversation is about what Jesus will accomplish in Jerusalem.

Elijah and Moses are both significant figures in the history of Israel. Moses led the Israelites from slavery in Egypt and received from Yahweh the Ten Commandments. Appearing with Jesus at his Transfiguration, Moses represents the Law, which guides the lives of the Jewish people. Elijah is remembered as one of the most important prophets of

Israel who helped the Israelites stay faithful to Yahweh. Some believe that Elijah's return would signal the coming of the Messiah for the Jewish people. This belief is evidenced in the question posed by Jesus' disciples after they have witnessed the Transfiguration. The appearance of these two important figures from Israel's history indicates Jesus' continuity with the Law and the prophets. They also reveal that Jesus is the fulfillment of all that was promised to the people of Israel.

Upon seeing Jesus with Elijah and Moses and having witnessed his Transfiguration, Peter offered to construct three tents for them. Luke's Gospel reports that Peter's offer was made in confusion. As if in reply to Peter's confusion, a voice from heaven spoke, affirming Jesus as God's Son and commanding the disciples to obey him. This voice from heaven recalls the voice that was heard at Jesus' baptism.

In his Transfiguration, we see an anticipation of the glory of Jesus' Resurrection. In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, Jesus instructed the disciples to keep secret what they had seen until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. The disciples' confusion continued as they wondered what Jesus meant by "rising from the dead." Until they also witness his passion and death, the disciples cannot possibly understand Jesus' Transfiguration. We, however, have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of it, we see in this event an anticipation of Jesus' Resurrection, a foreshadowing of Christ's glory in heaven, and the promise of our own resurrection. (CNA)

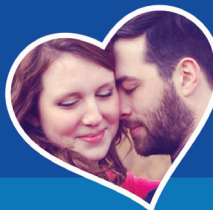
