FOURTH WEEK OF ADVENT

O Lord, stir up Thy power, we pray Thee, and come; and with great might help us, that with the help of Thy Grace, Thy merciful forgiveness may hasten what our sins impede. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.



Fourth Sunday of Advent

The 4th Sunday of Advent symbolizes Peace with the "Angel's Candle" reminding us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."

As we enter into the fourth week of Advent, we are given our Blessed Mother and St. Joseph to reflect upon. Though our Blessed Mother was perfect, and St. Joseph was a deeply virtuous man, they were both still fully human and would have walked through Mary's pregnancy and Jesus' birth with every human emotion and experience.

St. Joseph was faced with an extraordinary mystery as he discovered his wife was pregnant. He knew her to be a woman of exceptional virtue and holiness and had to reconcile that with her surprising pregnancy. Even after the angel appeared to him in a dream he would have had questions arise in his mind as he faced this situation.

Our Blessed Mother was also invited by God to face her pregnancy in faith. Her response was perfect, "Let it be done to me according to your word." She could not explain nor understand what was happening but, nonetheless, she knew deep in her soul that God was in charge leading all to His glory.

Both Mary and Joseph are wonderful models of faith and obedience. They were obedient to the will of God despite the fact that the will of God drew them into an incredible and unfathomable mystery. They were first-hand witnesses to the salvation of the world and to the greatest act ever known. And they both embraced this mystery and accepted it in faith.

Reflect, today, upon your own invitations from God to embrace the mysteries of life. God's ways are often more than we can comprehend and figure out. Mary and Joseph give us the witness of how we are to handle every mystery God invites us to participate in. Say yes to the will of God just as this holy couple did.

As we conclude the Advent season, let us remember that God sent His Only Son on the very First Christmas. Even it's in the long ago past, this gift of salvation is continuously given to us each day by God as we await for the Second Coming of Jesus Christ. We only need to accept this gift. As we wait for Jesus, each of us must strive to be a man and a woman of good will, with the virtues of Hope, Faith, Joy, so that God's favor may rest upon us and we may receive the grace of His Peace. This grace will give us the strength against evil and tribulations, and enable us to be instruments for God to accomplish His holy will for the world.

FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK



Fourth Sunday of Advent

Grace is a gratuitous and unmerited gift of God. We feel God's grace in every moment of our life. We thank him for all his gifts. Thus, the divine grace is both as a gift and as a task for us. We respond to God's grace by accepting ourselves as we are and we cooperate with his plan in all things we do is a task. The God's grace is in abundance. The more we are open, the more we receive.

In today's gospel we hear the angel Gabriel announce God's plan for the salvation of his people. It's a story that is very familiar to all of us. Sometimes that makes it difficult to hear the wonder of it. Through Gabriel, God is asking a young woman to consent to be the mother of the Son of God who wanted to come among us and share our human nature.

The fulfillment of God's plan of salvation hangs on her response. With great humility, Mary says "May it be done to me according to your word." Now the history of God's love for his people can culminate in the Incarnation – Jesus becomes human like us.

The story in today's gospel also offers us an opportunity to reflect on how we choose to respond to the unexpected happenings in our life. Some of us find ourselves carrying a burden of suffering that isn't light, or we must look on helplessly while someone we love suffers, or we have become very dependent on others for things we want to do. Some of us may find ourselves saying: "Lord, why me? What did I do to deserve this?"


Perhaps we can learn something from Mary's response to the angel's unexpected message. She asked a humble and honest question. She asked Gabriel to help her to understand what God was doing. "Lord, help me to understand what you want of me right now."

It's interesting to note that Gabriel's response didn't really give her a clear and detailed answer to her question. Gabriel's response called Mary to have faith in God and trust in God's provident goodness. Because Mary trusted God's love for his people and for her, she was able to trust Gabriel's words to her in humble faith. She offered herself in humble obedience to all that God would choose to do with her: **"May it be done to me according to your word."**

Even if we humbly ask God to help us understand how he is working in us, we may not get a clear and detailed answer to our question. Whatever answer we do get will call us to trust in God's love for us. We will hear God tell us: **"I have loved you with an everlasting love; trust me."**

The reading also makes us realize that the Lord is always with us. He guides us in the right path and protects us from all evils. For God nothing is impossible. He always lives with us. He sends the Holy Spirit to inspire and to empower us. His presence in our life is a wonderful thing. We rely on Him for everything because He reigns over us and works through us.

May each of us have the faith and courage to respond to God as Mary did: **"May it be done to me according to your word."**



As I am concerned with our health, safety and well-being, I have doubled the number of Masses for Christmas. Any over flow will be requested to move to the Family Life Center where they can participate in the live feed of the celebrations and Holy Communion will be brought to them. We will also live stream our Masses. Those who are not feeling well or who are in a high-risk category should remain at home and take advantage of the on-line or televised celebrations of Christmas Mass.

Our staff and ministry leaders are already busy making plans to make the Christmas celebration very meaningful. Above all else, please know that me - your pastor and staff are praying that you and yours remain safe and well. We are working diligently and are ready to serve and care alongside you. Please do not hesitate to call or email us.

“Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God.” (Isaiah 40:1) Much like the people at the time of Isaiah, we too are in a form of exile during the pandemic. We are in the wilderness and we eagerly await a time when comfort will come and when the exile will be over. And so, the promise of Isaiah is good news to us today, because our world is in desperate need of some comfort and in desperate need of some good news. The holiday season is already a challenging time for people who are suffering pain or loss. From the beginning November till the New year, the focus on family leaves those who are grieving the loss of loved ones or broken relationships, struggling to put a smile on their face and attempting to pretend to be in the holiday spirit, all the while they are barely making it one day at a time.

May we be both gentle and honest with one another, striving to provide comfort and peace during this season. It is my prayer that this season in general, will be one of reflection, comfort, and grace as we continue to navigate this pandemic. For the Gospel tells us, “The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light. A light has dawned upon those who lived in the land as dark as death.” The light that has come down from heaven has conquered the darkness caused by the sin. Jesus is born. Word becomes flesh. God gives us His only Son as an ultimate proof of His love for us.

Today more than ever, Jesus needs to be born in our life and in our world. Our world is darkened by human selfishness, pride, and sin. We need Jesus to reconcile us with God and one another. The joy of Christmas is not for a day or a season. It is an eternal joy, a joy that no one can take away from us because it is the joy of Christ himself made present in our hearts through the Holy Spirit who dwells within us. May Jesus be born in our hearts this Christmas.

We pray that the birth of Jesus in our hearts may release us from our pride and selfishness and make us free to live with one another in love.




