

LETTER FROM BISHOP ESTEVEZ

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

First, I want to express my heartfelt appreciation to all the faithful of the diocese for bearing up patiently and prayerfully through a very challenging time in the history of our diocese. All of us have lost friends and loved ones due to COVID-19, and I continue to keep you and your families in my prayers.

Extraordinary times have been met with extraordinary measures, and I am most grateful for the truly creative ways our parishes have stayed connected with parishioners and provided access to the sacraments. With the Lord's help, we have seen our way through the pandemic, calling on the resourcefulness, courage and patience of our clergy, pastoral staff and parishioners, always with the goal in mind that our churches and other public gathering spaces are safe.

As we move forward, I announce that the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation for Catholics in the Diocese of St. Augustine will expire on the Vigil of Pentecost, Saturday, May 22, 2021.

There will remain some dispensations for the faithful who may find themselves in specific circumstances. Details about these particular dispensations are attached and can also be found on the diocesan website (www.dosafl.com/coronavirus) and through diocesan social media channels. By announcing the change in dispensations now, parishes will have time to make the necessary adaptations to welcome more members of the faithful to the Sunday Masses.

One of the success stories of the pandemic has been the large number of people who have already been vaccinated against the disease. We expect many more in the weeks ahead. It is also remarkable that since June 2020, most Floridians have been able to safely go about their business, including dining in restaurants, shopping and connecting with family and friends. It would seem reasonable then to strive for the faithful's full and active participation once again at Mass. Since every parish is unique, pastors will need to make individual decisions about safely accommodating an increased number of attendees at Mass (for example, adding additional Masses or identifying a section of pews for those comfortable with less restrictive distancing between persons).

The use of face coverings shall continue until public health guidance suggests otherwise. With guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and other public health agencies, we have learned much about the disease and how virus spreads. It appears that close contact with infected persons poses the most significant risk. Contagion from other sources has proven negligible and is preventable by good personal hygiene, social distancing, and face coverings.

The pandemic has meant a huge imposition on normal life. It will likely take more time before we return to some semblance of "normal". As we do so, I would ask all the faithful to continue cooperating with our safety guidelines.

May the Lord continue to bless you richly throughout the Easter season and the months ahead.

FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

WHERE HE HAS GONE, HE CALLS YOU TO FOLLOW:

Today is Ascension Sunday. It is the day that we remember that Jesus, forty days after his resurrection, returned to heaven to be with God. The time immediately following Jesus' ascension, was actually the most critical time for Jesus, for his disciples and their mission of preaching the gospel to the whole world. Jesus probably has wondered, '... how exactly will things unfold after I leave.'

The disciples were becoming the preachers, teachers and spreaders of good news now. They had been called, equipped, sent out. But now it was up to them. They could return to their old lives, convinced they couldn't do anything without Jesus physically present. Or they could believe that Jesus had provided the gifts they needed to be Christ's presence in the world. What would they do?

In some ways, we live our whole journey of discipleship in this moment of transition, for I think God is forever asking us the question, watching to see: 'what will we do?'

So, what must we do then? What Jesus said to the Eleven, He also says to us: Go out to the whole world, proclaim the Good News to all creation. Jesus also gave a list of signs that will be associated with believers: they will cast out devils, have the gift of tongues, pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.

All that seems rather lofty and maybe even unbelievable. Can we do all that? Have we done all that?

But before we discourage ourselves with a barrage of "No" to what Jesus said, we need to find out what is the sign that Jesus wants us to be. And this is where we need to go to the 1st reading (Acts 1: 1-11) when Jesus also said that we will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on us, and then we will be witnesses reaching out to the ends of the earth.

So, as Jesus ascends into heaven, He wants us to prepare the descent of the Holy Spirit, who will empower us to be witnesses and to be signs. So as much as we set our hearts to the things of above, may we also be witnesses and signs to the people of the earth. We must be living signs to point them to heaven. Because that's where we are going, and we

want them to go along with us.

Next Sunday is Pentecost Sunday. It also is our parish feast day where we, as a parish, commemorate the establishment of our parish dating back to 1966.

Celebrating our Parish Annual Feast, we are hosting 'International Feast'. And I would like to personally invite you to join us at the soccer field for hamburgers and hotdogs, desserts and beverages on Sunday, May 23 after the 1130am Mass. I assure you of great food, dances, fun outdoor games, arts and crafts, activities for kids, because we have stage performances, food booths and drink stations, arts and crafts, ministry exhibits. Please bring your own lawn chairs, hats and picnic mats.

Additionally, if you were born in a different country other than the United States, and would like to get personally involved in the celebration, you are invited to process into the church at the 11:30am Mass carrying a flag of your country of origin. We also ask that you wear a formal outfit that truly recognizes your cultural attire.

I hope that everyone in the parish will come to this event. And I pray that we all will have a great faith and fun filled day. Let the Spirit of God refresh our hearts!


