Cry Room: Please give priority use to those with small children to sit in and use the cry room.

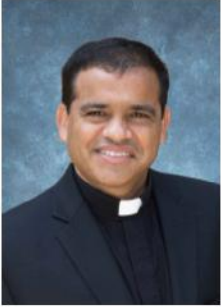

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

"A prophet is not without honor except in his native place".

Every baptized Catholic Christian is conformed to Christ as King, Priest, and Prophet. Thus, speaking the divine truth or the prophecy is not just concern of the bishops and priests only, but all the members of the Church. In speaking the divine truth whether at home or in a foreign land, we all face ridicule, criticism, humiliation, resistance and insults. They are the "icings on our cake."

Yet, we hear every day: "Be ready to accept more discomfort for my sake, for the gospel and, for the good of your generation!"

Like prophet Ezekiel, we all have a prophetic call and mission from God. The question is, where is this mission, and how do we begin it? Quite simple! There is a mission everywhere today. There is a prophetic mission in our rebellious generation, families, communities, and our streets, workplaces, schools, and the world at large.

There is much rebellion in our time against God, against nature, against divine institution (the One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church), and the fabrics of our moral, social and cultural heritage. So, God speaks to us today as he said to prophet Ezekiel in our first reading: "Son of man, I am sending you... to the rebels who have turned against me." So, we must not be afraid to carry out our prophetic ministries despite the odds against us. Instead, we are to bear them patiently so that good might triumph over evil, truth over a lie, light over darkness and peace over war. "Where there is no [prophetic] vision the people perish" (Prov 29:18). We are all called to be that visionary prophet to our ailing generation. Have a great week!

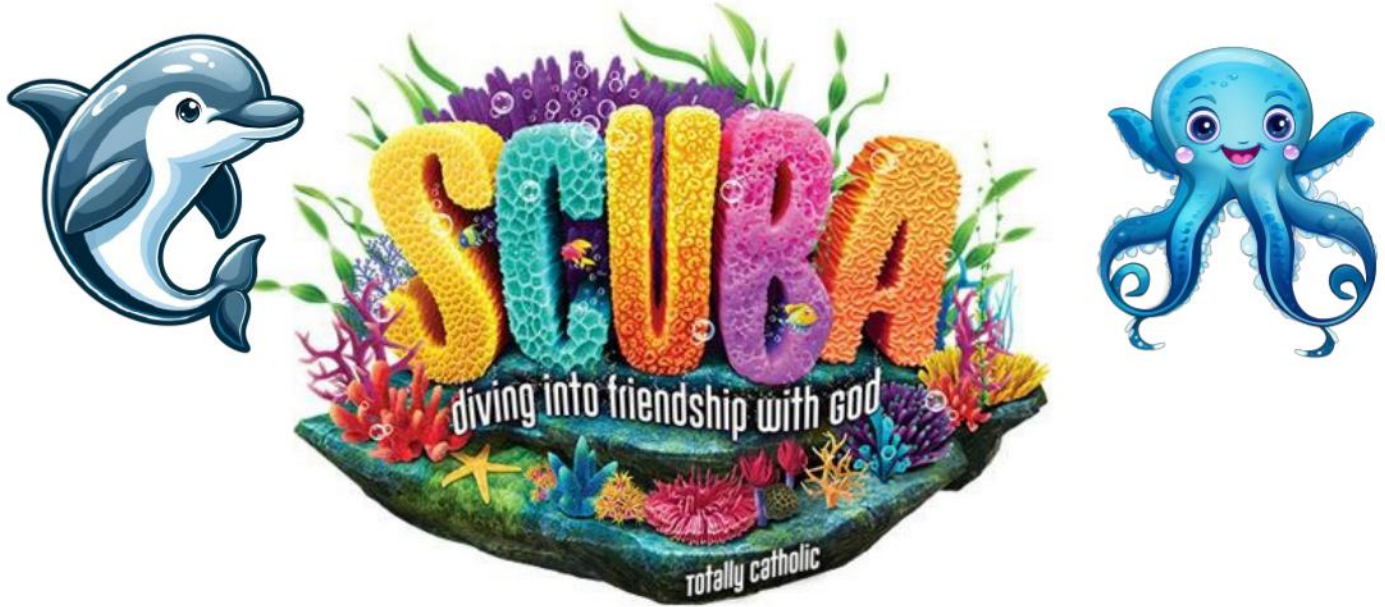

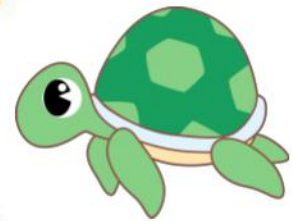

Prayerful and Sacred Silence before Mass

This guide can be an aid in hearing Jesus' voice and speaking with him as you prepare for Holy Mass. I invite you to pray one of the prayers below so that you can more fully participate in the sacred mysteries.

Anima Christi

Soul of Christ, sanctify me. Body of Christ, save me. Blood of Christ, inebriate me. Water from the side of Christ, wash me. Passion of Christ, strengthen me. O Good Jesus, hear me. Within your wounds hide me. Permit me not to be separated from you. From the wicked foe, defend me. At the hour of my death, call me and bid me come to you, that with your saints I may praise you for ever and ever. Amen.

Lectio Divina

1. **Reading** (*lectio*) Choose one of the Sunday readings, and read it several times, leaving room for the Holy Spirit to call your attention to a word, phrase, or line that God wants you to hear.
2. **Meditation** (*meditatio*) Think about the word or words that the Holy Spirit has called to your attention, holding them in your mind and considering them from different angles.
3. **Prayer** (*oratio*) Respond to the sacred words in prayer, either silently or in writing.
4. **Contemplation** (*contemplatio*) Rest in God's presence, quieting yourself and listening for God's response to your prayer.

Our prayers are our way of communicating with God in a personal and familiar way. When we pray, we reinforce our relationship with Jesus Christ, and we strengthen our bond as a son or daughter of God.

P: Petition

"First of all, then, I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone"
-1 Tim 2:1

Pray for those who are sick, alone, in your family, in need, who you miss, who you are estranged from, who are deceased. Then pray for your own needs and desires on your heart.

A: Adoration

"I saw coming with the clouds of heaven one like a son of man. When he reached the Ancient of Days and was presented before him, he received dominion, splendor, and kingship" -Dan 7:13-14

With the angels and saints in heaven, worship God the Father seated on the throne. Adore His Son, our Savior, with deep love and devotion. Praise the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life.

C: Contrition

"Merciful and gracious is the Lord, slow to anger, abounding in mercy." -Psalm 103:8

Express your sorrow to the Lord. Where did you fail to love God as much as you should this past week? Where did you fail to love your family, neighbors, coworkers, friends, and self?

T: Thanksgiving

"Give thanks to the Lord, bless his name; good indeed is the Lord" -Psalm 100:4-5

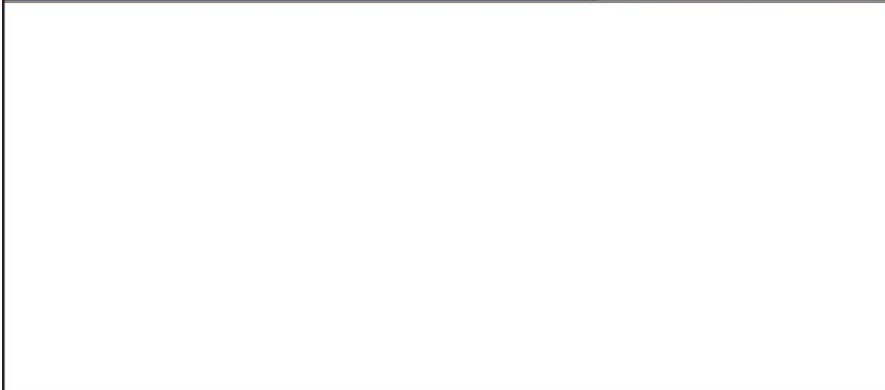
