are more than 100 tombs within the basilica, including most recent Saint Pope John Paul II. Holy Mass at Santo Spirito
Church in Sassia. are more than 100 tombs within th Church in Sassia. Dinner and overnight at our hotel

DAY 4: Rom

DAY 4: Rome
Breakfast in hotel. Then we have a guided tour of the Archbasilica of Saint John Lateran. Six Popes are entombed here. Next door is the Holy Staircase (Scala Santa), brought from Pilate's Palace in Jerusalem by Saint Helena in the 4t century. We celebrate Holy Mass here. We will continue on your pilgrim journey to the Basislica of Saint Mary Major (Maria Maggiore). We will visit The Confessio, or reliquary crypt, which lies before the main rilat of Santa Maria Maggiore, was designed by the architect Virginio Vespignan. Also, in this basilica is kept a relic that has been the object of devotion for several centuries. It is the remains of the cunabulum, the "sacred cradle" or manger in which, according to the Gospels, the Child Jessus was placed at birth.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel.

Breakfast in hotel. We visit of Saint Paul outside the wall. Holy Mass in one of the Chapels. In the afternoon, we visit the center of Rome where we can admire Piazza Navona, the Pantheon, The Church of St. Agostino where is conserved the Michelangelo famous painting "The Pilgrim's Virgin", The Church of San Luigi dei Francesi where we can admire the other famous Carawaggio Paint "The Conversion of St. Matthew". We will end with Fontana di Trevi and the Spanish Steps. Dinner and overnight at our hotel.

DAY 6: Rome
Breakfast in hotel. We departure to Orvieto where in the cathedral is conserved the Eucharistic Miracle of Bolsena. After the visit, we will celebrate the Holy Mass in one chapel of the Cathedral. Time for lunch and departure to Perugia. Visit of the San Lorenzo Cathedral. According to a popular tradition, Joseph gave Our Lady a gold ring, known today as the "Holy Ring." The wedding ring that Joseph gave to Mary is kept in a chaptel in Cathedral of San Lorenzo. You are welcomed by the Virgin Mary, Mater Ciratine, the "praying" Virgin with her hands turned towards the faithful, with a gesture of blessing, protection and welcome. Departure to Assisi. Dinner and overnight atour hotel.

DAY 7: Assisi / Greccio

Breakfast in hotel. We have a guided visit of the city. Visit the Church of St. Clare which houses her incorrupt body. One of the chapels contains the

crucifix that bowed its head and ordered St. Francis to "repair Gods Church". Tour the Basilica of St. Francis built in 1228 to house the Relics of the saint. The "upper "Basilica houses beautiful frescoes of Giotto, Lig from these frescoes that we will know and understand the life and the spirit of St. Francis. We will have our daily Holy Mass there. Time for lunch. Departure to Greecio. Visit of the The Sanctuary of Greecio, set in the bare rock, amazes with its features. The original nucleus of the Sanctuary is the Chapel of the Nativity Scene where "according to tradition – Saint Francis on Christmas night 1223 represented the birth of Jesus for the first time. From here the tradition of the nativity scene was born. Visit of the church of Santa Maria del of the nativity scene was born. Visit of the church of Santa Maria del Giglio and return to Assisi. Dinner and overnight in our hotel.

DAY 8: Assisi / Loretto Breakfast in hotel. We visit of the Church of st Mary the Major and Breakfast in notet. We visit of the C. hurch of st Mary the Major and the "Sanchuay of Dispossession" where is hosted the incorrupt body of the Blessed Carlo Acutis. Visit of St. Mary of the Angels Basilica. This Basilica is where St. Francis spent most of life. During this visit, your group will have the opportunity to visit the beautiful Rose Garden where St. Francis and other friars lived, as well as the cave where the Saint retired to pray. Holy Mass. In the afternoon, we departure to Loreto. Visit of the Basilica. Dinner and overnight at our hotel.

DAY 9: Loreto / Lanciano / San Giovanni Rotondo.

Special Holy Mass in the Holy House at 07:30 in the morning, and

Breakfast in hotel. Departure to San Giovanni Rotondo. During
the transfer, we will stop in Lanciano. Lancianos famous for the Miracle of Lanciano which dates back to the eighth
century. A monk who had doubts about the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, found when he said the words of
consecration at Mass, that the bread and wine changed into flesh and blood. It has been
certified by the Catholic Church as a Eucharistic Miracle. At the end of the celebration we will continue our way to San
Giovanni Rotondo. Accommodation in hotel, dinner and overnight.

DAY 10: San Giovanni Rotondo
Breakfast in hotel and visit of St Pio Sanctuary designed by the famous Architect Renzo Piano. Celebrate Holy Mass.
Time to visit the place where Sam Pio lived, and time for personal prayer. Time for lunch and in the afternoon transfer to the nearby Monte Sant' Angelo. Monte Sant' Angelo as a town appeared only in the eleventh century. Between 1081 and 1103, Monte Sant' Angelo was fic capital of a large Norman dominion under the control of Count Henry, who was a vassal of the Byzantine Empire. The grotto which houses the Sanctuary of Saint Michael the Archangel where according to legend, St. Michael appeared in 490, 492 and 493, has been the site of many famous pilgrimages, which started from Mont Saint-Michel. St. Pope John Paul II visited the sanctuary in 1987. The sanctuary is one of the UNESCO world Heritage sites. Return to San Giovanni Rotondo. Dinner and overnight.


DAY II: San Giovanni Rotondo / Rome

Breakfast in hotel and departure to Rome. During our way to Rome we will stop in Pietrelcina to visit the hometown of San Pio. Visit of the Church of the Holy Family. The place where the Church of the Holy Family stands was indicated by Padre Pio, subsequently a request was made to the American lady Mary Pyle to have a contribution for the construction of the convent and the Church that should be dedicated to the Holy Family as per request of San Pio. During the construction of the Church, the workard in order to find the water they need. EUCHARITIC REVIVAL: THE YEAR OF MISSION

The first National Eucharistic Congress in more than a century in the United States is July 17-21 in Indianapolis. While about 40,000 people will attend in person, most Catholics will participate from home. Here are some suggestions for each of us to get involved and be part of the Eucharistic People.

Embracing Our Apostolic Roots

Jesus in the Eucharist is the answer to every restless longing of the human heart. If we truly believe this, then that living faith will compel us to share this joy with our brothers and sisters! That's what the third year of the Revival—the Year of Mission—is all about.

The Holy Spirit has enkindled a missionary fire in the heart of our nation, and now he is sending out every member of the Church to spread the Good News—sharing the gift of our Eucharistic Lord with those on the margins. If you feel called to live this mission in a way that's unique to you and your strengths, please take time to discern and embark on your Eucharistic Mission. Remember, all of us are called to become a Eucharistic Missionary in our Vocation as sons and daughters of God.

The Four Pillars of Mission

PILLAR 1: Eucharistic Encounter

To have a personal relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist, we must maintain an active relationship with him ourselves. This pillar focuses on deepening that personal relationship through prayer, adoration, and sacraments. Regular and profound encounters with Jesus strengthens us to be a more authentic and powerful witness to his love.

PILLAR 2: Eucharistic Identity

To truly live out our mission as Catholics, we must first embrace our identity as beloved children of the Father, shaped by our relationship with Christin the Eucharist. This pillar emphasizes the importance of internalizing and living out the teachings and love of Jesus, allowing our Eucharistic encounter to define who we are. Through these encounters, our hearts and minds are transformed, guiding us to reflect Christ's love in every aspect of our lives.



PILLAR 3: Eucharistic Life

This pillar encourages us to integrate our love for Christ into every aspect of our lives, transforming daily actions into continuous acts of worship and service. As we love Christ more, our lives become configured to his, reflecting his sacrificial love. When we live a Eucharistic life, we join in Christ's self-offering, allowing his love to flow through us to others.

PILLAR 4: Eucharistic Mission

This pillar is a call to evangelize – boldly spreading the good news of Christ's Eucharistic love and mercy in word and deed. As our love for Christ deepens, our lives will become increasingly configured to his mission, compelling us to serve others with his heart. We will be drawn to compassionate service, living our call to be his hands and feet to our neighbors and bring his presence to the margins.



What is a Eucharistic Missionary?

A Eucharistic Missionary is any Catholic who—inspired by an encounter with Christ in the Eucharist and fueled by the Bread of Life—allows God to use them as an instrument of his grace "for the life of the world." These missionaries embrace their deepest identity as a member of



the Body of Christ and commit to living a Eucharistic life with a heart for those who are most in need, those who are lost, and those who are the "least." They follow the promptings of the Holy Spirit to spread the Gospel by word and deed.

Remember, we aren't doing this alone. The whole Church is walking on a mission together with us. Let us pray for the success of the Eucharistic Congress and let us continue to love our Eucharistic Lord, who is truly present in Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity and let our lives be built around the Holy Eucharist. t

STRATEGIES FOR CONNECTING TO THE EUCHARIST

TEACH THE IMPORTANCE OF THE SABBATH.

We all know the Third Commandment: "Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day." Read from Pope John Paul II's apostolic letter, Dies Domini, on the subject. "Sunday," he wrote, "is a day which is at the very heart of the Christian life." Help families recover a sense that Sunday is not complete without the Mass.

TEACH THE MEANING OF THE MASS AND THE ROLE OF THE PEOPLE.

All catechists should study the Mass: what we do, why we do it, and what it means. Share what you learn about the Mass with students and promote full, conscious, and active participation. This is not just part of preparation for First Holy Communion. More importantly, an effective liturgical catechist understands how to live the Mass and shares the value of that.

TEACH BOTH THE MEAL AND THE SACRIFICE.

Too often, we teach children that the Mass is only a meal. We do come to the table of the Lord to be nourished by Word and Sacrament. We also come to reenact the sacrifice of Jesus Christ; we offer ourselves-not just the bread and wine-to be changed into people of sacrificial love. (See CCC 901 and Lumen Gentium 34) Teach children that by offering themselves as living sacrifices, they can be changed to become more like Jesus.



ALWAYS MAKE CLASSROOM CONNECTIONS.

As mentioned <u>earlier in this series</u>, liturgical catechists integrate elements of the Mass into their classrooms, such as the colors of the liturgical season, symbols used during the liturgy, postures and gestures of the Mass, and the verbal formulas used during the Mass. This helps young people develop a comfort-level with ritual action, language, and symbols. These connections reinforce the importance of the liturgy and its significance for all Catholics.

CONNECT THE DOMESTIC CHURCH TO THE LITURGY.

Try sending home prayer and activity ideas as each new season of the liturgical year begins. Invite families to study the readings together by subscribing to the <u>Sunday Connection</u>. You can e-mail parents links to <u>good liturgical videos</u>. You can also start your own Pinterest board for great ideas and share those boards with families.

ENCOURAGE FAMILY MASS ATTENDANCE.

A catechist I once knew invited families of his first graders to meet in the back of church before Mass and to sit together as a class. After Mass, they went out for donuts. This approach can help non-participating parents become comfortable with the community and come to know one another as part of the Body of Christ. The most important thing we can do for children and youth is to give them a sense that they are a vital part of the Church.

FLORIDA'S PRO-ABORTION AMENDMENT EXPLAINED

Why Floridians Should Vote NO on Amendment 4

Titled "Amendment to Limit Covernment Interference with Abortion," Amendment 4 would enshrine UNREGULATED ABORTION in our state constitution, making Florida one of the MOST PRO-ABORTION states in the nation. The amendment language is MISLEADING, and its proposed outcomes are DANGEROUS.

WHAT IT SAYS

BALLOT SUMMARY No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict

before viability

abortion

or when necessary to protect the patient's health,

as determined by the patient's healthcare provider.

This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion.

WHAT IT DOES

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Amendment 4 would jeopardize existing laws and prohibit new ones that voters on both sides of the abortion issue support, including health and safety laws that protect women.

ALLOWS SECOND AND THIRD TRIMESTER ABORTIONS

Though not defined in the amendment, "viability" is defined in Florida law as the stage of development when the life of a fetus is sustainable outside the womb (Ch. 390.011(IS)), generally accepted to be 22-24 weeks of pregnancy, or about 6 months.

CREATES A BROAD "HEALTH" LOOPHOLE

"Patient's health" is not defined in the amendment, allowing post-viability, extremely late-term abortions for treatable, temporary health concerns. Emotional health would justify an abortion when a child could survive outside the womb.

WEAKENS MEDICAL DOCTOR REQUIREMENT

"Healthcare providers" – not just physicians – could determine if an abortion is "necessary" to protect the mother's "health." Even some employees of abortion clinics, such as nurses and counselors, could approve late-term abortions.

ELIMINATES PARENTAL CONSENT

While preserving parental notification in our state constitution (Article X, Section 22), the amendment would invalidate the current law that requires parental consent for a minor to have an abortion (Ch. 390.0114/5)), making abortion the only medical decision for which parents have no say.




PEOPLE NEEDED
