PRAYER BEFORE AN ELECTION

Lord God, as the election approaches, we seek to better understand the issues and concerns that confront our city/state/country, and how the Gospel compels us to respond as faithful citizens in our community.

FLORIDA'S PRO-ABORTION AMENDMENT EXPLAINED Why Floridians Should Vote NO on Amendment 4

Titled "Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion," Amendment 4 would enshrine **UNREGULATED ABORTION** in our state constitution, making Florida one of the **MOST PRO-ABORTION** states in the nation. The amendment language is **MISLEADING**, and its proposed outcomes are **DANGEROUS**.

WHAT IT SAYS

BALLOT SUMMARY

No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion

before viability

or when necessary to protect the patient's health,

as determined by the patient's healthcare provider.

This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion.

WHAT IT DOES

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Amendment 4 would jeopardize existing laws and prohibit new ones that voters on both sides of the abortion issue support, including health and safety laws that protect women.

ALLOWS SECOND AND THIRD TRIMESTER ABORTIONS

Though not defined in the amendment, "viability" is defined in Florida law as the stage of development when the life of a fetus is sustainable outside the womb (Ch. 390.011(15)), generally accepted to be 22-24 weeks of pregnancy, or about 6 months.

CREATES A BROAD "HEALTH" LOOPHOLE

"Patient's health" is not defined in the amendment, allowing post-viability, extremely late-term abortions for treatable, temporary health concerns. Emotional health would justify an abortion when a child could survive outside the womb.

WEAKENS MEDICAL DOCTOR REQUIREMENT

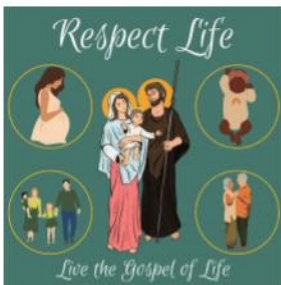
"Healthcare providers" – not just physicians – could determine if an abortion is "necessary" to protect the mother's "health." Even some employees of abortion clinics, such as nurses and counselors, could approve late-term abortions.

ELIMINATES PARENTAL CONSENT

While preserving parental notification in our state constitution (Article X, Section 22), the amendment would invalidate the current law that requires parental consent for a minor to have an abortion (Ch. 390.0114(5)), making abortion the only medical decision for which parents have no say.

RESPECT LIFE EVENTS

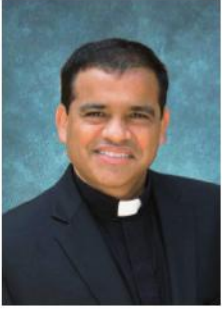
- **Respect Life Weekend - October 5th & 6th:** The entire State of Florida will Host Respect Life on the same

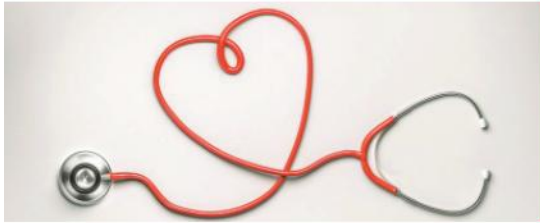

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO MOTHER (MAMA) MARY!

According to tradition, this feast probably began with the consecration of the basilica of St. Ann in Jerusalem. The September birth was chosen because the Eastern Church begins its Church year in September. Birth has been assigned to September 8, both in the East and in the West, which is nine months after the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on December 8. The feast was brought to Rome toward the end of the 7th century by Eastern monks. Gradually, it spread to the other parts of the West. Scripture does not give us an account of Mary's birth. However, according to the apocryphal Gospel of James, Anna and Joachim, the parents of Mary, were infertile but prayed for a child. They received the promise of a child who would advance God's plan of salvation for the world. Although it is not an actual birthday, it is a way of honoring the gentle and holy woman who said "yes" to God's call and let God's word of love become flesh in her and make a gift of the "word-made-flesh" to the world. It is also a challenge and an inspiration for us to welcome God's word of love into our hearts and let it transform our life. HOLY SPIRIT HEALTH MINISTRY: FAITH, REASON AND HEALTH

Like so many issues in modern times, we are frequently presented with an "either/ or" choice, coaxed into thinking it must be only one OR the other. Not so, with faith and reason- they are meant to be celebrated together.

"Not only can faith and reason never be at odds with one another but they mutually support each other, for on the one hand right reason established the foundations of the faith and illuminated by its light, develops the science of divine things; on the other hand, faith delivers reason from errors and protects it and furnishes it with knowledge of many kinds." (Dei Filius, 1870, Chapter IV)

We can only get so far with natural reason alone, at which point we must be open (with good will) to the grace of God. Our hearts must be softened such that we may receive His gift of supernatural Faith and love. What does this look like in real life?

"Ask, and it will be given you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you." (Matt 7:7) I've pondered this for decades, and it was only recently that it made sense. First of all, did you notice the sequence of Ask, Seek and Knock? Whenever I try to memorize things, it's often with a mnemonic, taking the first letters of key points. In this case, "A, S, K"- Powerful message that is being reinforced in the Gospel. It all begins with us ASKING, not the "experts" out there, but Him/ God, dwelling inside each sanctified soul!

In my holistic vision of true health, Body, Mind and Spirit are working together synergistically. I see ASKING as a function of the Mind... fitting beautifully with natural reason. We are naturally curious about life and our Creator, God, and can get an intellectual understanding of Him with natural reason alone. But that can feel very shallow. It's like getting to the top of a mountain and looking out and saying, "is that all there is?"

I believe we innately desire to feel more... to connect with our Creator, and that requires a leap of faith- to SEEK His gift of supernatural faith. Without faith, we are essentially stranded... sitting on the mountaintop, alone with our intellectual (head) knowledge, yet unable to enjoy the ecstasy of union (heart) with God. This is our desire for Spirit (breath/ fire of life) which is often smothered in our busy, distracted modern times. Finally, I see KNOCKING as a physical/ Body activity, in which we take action upon receiving our gift of supernatural faith from God. With all three facets in harmony and working together, we come to the fullness of truth about ourselves, as Pope John Paul II noted so eloquently in Fides et Ratio (1998):

"Faith and reason are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth; and God has placed in the human heart a desire to know the truth—in a word, to know himself—so that, by knowing and loving God, men and women may also come to the fullness of truth about themselves."

If we don't have the two wings of Faith and Reason flowing in harmony with one another, not only will we be unable to "take off" properly, but if we miraculously get airborne for a while, we could come crashing to the ground if we ever choose to abandon one wing in favor of the other. It is obvious that we need both Faith and Reason to flourish as human beings. May God continue to bless us as we soar to great heights with Him- utilizing body, mind and spirit to make wise choices (based on Truth) and find purpose in our daily crosses!

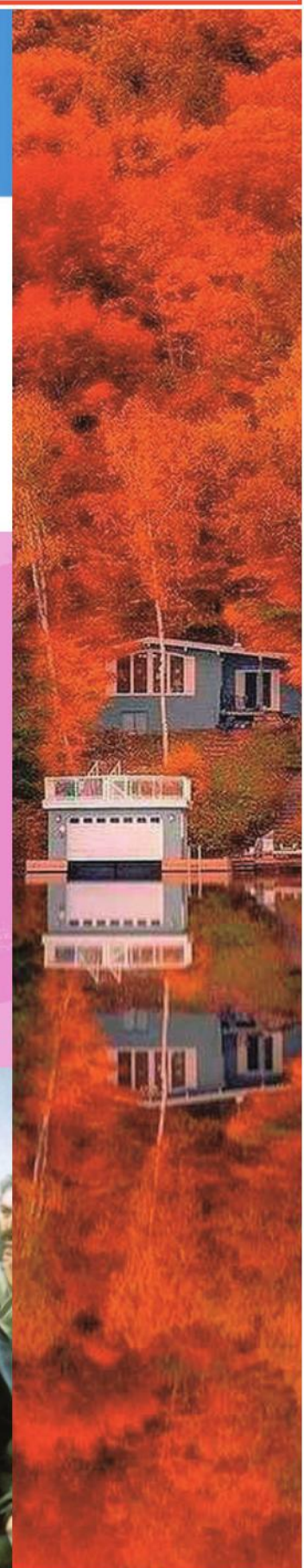

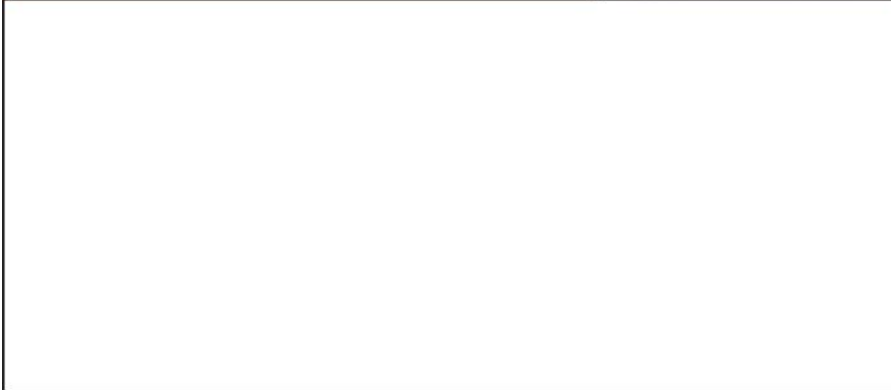
