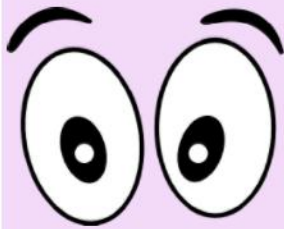

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

## GUIDELINES FOR USE OF THE FAMILY LIFE CENTER

- 1) The following guidelines have been put in place to assist in planning all events to ensure our Family Life Center serves the needs of our parish. Please contact the office if need further help.
- 2) All use of the FLC must be scheduled in advance with the church office. In case of a conflicting date, the first request will be honored.
- 3) Request forms are available in the office and must be submitted/approved for each event except for recurring ministry/parish board meetings. These only require an initial request.
- 4) The church office will assign the event space in the FLC to ensure the most efficient use.
- 5) First scheduling priority: Parish functions as well as ministry meetings and events. This includes but is not limited to ministry and committee meetings, faith formation, youth ministry events, parish family nights, and funeral/wedding receptions for funerals/weddings held in Holy Spirit Church.
- 6) Second scheduling priority: Celebrations of milestone life events for parishioners, and family members of a registered parishioner living in the same household and/or dependent on the parishioner for support. Events include birthdays limited to years 1, 16, 18, 21, 50, 60, 70, and above, Baptism, First Communion, baby showers, wedding anniversaries 1, 25, 50 and over, and retirements.
- 7) Third Scheduling Priority: Non-profit and charitable groups associated with DOSA.
- 8) The Pastor will have final approval of all requests and based upon availability may be able to hold some events in the gym.
- 9) Events will be required to pay for certain fees, such as a cleaning fee and insurance. Details of all charges will be reviewed for each event by the church office.
  
- 10) No events/celebrations during Mass times.

## SCAM ALERT

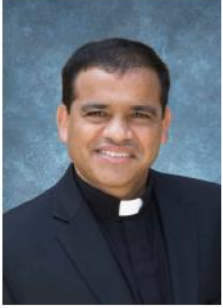

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Today, we begin the season of Advent, a time of joyful, faith-filled and patient waiting. We are invited to consider the weeks of preparation for Christmas as an opportunity for nurturing a spirituality of waiting in expectation - not a passive, inactive, idle and unimaginative presence in space and time - but a dynamic, active and positively imaginative waiting - a spiritual posture of waiting and longing for Christ, praying and preparing for his ultimate appearance among us – a spirituality of hope, simple and pure optimism about us and the world around us.

The season of Advent reminds us that our faith in God, our hope in His promises and our love for Him and each other are the greatest wealth that we possess. It reminds us that we are a privileged people, a people blessed and graced by God's unconditional love revealed in Jesus; that God has not abandoned the world; that he continues to break into our history; that the presence of or even the height of evil must not discourage us. The apparent brokenness and disintegration of the world will be healed. God continues to bring about healing, integrity and wholeness. May the season of Advent and the good news challenge us to live lives that are faithful, blameless, loving, and joyful during these difficult and troublesome times.

Today's Gospel reminds us of how easy it is to become lazy in our life of faith. It reminds us that our hearts can become drowsy from "carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life." First, any time we give in to an excess of one sort or another, we begin to let our hearts become drowsy on a spiritual level. Whenever we seek momentary escapes from life without turning to God, we allow ourselves to become spiritually drowsy.



Second, this passage identifies "the anxieties of daily life" as a source of becoming drowsy. So often we face anxiety in life, we can feel overwhelmed and overly burdened by one thing or another. When we feel burdened by life, we tend to look for a way out. And far too often, the "way out" is something that makes us spiritually drowsy.

On this first Sunday of Advent, Jesus calls us to remain awake and vigilant in our life of faith. This will happen when we keep the truth in our minds and hearts and our eyes on the will of God. The moment we turn our eyes to the burdens of life and fail to see God during all things, we become spiritually drowsy and begin, in a sense, to fall asleep. Let us reflect upon the fact that God is calling us to become wide awake. He wants our full attention, and He wants us completely sober in our life of faith. Let us fix our eyes on Him and let Him keep us continually prepared for His imminent return.

I encourage you to take a few moments each day of this week to be still and reflect on how your day has been and pray, Lord, I do love You and I desire to love You even more. Help me to remain wide awake in my life of faith. Help me to keep my eyes on You through all things so that I am always prepared for You when You come to me. Have a Blessed Season of Advent!

Be sure to take a few still moments during the week. Bless yourself with stillness!

# ADVENT PREPARATIONS

## WHAT ARE ADVENT'S ORIGINS?

Easter is the Church's principal liturgical feast, and Easter celebrations set the pattern for every other feast during the liturgical year. Although we cannot determine exactly when the Church began to celebrate Advent, the Church's celebration of the Advent season goes back at least 14 centuries. We have Advent sermons from Gregory the Great (who died in 604) and evidence shows the Church in Spain celebrated the Advent season by the middle of the seventh century.

Fifty years earlier, a Church synod (a meeting of Church leaders to discuss questions of Church discipline, faith or morals) determined that during the days from Nov. 11 to Dec. 25 should be observed like the days of Lent. When November 11 came to be observed as the feast of St. Martin of Tours, this preparatory time became known as "St. Martin's Lent."



As this name suggests, Advent was initially far more penitential than it is today. After the Second Vatican Council, emphasis shifted from penance to spiritual preparation for Jesus' birth. Thus although we adopt violet vestments and forego the Gloria at Mass, our liturgical readings call us to anticipate Jesus' birth, sharing the joy of John the Baptist and the Virgin Mary.

## WHY DO WE HEAR SO MUCH ABOUT JOHN THE BAPTIST DURING ADVENT?

The universal Church begins the new liturgical year with the arrival of the season of Advent — a season with two main themes: looking backward and looking forward. The word "advent" itself means "to come" or "to arrive." In Advent, we prepare for the Lord's coming at the end of time, an appointed time we know not. We are admonished to be watchful and ready for that day (see, among other similar admonitions of the Lord, Mt 24: 42-44).

As a means to prepare for his Second Coming, we also look back to Christ's coming among us the first time — born a babe in Bethlehem. In Advent, the Church recalls Christ's identity as Redeemer and Savior as foretold by the prophets — chief among whom is St. John the Baptist. His role was to prepare the people for the first advent of the Messiah, especially through his preaching of repentance and conversion (see, for instance, Mt 3: 1-12). These are two primary themes of which we should be cognizant as we prepare to meet the Lord when he comes.



## SHORT ADVENT PRAYERS

*From Hallow (Recommended Catholic App)*

Advent is a relatively short liturgical season, so perhaps it's fitting that short, simple prayers are all we need to feel God's calming presence in our lives amid the many distractions of November and December. Consider these brief Catholic prayers this Advent season:

- Dear Lord, please allow me to embrace Advent in the way the Church intends: as a way to prepare for Your arrival. May everything I do—every gift I send, every party I attend, every meal I share—remind me to prepare space in my heart for You. Amen.
- Lord, send down Your Spirit to guide me during Advent this year. May the Holy Spirit help me journey closer to You and lift me up when I feel down and led me when I feel lost. I may stumble at times, but I know my ultimate journey is to draw closer to You and build Your kingdom here on earth—a kingdom that Jesus's birth, life and death helped secure. Amen.

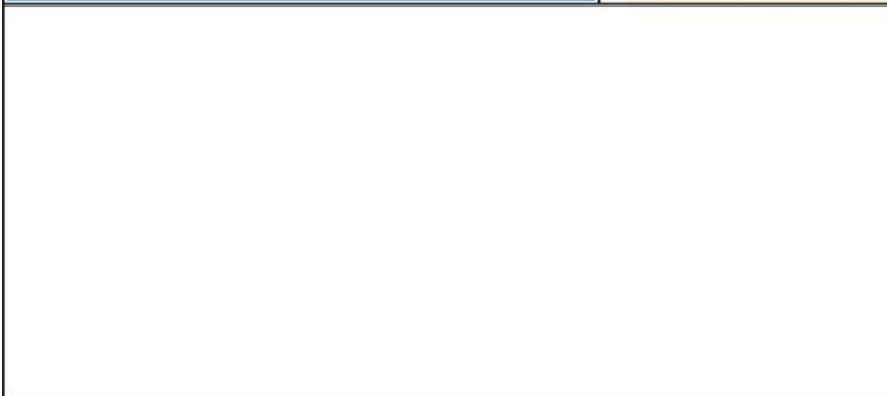
