FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Dear Sisters and Brothers.

We are in the second week of Advent. For some people the season of Advent is the "Christmas Season", for others it is a 'holiday season", and for still others it is just the winter season. Whatever one may call it, it is sure is the season of "gift giving" and "gift receiving". The season brings with it signs of joy – colorful decorations and lights, smell of pastries, music in the air, people busying themselves searching for gifts and wrapping

gifts - lots of signs of joy all around. "Gift- Giving" becomes center of our celebration.

But remember the most wonderful gift of God for us is the gift of His Son "Jesus", who came bringing us the light to the world, forgiveness of sins, healing of brokenness and conversion and transformation of our lives in God. This message very much resonates from the mouth of St. John the

Baptist, who is urging us to prepare for the coming of Jesus. To do that, St. Francis de Sales is asking us to start from our heart.

We all know, our heart is the source of our action. As our hearts are, so are our actions. Whoever wins a person's heart has won the whole person. Yet even the heart, where we wish to begin, must be instructed. St. John the Baptist wants us to fill our fearful hearts with faith and hope. Certain fears and anxieties, when excessive, unnerve the heart and



often lead to discouragement. These are the ditches and valleys that must be filled with confidence and hope to prepare for Our Lord's coming.

Make straight the paths. Roads that twist and turn fatigue and greatly mislead the traveler. We must straighten our ways with confidence that God will give us the necessary help to acquire an even disposition. Don't lose heart. Be patient. Do all you can to develop a spirit of compassion. If God allows you to stumble, it is only to let you know that if God were not holding your hand, you will fall. This is how we learn to take a tighter hold of God's hand. Those who have Jesus Christ in their heart will soon have Him in all their ways and will be able to "Live Jesus" every moment of our lives.

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

"She became mother of all the living..."

On December 9th we celebrate the Patronal Feast Day of the United States of America, "The immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary". Reading taken from the Book of Genesis says: "The man called his wife Eve because she became the mother of all the living." Eve is the mother of us all. We all bear traces of her maternity by we are impacted by original sin. Eve's "yes" to the serpent's temptation continues to affect our lives even to this day.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Good for us that another woman is likewise "the mother of all the living." However, she is our mother in an entirely different way; her "yes" affects us in an entirely different way. In his Introduction to the Devout Life, Francis de Sales wrote:

"Honor, venerate and respect with special love the holy and glorious Virgin Mary who, being the mother of Jesus Christ our brother, is also in truth our very mother. Let us then have recourse to her, and as her little children cast ourselves into her bosom with perfect confidence, always and on all occasions let us invoke her maternal love whilst striving to imitate her virtues..." (Living Jesus, p. 224)

So, we have – in truth – two mothers. One mother is famous for saying "yes" to the temptation of the evil one; the other mother is famous for saying "yes" to the invitation of the Holy One: both with lasting effects! She is a mother to us, even and especially during these troubling times. Today which of our mothers will we imitate?

Our Lady of Guadalupe

When the Blessed Mother appeared in Mexico in 1531, she came to a society that greatly needed her maternal intercession. Many Spanish inhabitants were not living as faithful Catholics, Spanish government officials were unjust toward the native people, and despite the presence of missionaries, there were very few conversions among the native Mexicans. Previously, under Aztec

rule, as many as 50,000 people a year were sacrificed to pagan gods, and human sacrifice continued at the time of Our Lady's appearance. The Blessed Mother's appearance can be seen as a sign of her Immaculate Conception. The day she appeared to Juan Diego, December 9, was the feast of the Immaculate Conception at that time. Her name "Guadalupe" can be seen as a connection to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Spain where there was a statue of Mary as the Immaculate Conception, which showed her surrounded by the rays of the sun and with the moon under her feet.




The image of Our Lady of Guadalupe is truly miraculous; it was not produced by art or technology, and it has lasted for over 500 years, even though it is made from cactus fiber, which normally disintegrates within 20 years.

For us, the main message of Our Lady of Guadalupe is love. Her apparition in Mexico showed the love of Jesus who sent His mother to help save the people of the Americas; she came because of her love for her Son and her love for the people. She was their merciful mother and knew their needs – especially their spiritual needs. She knew they needed a place where they could encounter Jesus and visit him in the Blessed Sacrament. She knew they needed to believe in God and be baptized. She knew they needed to respect human life. She knew they needed to know they had a mother who loved them and was always looking after them. The tilma with her image has provided a constant reminder of Mary's maternal love for over five hundred years. May she continue to intercede for the Americas!

AROUND THE PARISH

A Guide to

Confession



BEFORE YOU GO

Examine your conscience, that is, reflect on what sins you have committed. To guide you, take an "Examination of Conscience" guide from the gathering area or just Google one. Preparing to receive the sacrament helps us open ourselves to God's grace and mercy.



INTRODUCTION

When you come before the priest whether sitting face to face or behind the screen, begin by making the Sign of the Cross, and continue by saying, "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been (how long) since my last confession. My sins are..."



CONFESSION

List the sins you've committed that came to mind during your examination of conscience or any that also come to mind during this time. Don't be too general ("I haven't been a good person"), but also don't be too detailed (you don't need to tell the whole story of how a sin came about). If you're not sure, ask the priest. Remember that this is not professional counseling, but the sacrament of Confession.



PENANCE

The priest will then give you something to do or pray as your penance. Penance is your response to God's mercy. You'll have to remember what this is and do it after the confession is over, so pay attention.



ACT OF CONTRITION

The priest will then ask you to pray out loud the "Act of Contrition": My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy.



ABSOLUTION


After you pray the Act of Contrition, the priest will extend his hands and pray the Prayer of Absolution. Here, the priest acts in the person of Christ, so as to forgive your sins. Remember it's still God that is forgiving your sins, but he priest acts in the person of Christ at this moment.



CONCLUSION

The priest will then say some conclusion such as "Go in peace," and you can respond, "Thanks be to God." Don't forget to do your penance. If it is saying certain prayers, the best is to do it right away before you leave the church or before you forget.






