

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which is a milestone event in the life of Jesus, in the Christmas story and in our Catholic Christian life. Christ did not go to John the Baptist to confess His sins, as others had done. Rather, He who is like us in all things but sin and taking on himself the weight of

human sin, humbles Himself to be baptized. Thus, He sanctified the waters and, in so doing, as the Fathers of the Church teach, He instituted the Sacrament of Baptism by His actions. He did not need to do this, but, like everything else He did, it was done out of love for us and for the Father. And so, Baptism of Jesus affirms his solidarity with us sinners in a public way. His conception, his birth, his life and work with Mary and Joseph, his struggle with

human weakness, his friendship with people including his enemies, all of which proclaims his solidarity with us sinful men and women.

Remember our baptism brings us also into solidarity with Christ and with him into solidarity with all people of God as brothers and sisters. As Jesus was being baptized, he was identified and affirmed as the beloved son of God and empowered with the Holy Spirit. This is what happens at our own baptism. We are identified and affirmed as "sons of God" and "daughters of God" and empowered with the Holy Spirit to live as sons and daughters of God and to fulfill the mission entrusted to us.

To be identified as "Sons of God" and "Daughters of God" means to be immersed into the very likeness of God, to be



immersed into the mystery of God's life and love, to be immersed into the character of God, to be identified with the image of God and to be called and named to image of God. In Baptism we are immersed into the mystery God's love. We are washed clean, given a clean garment, a lighted candle and anointed priest, prophet, and king – all symbolizing our character, an amazing and indelible character!!!

Our Baptism is the beginning of a life that would continue for eternity in the everlasting glory of Heaven and the beginning of our life as beloved children of God. Let us remember the



graces we have received in Baptism and renew our Baptismal promises, consecrating ourselves to the Holy Trinity and rejecting sin and evil forces. Let us pray for the Grace of God to help us to be faithful to our Baptismal promises.
