

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



# St. Francis de Sales, Bishop and the Doctor of the Church

The Missionaries of St. Francis de sales known as 'Fransalians" just celebrated the feast day of our Patron saint. St. Francis de sales was born on August 21, 1567, at Thonon, near Annecy in France. He graduated from the University of Padua with a Doctorate in both civil law and ecclesiastical law. He was ordained a priest on December 18, 1593. He worked among the Calvinists, faced much opposition, including attempt on his life and converting the whole district of Chablais to

the Catholic faith.

He was ordained a bishop on December 8, 1602. He was a good shepherd, caring for all with a special love for the poor. He founded a contemplative religious order, "The Sisters of the Visitation" on June 6, 1610. This order was to accept as members the poor, the weak in health, the handicapped and the widows whom normally religious orders did not admit. He wrote two books, Spiritual Classics: 'The Introduction to Devout Life" and "A Treatise on The Love of God". He passed away at the age of fifty five of cerebral hemorrhage at Lyons on 28th December 1622. On 28th December 1661 he was beatified by Alexander VII and



was canonized on 19th April 1665 by the same Pope. St. Francis de Sales was declared Doctor of the Church on 16th November 1877 by Pope Pius IX. Pius XI proclaimed him the heavenly patron of all writers on January 26, 1923.

St. Francis De Sales is foremost among those who were consistently and visibly human in his relationship to God and people. His spirituality was so human that those without theological insights could understand and follow his spirituality. He was very human and gentle, optimistic, and positive about life and the world, strong in character and compassionate in ministry and most of all he had a harmonious and peaceful spirit. He encouraged people to find holiness in Everyday matters, emphasizing freedom, each one must choose to be good and to do good, to live noble and virtuous lives and reject what is bad and harmful.

In whatever state of life men and women find themselves, they can discover the way to God, joyfully and without fear. God can be found anywhere, everywhere and by everyone. The hours we spend in our daily chores need not be spiritually empty or useless. It is in faithfully and generously doing our daily chores and fulfilling our responsibilities so that we live our life of faith.

St. Francis de Sales is the Apostle of Chablais, the Gentleman saint, a Doctor of the Church and the Patron of Writers. Various religious congregations have been founded under the patronage of St. Francis de Sales. And he is the heavenly patron of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales also known as Fransalians.

### St. Francis de Sales: Doctor of Love

He was not a gloomy, austere saint but most amiable and friendly with him all. Endowed with every virtue, he excelled in meekness of heart, a virtue so peculiar to himself that it might be considered his most characteristic trait. His meekness, however, differed altogether from that artificial gentility which consists in the mere possession of polished manners and in the display of a purely conventional affability.

This virtue, which grew in the heart of St. Francis as a delightful effect of his love towards God and was nourished by the spirit of compassion and tenderness, so tempered with sweetness, the natural gravity of his demeanor which softened both his voice and manners that he won the affectionate regard of everyone whom he encouraged.

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

His work on Spiritual Direction led to the publication of the great classic Introduction to the Devout Life, and the other great, but later work A Treatise on the Love of God. Fundamental to these works is the doctrine that the spiritual life is not just for the religious and the clergy, but for everyone. It is for this reason that he is seen as the first great writer since the Early Fathers to be concerned with the spirituality of the laity. He considered it a

heresy to say that a lay person could not attain sanctity and holiness of life through the grace of God. It is for these reasons that St. Francis de Sales may be considered also the patron of Lay Spirituality, and the Lay Apostolate known as "Fransalian Associates".

# The Gentleman Saint

Unlike many of the saints – whose lives full of marvelous occurrences seem to be beyond the reach of ordinary Christians – the life of de Sales presents nothing sensational. His ideals of moderation and charity, of gentleness and humility, of cheerfulness and abandonment to God's will are expressed with a commonsense spirituality that is gentle and respectful of others – this lifestyle earned Francis the appellation of 'Gentleman Saint.' Furthermore, his ecumenical sensitivity and his personal gentleness together with his commonsense rejection of the extremes of the lay people contributed to his being credited with this title.



# **Our Mission and Ministry Today**

The Missionaries of St. Francis De Sales is an international religious congregation founded in France in 1838 by Fr. Peter Marie Mermier. Our mission and ministry are spread across 31 countries in Europe, Asia, United States and Africa. We have over 1,233 priests, 368 Seminarians in formation to the priesthood, and 11 provinces and Missions.

We serve God and His people in many ways: building new faith communities, churches, educating the youth through establishing Schools, parish ministries, retreats, caring for the orphans, street children, the elderly, and offering counseling and spiritual direction.

We try every day to dedicate our life to the Lord to proclaim the gospel by word and deed by our loving service to those in dire need. The Fransalians work so hard for the Empowerment of humans, particularly of women and children in the poverty-stricken areas, eradication of poverty and illiteracy, and health care are the most important components of our missionary activities.

Please do remember our Missionaries known as "Fransalians" and Fransalian Associates" the lay Apostolate in your prayers that we may continue to be faithful to our missionary call and the ministry to the people of God after the Heart of Jesus, the First Missionary and our patron saint Francis de sales and our founder, the Servant of God Fr. Peter Marie Mermier.

# Statement of the Bishops of Florida on the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

January 22, 2025

Informed by the divinely revealed truth that the human being is made in the image and likeness of God (Genesis 2:26-27), as Christians we care for all of God's children, especially the most vulnerable among us. On this Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children, we renew our call to pray and work for a culture that protects life in the womb and offers loving support to all mothers, fathers, and families.

Florida celebrated two major milestones over the past year. First, the Florida Supreme Court reversed the finding in the 1989 legal case, *In Re: TW*, that bent the state constitution's right to privacy to include a broad right to abortion. We celebrate the overturning of this longstanding wrong in Florida jurisprudence. This ruling paved the way for the Heartbeat Protection Act, which restricts the intentional taking of the life of an unborn child at 6 weeks of gestation, to go into effect.

Second, in the November election, Amendment 4 was defeated. This proposed amendment to Florida's constitution was pushed by a well-funded effort spreading misinformation about women's healthcare and current abortion law. If passed, it would have removed nearly all regulation of abortion up to viability and well beyond.

The Church in Florida made a considerable effort to help defeat Amendment 4, and we thank the many people of goodwill who worked in defense of the innocent preborn. We are grateful that voters rejected this amendment, but we also recognize that many of our fellow citizens voted in its favor and that much work remains. While the Heartbeat Protection Act has significantly decreased the number of abortions, the unfortunate reality is that abortions continue to be performed in Florida at a high rate.

Most of the important work in building a culture of life is undertaken outside the legislature and the courts. We must advance protections for unborn children and their mothers by communicating with compassion the truth

We laud the services performed by pregnancy care centers and ministries such as Walking with Moms in Need. These initiatives meet and accompany women in difficult situations who are often told that they have no choice but to seek abortion and provide them with love, dignity, and practical resources.

"We must advance protections for unborn children and their mothers by communicating with compassion the truth about abortion, respecting the rights and dignity of women, and continuing our commitment to the family."

We give thanks to those who have embraced the calling to marriage and family life and witness to us generously, as well as to those who help to prepare and support husbands and wives living their vocations. New life is welcomed in marriage and nourished in the family. This helps each child and ultimately all of society to flourish. As St. John Paul II famously noted, "In the face of the so-called culture of death, the family is the heart of the culture of life." (*Centessimus Annus*, no. 39, May 1, 1991)

Despite challenges, we remain confident in the Lord Jesus, who draws close to all those who suffer. With prayer and fasting, through the intercession of Mary, we ask Jesus to have mercy on our state and our nation and to bring about laws that protect every human life and banish every form of injustice. To all who have experienced the harm of abortion, there is always mercy and forgiveness in Jesus Christ. We invite all people to join in building a civilization of love in which every human being is valued and loved.




