

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK




Dear Friends,

## How do we fast?

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat **one full meal**, as well as **two smaller meals** that together are **NOT** equal to a full meal.

## What is Abstinence?

Abstinence is **refraining from eating meat** that comes from animals such as chickens, cows, sheep or pigs — all of which live on land. Birds are also considered meat. On the other hand, **fish** are a different category of animal. Salt and freshwater species of fish, amphibians, reptiles, (cold-blooded animals) and shellfish **are permitted**.

## \*Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the **physically** or **mentally ill** including individuals suffering from **chronic illnesses** such as diabetes. Also excluded are **pregnant** or **nursing women**.

# JUBILEE 2025: YEAR OF HOPE (PART III)



#### Profession of Faith

The profession of faith – also known as the 'Symbol' - is a sign of the identity of the baptized person. The profession of faith expresses the central content of the faith: it succinctly captures the main truths that a believer accepts and witnesses to on the day of his or her baptism and shares with the entire Christian community for the rest of his or her life.

There are various professions of

faith which show the richness of the experience of encountering Jesus Christ. Traditionally, however, there are two that have gained special recognition in the Church: the baptismal creed of the church of Rome and the Nicene-Constantinopolitan creed, originally formulated in 325 at the Council of Nicaea, in present-day Turkey, and then refined at the Council of Constantinople in 381.

"If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved," (Romans 10:9-



10). This passage from St. Paul emphasizes how proclaiming the mystery of faith requires a deep conversion not only in one's words, but above all in one's understanding of God, of oneself and of the world. "To say the Creed with faith is to enter into communion with God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and also with the whole Church which transmits the faith to us and in whose midst, we believe" (CCC 197).

#### Indulgences



The Jubilee Indulgence is a concrete manifestation of God's mercy, which goes beyond and transforms the boundaries of human justice. This treasury of grace entered human history in the witness of Jesus and the saints, and by living in communion with them our hope for our own forgiveness is strengthened and becomes a certainty. The Jubilee indulgence allows us to free our hearts from the weight of sin because the reparation due for our sins is given freely and abundantly.

In practical terms, the experience of God's mercy involves some spiritual acts indicated by the Pope. Those who cannot make the Jubilee pilgrimage due to

illness or other circumstances are nonetheless invited to take part in the spiritual movement that accompanies the Jubilee year, offering up the sufferings of their daily lives, and participating in the Eucharistic celebration.

#### Charity

Charity is a principal characteristic of the Christian life. No one can think that pilgrimage and the celebration of the indulgence of the Jubilee can be reduced to a form of magical ritual, without knowing that it is a life of charity that gives them ultimate meaning. Furthermore, charity is the preeminent sign of the Christian faith and its specific form of credibility. In the context of the Jubilee, the apostle Peter's invitation cannot be forgotten: "Above all, let your love for one another be intense, because love covers a multitude of sins" (1 Pet. 4:8).

According to John the evangelist, love toward one's neighbor, which comes not from man but from God, will ensure that true disciples of Christ will be recognized in the future. It is apparent, therefore, that no believer can claim to believe if they do not then love, and conversely, they cannot say they love if they do not believe. Paul the apostle also reiterates that faith and love make up the identity of the Christian; love is what begets perfection (see Col. 3:14), faith what enables love to be such. Charity, therefore, has its special place in the life of faith; moreover, in light of the Holy Year, Christian witness must be reaffirmed as a more expressive form of conversion.



# FROM THE USCCB



USCCB Files Lawsuit on Unlawful Suspension of U.S. Refugee Admissions Program

**Public Affairs** For decades, the USCCB has partnered with the U.S. government and locally based Catholic partners to help nearly a million individuals find safety and build their lives in the United States. The unilateral and unexplained decision of the government to suspend this program will have devastating impacts

on refugees, making it harder for them to establish themselves in their new home.

WASHINGTON - The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) filed a lawsuit on February 18 challenging the government's unlawful suspension of funding for its refugee admissions program. For decades, the USCCB has partnered with the U.S. government and locally based Catholic partners to help nearly a million individuals find safety and build their lives in the United States. The unilateral and unexplained decision of the government to suspend this program will have devastating impacts on refugees, making it harder for them to establish themselves in their new home. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) offered the following statement from its spokesperson, Chieko Noguchi, executive director of public affairs:

"The lawsuit filed yesterday by the USCCB challenges the federal government's suspension of funding for the refugee assistance programs we have run for decades. Throughout this long-time partnership with the U.S. government, the USCCB has helped nearly a million individuals find safety and build their lives in the United States. Refugees are individuals who have undergone special screening and vetting procedures by the U.S. government and are fleeing hardship and persecution in their home countries to resettle in the United States. We are urging the government to uphold its legal and moral obligations to refugees and to restore the necessary funding to ensure that faith-based and community organizations can continue this vital work that reflects our nation's values of compassion, justice, and hospitality."

Under U.S. law, a refugee is defined as one who is forced to flee their home country due to persecution or a well-founded fear of being persecuted on account of their nationality, race, religion, political opinion, or membership in a particular social group. The refugees in the resettlement program must go through an extensive vetting and screening process with the U.S. government before they are approved for arrival on American soil. All of these individuals have legal status to be present in the United States.



## MAINTENANCE WORKER OPENING

Holy Spirit Church has an opening for a Maintenance Worker. This job provides maintenance for the parish/school facilities and grounds and requires some handy man type skills in carpentry, plumbing, and electrical areas. Troubleshoots, repairs, and maintains plumbing, air/conditioner, and mechanical systems. Grounds work includes mowing and pruning with grounds equipment such as zero-turn tractors.

Normal work schedule will be Monday thru Friday with hours up to (8) per day and (40) per work. Number of hours can be based on the applicant's availability. Pay based on applicant's background and experience. Background check required.
