FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

On behalf of our Holy Spirit Parish and School community, I would like to extend my sincere thanks and appreciation to our DRC, Colleen Gomez, and all the teachers and teacher aides that are involved in preparing and educating our Confirmation students.

Lenten Traditional Spiritual Disciplines...

We are now in the fourth week of Lent. Let us take time in reflecting on Penitential practices as one of the traditional spiritual disciplines. Its practice was often identified with mortification, giving up things or pleasures, fasting, abstaining, etc. These practices were traditionally seen as a means of making amends for personal sins. Most spiritual leaders today also see the practice of penance as a means of undoing the harm done to others or by others. Many have seen a connection between penance and social justice.

Penitential practices may be described as Denials and Engagements and Dying and Rising. Denials in the penitential sense is to deny ourselves or to set aside our own desires, pleasures, needs, interests, etc. for a higher purpose. The higher purpose in the season of Lent is to allow those things in our "self" to die – things that hold us down, make us unfree and burdened. Fasting, abstinence, mortification, renunciation, etc. are all examples of denials. Engagement in the penitential sense is to engage ourselves in positive, affirming, life-giving, creative activities that allow us to rise above those things that hold us down, make us unfree and burdened. Positive, affirming, life-giving, and creative activities are examples of engagements.

Denials become meaningful when they are followed by engagements. Denying ourselves a meal becomes more meaningful when we engage ourselves in giving that meal to a starving person; denying ourselves a deserved vacation becomes more meaningful when we engage ourselves in paying the hospital bill of someone who just lost his/her job...., etc.

Penitential practices may also be described as "Dying to Self and Rising to Life." We die to self and rise to life when we give up our own comfort and bring comfort to others; when we bear with being let down or put down and reach out to lift others who are let down or put down; when someone speaks ill of us, when our wishes are crossed, our advice disregarded, our opinion ridiculed and we refuse to let anger rise in our heart, but take it all in patient, loving silence;

when we lovingly and patiently bear any disorder, any irregularity, or any annoyance; when we see our brother/sister prosper and have his/her needs met, and can honestly rejoice with him/her in spirit and feel no envy, nor question God, while our own needs are far greater and are in desperate circumstances; when we can receive correction and reproof from one less in stature than ourselves and can humbly submit, inwardly as well as outwardly, without rebellion or resentment rising within our hearts...and much more!

Fasting and abstinence are two of the most common ways of denials. The monks in the desert, centuries ago, discovered that fasting - simply not eating - caused a tremendous boost to their consciousness. Not only did their bodies go on "alert," but their whole person seemed to be in a more heightened state of attention. The whole purpose of fasting and abstinence was to aid prayer, to make it easier to listen to God more openly, especially in times of need.

Two days in Lent, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are named as days of fast and abstinence for Roman Catholics and we do it together as a community. On other Wednesdays and Fridays of Lent, we must challenge ourselves to try to fast more intentionally. We will experience how powerfully open and alert we feel and how much easier it is to pray and to name our deeper desires. This experience can also be a very simple gesture that places us in greater solidarity with the poor, who often must be content with a little rice and beans each day. Powerful Things happen in us when we think about people in the world who have so much less than we do. And it is a great cure for selfpity.

May your Lenten spirituality be creative, constructive, optimistic, positive, filled with hope and may all your hopes find fulfillment in the risen Christ.






