



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



World day prayer for Grandparents and the Elderly

The Church celebrated the memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus Christ on Saturday. In honor of them, this weekend is dedicated to the world day prayer for grandparents and the elderly. What is the understanding of the Church? The Catholic Church understanding of grandparents and the elderly is deeply rooted in Scripture, Tradition, and the Church's teaching on the dignity of every human person, especially the vulnerable and the wise. Here is a summary of the Catholic perspective:

1. Dignity and Respect for the Elderly

- Human dignity does not diminish with age. The elderly are valued not for what they can produce or do, but for who they are—beloved children of God with irreplaceable value.
- Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 2218): "The fourth commandment reminds grown children of their responsibilities toward their parents... As much as they can, they must give them material and moral support in old age...

2. Grandparents as Faith Witnesses

- Grandparents play a vital spiritual role in families: passing on faith, offering wisdom, and being a living link to the past.
- Pope Francis has often emphasized their importance, calling them "the roots of a people" and encouraging families not to discard them.
- In 2021, Pope Francis instituted the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly (celebrated annually near the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, July 26), to honor their role in the Church and in families.

3. Saints Joachim and Anne

- The parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary are the patron saints of grandparents. Their example shows how the elderly can nurture faith across generations.
- Their feast reminds us of the intergenerational dimension of God's plan.

4. A Culture of Life, Not Discard

- The Church condemns the "throwaway culture" that neglects or isolates the elderly.
- Pope Francis has said: "We are called to oppose the poisonous culture of waste that marginalizes the elderly, considering them a burden."

5. Participation in the Life of the Church

- The elderly are not passive members—they are called to pray, mentor, counsel, and serve in various ministries according to their health and ability.
- Their prayer and suffering offered for the Church is a powerful hidden ministry.

6. Care and Solidarity

- Families and society have a moral obligation to care for the elderly.
- Catholic social teaching emphasizes solidarity, calling communities to ensure dignified healthcare, loving and spiritual
 care for all elderly people.
- In summary, the Catholic Church views grandparents and the elderly as treasured members of both family and Church. Their wisdom, witness, and presence are seen not as burdens, but as blessings and essential to the fabric of Christian life.

"God wants young people to bring joy to the hearts of the elderly, as Mary did to Elizabeth, and gain wisdom from their experiences. Yet, above all, the Lord wants us not to abandon the elderly..." ~ Pope Francis

WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS & ELDERLY

In 2021, Pope Francis established the celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and Elderly on the

fourth Sunday of July, near the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus (July 26). The theme for the 2025 celebration selected by the pope is "Blessed are those who have not lost hope" (cf. Sir 14:2). "These words, taken from the Book of Sirach, express the blessedness of the elderly and highlight the hope placed in the Lord as the path to a Christian and reconciled old age. In this Jubilee Year, the World Day – established by Pope Francis in 2021 – aims to be an opportunity to reflect on how the presence of grandparents and the elderly is a sign of hope in every family and ecclesial community" (Kevin Card. Farrell). The U.S. bishops have approved the transfer of the celebration of World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly in the U.S. to the first weekend after Labor Day (September 6 and 7, 2025) to coincide with National Grandparents (and the Elderly) Day in the United States as many local communities, schools, and parishes have celebrated for some time. In July in the United States, the observance of Natural Family Planning Week takes place beginning on the Sunday before July 25 and ending on the following Saturday.
