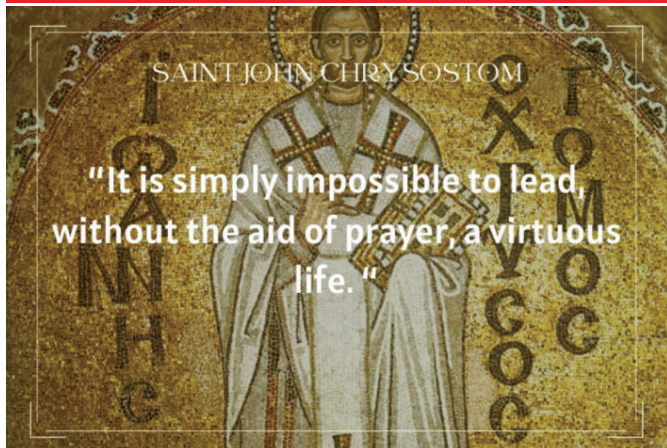

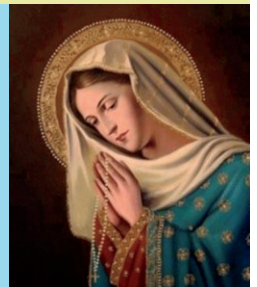

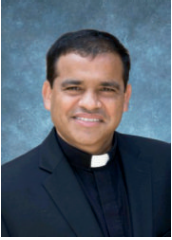

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



"My child, conduct your affairs with humility... Humble yourself the more, the greater you are". Sirach 3:17-18

My Sisters and brothers,

The author of the book of Sirach known as 'Ben Sira' or 'Joshua ben Sirach' reminds us that in God's eyes, true greatness is not measured by power, wealth, or prestige, but by humility. Humility is not weakness—it is truth. It means recognizing that every gift we have comes from God, and that we are utterly dependent on Him.

Sirach teaches that humility opens our hearts to wisdom, while pride blinds us. Verse 20 reminds us: "Seek not what is too difficult for you." In other words, we are not called to control everything, but to trust in God's providence. Pride makes us self-reliant; humility makes us God-reliant.

Finally, verses 28-29 show that humility heals: the proud heart ends in ruin, but the humble person finds peace and understanding. This is why Christ Himself says, "Learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart."

So, the doctrine is clear: humility is the foundation of the Christian life. It allows grace to flow, opens us to wisdom, and keeps us close to Christ. The more God blesses us, the more we are called to bow low in gratitude and service.

Let us ask this question, "Where in my life is God inviting me to practice humility—by trusting Him more deeply, serving others more generously, or letting go of pride?"

HAPPY LABOR DAY!

In 1894 President Grover Cleveland made Labor Day an official holiday so that all Americans could celebrate work and workers. However, Americans had begun celebrating Labor Day starting in the 1880s, during the height of the Industrial Revolution, when immigrants flocked to America to fill the growing number of low-paying jobs in city factories. Many of the immigrants arriving after the Civil War were Roman Catholics from all parts of Europe. The founders of Labor Day themselves were Irish Catholics seeking better working conditions for the millions of American workers—whole families, including children, who worked long hours in dismal, unsafe factories for extremely low wages. Although their jobs were often the worst of the worst, they knew that work was nevertheless a blessing from God and therefore should be honored.

American Catholic workers from the nineteenth to the twentieth century, looking for validity in their jobs and commensurate recognition (mostly in terms of job security and good wages), joined labor unions and other organizations to promote the cause of workers. One such promoter of Catholic work was Dorothy Day, a convert to Catholicism, who in 1933 helped to establish a movement and newspaper, *The Catholic Worker*, to fight for the recognition and the rights of the American worker. There is Biblical and ecclesiastical support for the recognition of the worker, the value of work, and the rights of workers.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

On this Labor Day the Church reminds us that human work is not only a way to provide for our families, but also a sharing in God's own creative power. From the carpenter's shop of Nazareth, Christ shows us that every honest task has dignity and can be offered to God as prayer.

The Church teaches that work is for the person, not the person for work. That is why workers are entitled to just wages, rest, safe conditions, and the ability to care for family. These are not privileges but rights rooted in our God-given dignity. Work is therefore not only a way to seek fulfillment in life but also is required by God to fulfill His benevolent plan for His creation.

Today as we give thanks for the gift of work, we pray also for those who are seeking employment, unemployed, underemployed or exploited, and we ask the Lord to bless all labor with justice, peace, and holiness. Have a safe and restful Labor Day weekend.

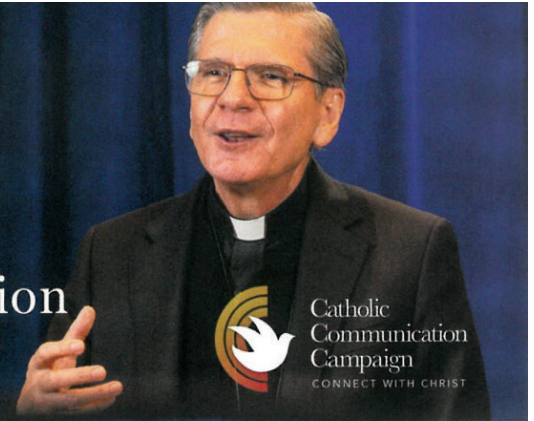

The Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC) presents a unique opportunity to help your neighbors and people across the country connect with Christ. When you contribute to this collection, half of your donation supports the national communications programs of the bishops of the United States, while the other half stays at home in your diocese to support local communications initiatives.

For example, in the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee, the diocesan share of the CCC collection supports a bimonthly diocesan magazine as well as two biweekly podcasts focusing on the power of faith and on the work of the Holy Spirit in the diocese. In the Diocese of Raleigh, funds helped staff to transform the diocesan website and social media channels to provide integrated parish and diocesan news.

CCC helps local dioceses to expand and modernize communications efforts to adapt to technological and demographic changes—like the Diocese of Tucson, which used CCC funds to upgrade its audio and video production capabilities. These upgrades allow the diocese to produce and update its regular offerings of high-quality podcasts and YouTube videos. Visitors to the diocesan website can now access a growing library of podcast and video content in both English and Spanish, including spiritual reflections, insightful interviews, and messages from the bishop.

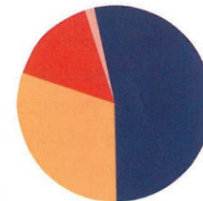

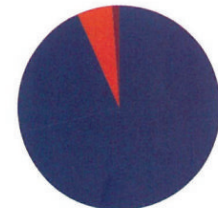
