

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



## THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

Why we pray and offer Masses for the dead, because it is rooted in the Sacred Scripture, Catholic Tradition, and the Teaching of the Church — along with its spiritual meaning for our own lives?

### 1. The Doctrine of the Communion of Saints:

The Church teaches that all the faithful — whether living or deceased — are united in Christ. This is called the Communion of Saints, consisting of:

- The Church Triumphant — the saints in heaven.
- The Church Suffering — the souls in purgatory.

The Church Militant — the faithful on earth.

Because we are all members of one Body in Christ (cf. 1 Corinthians 12:12–27), the prayers and sacrifices of one member can benefit others.

Thus, the living can intercede for the dead who are still being purified.

### 2. The Doctrine of Purgatory:

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 1030–1032) teaches:

**"All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death, they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven."**

Purgatory, therefore, is not a "second chance," but a merciful purification.

Our prayers, indulgences, and especially the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, can help these souls.

### 3. Scriptural Foundations:

#### a. 2 Maccabees 12:43–46

**"It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from their sins."**

This passage, from the Old Testament canon accepted by the Catholic Church, directly teaches that prayers and sacrifices for the dead are beneficial and pleasing to God.

#### b. 2 Timothy 1:16–18

St. Paul prays for his deceased friend Onesiphorus:

**"May the Lord grant him to find mercy from the Lord on that day."**

This shows that early Christians prayed for the departed.

#### c. Matthew 12:32

**"Whoever speaks against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven, either in this age or in the age to come."**

This implies that some sins can be forgiven in the next life — a clear reference to purification after death.



# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

## 4. The Eucharist: The Most Powerful Prayer for the Dead:

The Holy Mass is the supreme act of intercession because it makes present the one perfect sacrifice of Christ on Calvary.

At every Mass, the priest prays:

**“Remember also, Lord, your servants who have gone before us with the sign of faith and rest in the sleep of peace...”**

By offering the Mass for the dead, we unite their souls to the saving merits of Christ's sacrifice, helping them move from purification to eternal glory.

As St. John Chrysostom said:

**“Let us help and commemorate them. If Job's sons were purified by their father's sacrifice, why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation?”**

## 5. The Tradition of the Church:

From the earliest centuries, Christians have prayed for the dead:

- The Catacombs contain inscriptions like “May you have eternal rest” or “Pray for us.”
- St. Augustine prayed daily for his mother, St. Monica, who had said: **“Remember me at the altar of the Lord.”**

The Council of Trent (Session XXV) reaffirmed: **“The souls in purgatory are helped by the prayers of the faithful, especially by the holy sacrifice of the Mass.”**

## 6. Spiritual Meaning for Us:

Praying for the dead teaches us three vital truths:

1. Faith in Eternal Life: Death is not the end but a passage to communion with God.
2. Love in Action: True charity continues beyond death; our prayers express communion that death cannot break.

Hope in Mercy: As we help others by our prayers now, one day others will pray for us — a mutual exchange of grace in the Body of Christ.

## 7. Practical Ways to Pray for the Dead:

- Have Masses offered for deceased loved ones, especially on anniversaries.
- Pray the Rosary or the Office for the Dead.
- Visit cemeteries and pray during the month of November, especially All Souls' Day (Nov. 2).

Gain indulgences for the faithful departed through the Church's prescribed acts (e.g., visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead between November 1–8).

**We pray and offer Masses for the dead because:**

- It is rooted in the Sacred Scripture and in the Catholic Tradition.
- It expresses the Communion of Saints.
- It assists the souls being purified in Purgatory.
- It unites us more deeply with the saving mercy of Christ

# AROUND OUR PARISH

## SACRED SILENCE INSIDE THE CHURCH

To encourage a prayerful space, we ask that sacred silence is observed once inside the church nave.

Silence has a great significance to our liturgy as described in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal: "Sacred silence also, as part of the celebration, is to be observed at the designated times...*Even before the celebration [of Mass] itself, it is commendable that silence to be observed in the church*, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred action in a devout and fitting manner (GIRM 45)."

Even Bishop Erik Pohlmeier, in a letter about the Eucharistic Revival, has spoken about the importance of silence inside the church building: "For this reason, I am asking every parish to begin a more direct preparation for the encounter with Jesus at Mass. *I ask every parish to create a more intentional environment of prayer before Mass begins. The main area of the church, especially around the altar, should preserve silence before Mass. The goal of this silence is not merely a greater quiet. This silence should promote a kind of prayer that turns the heart to God in anticipation.* Enter your parish church with expectation for the gifts that God gives. Bring your joys and sorrows to the altar. Take time before Mass to speak with the Lord in your heart. Pray for your intentions. Surrender your burdens. Open your heart and mind to the Word of God in the Scriptures."


