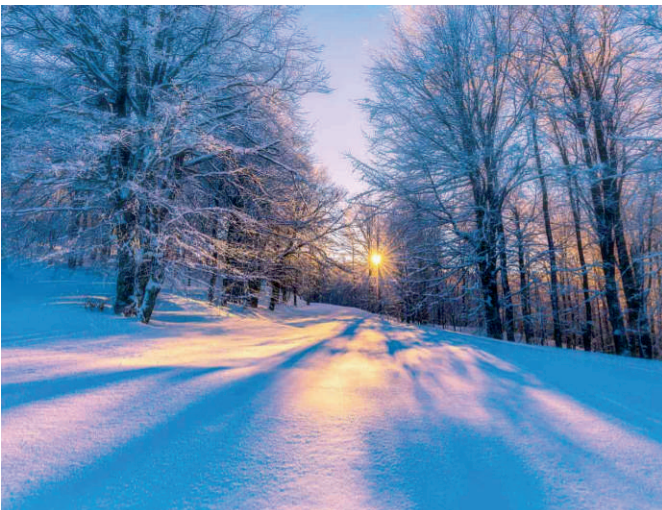

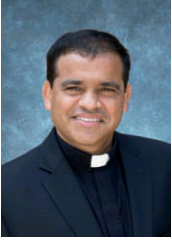

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



ADVENT BEGINS

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

As we begin the season of advent, we are invited to make this season, a time of prayer and a time to verify one's longing for God. As St. Thomas Merton encourages that Advent is a time to prepare for Christ by serving others with love and concern. Here are 10 facts that you may not know about the roots and meanings of Advent.

1. Advent is a time of expectation and preparation for the birth of the Lord.

The word Advent comes from the Latin word *adventus* or coming.

2. Advent has a changing start date.

It starts on the Sunday closest to the feast of St. Andrew the Apostle (November 30th). It can begin as early as November 27th or as late as December 3rd.

3. Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year.

Advent was chosen to begin the year as a representative of the time in history that Christ was not known to us. With his birth, the beginning of our faith was founded. The liturgical year ends with the feast of Christ the King, his reign over the universe.

4. The Advent season has two meanings.

~ Preparation for the historical birth of Jesus in Bethlehem, the Incarnation—God taking flesh to save humanity.

~ Preparation for Christ's return at the end of time, when He will judge the living and the dead and bring the Kingdom to its fullness.

5. Hope is a predominant theme of Advent.

The Israelites hoped for a Messiah to come, and Christ entered the world. We are hopeful for the arrival of Christ again into the world.



6. Advent is a reminder that the Old Testament promises of the coming of the Messiah.

The Advent tradition of the Jesse Tree consists of symbols of the Messiah coming from the line of Jesse (Lk 3: 23-38). Isaiah is often read during this season to remember that we are waiting for the day when the Messiah will come again.

7. Advent focuses on light as opposed to darkness.

Christ enters our dark world and casts away the darkness of sin to redeem us. He will come again as the light of the world.

8. Advent has two parts.

The first portion the First Sunday of Advent until December 16th is preparation for the second coming of Christ.

The second portion from December 17th to 24th directly prepares us for the commemoration of the first coming of Christ, Christmas.

9. The origins of Advent can be traced back to the church in France.

Advent is one of the oldest liturgical seasons of the Church, with roots reaching back to the 4th and 5th centuries, especially in Gaul and Spain, where Christians practiced periods of fasting and preparation before the celebration of Christ's birth.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The church in France used the period before Epiphany as a time of preparation for Baptism. It was called "St. Martin's Lent" for the 40 days that started on November 11th, feast of St. Martin of Tours. By the 6th century, Advent became clearly connected to the coming of Christ, not only in His Nativity but also in His Second Coming in glory. Thus, the Church teaches that Advent is a season of hope, watchfulness, and conversion, echoing the call of John the Baptist: "Prepare the way of the Lord."

10. Advent, as we know it today, was developed in Rome.

Pope Gregory I in the late 6th/early 7th century composed many of the prayers, antiphons, and psalm responses. Many themes and ideas we now know can be traced to the Roman Advent Season.

First Sunday of Advent:

First Sunday of advent reminds us to be watchful, alert, awake and attentive and to be prepared (Mathew 24:37-44), because God would break into our history in his time and not on our schedule. To live without vigilance is an open welcome to disaster, an invitation to trouble! A thief does not send a text message or an email about his visit to our house. He comes unawares. God breaks into our history in His time, not in our time. It is up to us to stay alert, awake, attentive and listening with joyful expectation for His coming whenever that may be.

Our faith today is being tested as we are living in challenging and troublesome times. Let us be vigilant as Jesus calls us to and walk in the light of the Lord as Prophet Isaiah and St. Paul advises us. Let us strive to convert all destructive instruments into creative and life-giving instruments as we prepare ourselves for the coming of the Lord.

1. Alert

We are called to examine our lives, shake off spiritual slumber, and renew our longing for God.

2. Conversion

Advent is a penitential—though not somber—season. Through prayer, charity, and simplicity, we rededicate our lives to Christ.

3. Hope

The first candle of the Advent wreath, often called the "Prophet's Candle," symbolizes hope grounded in God's promises: the Messiah has come, and He will come again.

~ It is the beautiful task of Advent to awaken in all of us memories of goodness and thus to open doors of hope. -- Pope Benedict XVI

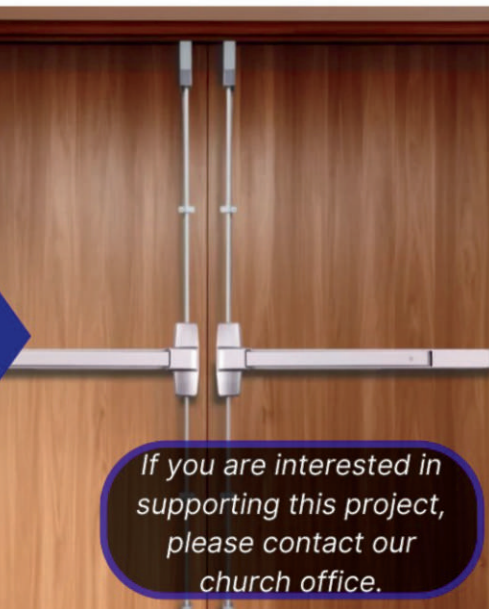
