FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The Solemnity of the Epiphany celebrates a great truth of our Catholic faith: Jesus Christ is revealed as Savior not only of Israel, but of all nations. The word Epiphany means manifestation. Today, God makes His Son known to the whole world.

In the first reading from Isaiah, we hear: “Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come.” Isaiah foretells a time when God’s light will shine so brightly that nations will walk by it and kings will be drawn to its radiance. Gold and frankincense are gifts that will later appear at the feet of the Christ Child. This prophecy is fulfilled in the Gospel when the Magi arrive from the East, guided by a star, seeking the newborn King.

In Matthew’s Gospel, the Magi represent the Gentile world—people outside the covenant of Israel—who are nevertheless drawn by God’s grace. They search sincerely, travel far, and persevere despite obstacles. When they finally find Jesus, they do not merely observe Him; they kneel and worship. Their gifts are deeply theological:

**Gold proclaims Jesus as King,
Frankincense acknowledges Him as God,
Myrrh points to His saving death for our sins.**

Here, the Church teaches us that from the beginning, Christ’s mission is universal. Salvation is offered to all who seek Him with a sincere heart.

Life Lesson:

The Epiphany challenges us to ask: Are we truly seeking Christ, and are we revealing Him to others? Like the Magi, we are called to follow God’s light—even when the journey is difficult or unfamiliar. The star today is the Word of God, the teachings of the Church, and the promptings of the Holy Spirit.

We are also called to be light for others. Through our faith, charity, and witness, Christ should be made visible in our families, workplaces, and communities. Finally, like the Magi, we must offer our own gifts to Jesus—our time, obedience, humility, and love—and then return home “by another way,” meaning a life transformed by an encounter with Christ.

As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany, try to see it as a historical event in which you are invited to share. God wants to manifest Himself to you today. When this happens, you must respond with faith and worship, giving God the greatest glory by giving Him your very life and offering Him your spiritual gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. May this Solemnity of the Epiphany renew our mission to seek Christ faithfully and to make Him known to the whole world.

~ “For by gold the power of a king is signified, by frankincense the honor of God, by myrrh the burial of the body; and accordingly, they offer Him gold as King, frankincense as God, myrrh as Man”. — St John Chrysostom

Epiphany Home Blessing

There is a catholic traditional home blessing related to the Solemnity of the Epiphany. Here are some quick tips that you can follow to bless your homes. At the end of each mass on Epiphany Sunday liturgy, I will Bless the Chalks. Families are invited to take one piece of Chalk and use it to write on the doors of your house, preferably on the top. Say this Prayer when you write down. The father of the family or anyone who is head of the family takes the blessed chalk, the father or anyone in the



family reads the corresponding words as the kings inscribe their initials onto the lintel. (The initials CMB also stand for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat": "May Christ Bless This House".) Final inscription on lintel should read: 2 0 + C + M + B + 2 6

House blessing Prayer:

Leader: Let us pray. O Lord, Almighty God, bless this house + that it may become a shelter of health, chastity, self-conquest, humility, goodness, mildness, obedience to the commandments, and thanksgiving to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Upon this house and those who dwell herein may Your blessing remain forever, through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The three wise men, Caspar, [Caspar inscribes 'C' on lintel] C

Melchior, [Melchior inscribes 'M'] M

and Balthasar [Balthasar inscribes 'B'] B

followed the star of God's Son who became man two thousand [inscribe the '2 0' on left] 2 0

twenty-six years ago. [inscribe 2 6' on right] 2 6

May Christ bless our dwelling, [place + after '2 0'] +

and remain with us throughout the new year, [+ after 'C'] +

and grant that our comings and goings [+ after 'M'] +

will be in search of truth. [+ after 'B'] +

Each ministry will have a booth where you can learn more about what they do, meet the people involved, ask questions, and sign up to get involved, whether it's children's ministry, music, hospitality, outreach, tech/media, prayer teams, and more!

There's something for everyone, no matter your age, background, or schedule. Come explore how you can be part of what God is doing in our church and community.

List of Ministries

Adoration—Adoration centers on the belief that Jesus is truly present in the consecrated host, the Eucharist. Participants engage in silent contemplation, personal prayer, reading scripture, or praying the Rosary to deepen their relationship with Christ and grow spiritually.

Altar Servers—Lay assistants who perform various liturgical duties during Mass and other services, supporting the priest and deacon. These servers help to communicate the sacred mystery of the liturgy through their reverent conduct, precise movements, and appropriate attire, fostering a deeper connection to the faith for both themselves and the congregation.

Altar Society Cleaning Ministry—This Ministry exists to enhance worship at Holy Spirit Catholic Church by providing a welcoming and organized worship space, maintaining a clean altar and sanctuary areas. Each member generously volunteers 1 hour a month on a Saturday morning of their choosing from 8 AM to 9 AM for light duty housekeeping tasks thereby providing a clean altar area and church for the beginning of the weekend mass celebrations.

Angels of Mercy / Holy Spirit Angels—We are a group of men and women who provide, at no cost, rides for our parishioners, who have no transportation, to doctors, pharmacies, lab work and grocery stores.



AROUND OUR PARISH

Another Chance Fellowship Group for Cancer Survivors—Brings together an informal small group of those living with the diagnosis of cancer for encouragement, support, prayers, make new friends and to share in your cancer journey. You are a cancer survivor from the moment of diagnosis to the end of life after a long survivorship. You may not feel the need to share your experience but can offer support to those that do. (There may be helpful hints and suggestions on handling side effects that worked for you). Not only is it a support group for those with cancer but a prayer group where we ask St. Peregrine, patron Saint of cancer patients, to offer our petitions to God for healing-- emotional, physical, and spiritual.

Bible Study—Weekly Bible Study of the weekend's readings every Sunday morning, reflecting on the Word of God and learning new academic facts about Scripture too which helps us deepen our faith

Choir—Music ministry responsible for playing and singing at Masses enhancing our community's worship

Coffee & Donuts Ministry—The mission of the donut ministry is to "gather members of the Holy Spirit community to promote friendship and fellowship in Christ." Volunteers can support the ministry in a variety of ways: purchase and provide donuts, set up and clean up, or monetary donation.

Garden Ministry Donna—Assist with care and beautification of Parish grounds

Healing Prayer Ministry—We offer personal prayer appointments where two prayer ministers will pray with one recipient to experience the presence and Love of God. These appointments are confidential and may last anywhere from 30 – 90 minutes. God will lead us through the appointment for physical and emotional healing.

Homebound Ministry—Responsible for bringing communion only those who are homebound or sick

Hope & Consolation—Our goal is to provide much needed support at a time when our families need assistance the most, during the death of their loved one. This ministry is accentual within our Parish. We serve with unconditional love and generosity. We assist in providing the best possible experience for those who have lost a loved one, through the generosity of members in preparing and serving food after the Mass or the burial.

Hospitality—Our primary mission is to welcome new parishioners two or three times per year by inviting them to a Saturday evening social after Mass. We mingle with our new members during the meal, then introduce Ministry Leaders and have them explain what their Ministry does.

Knights of Columbus—The Knights of Columbus is the world's largest Catholic fraternal service organization, founded in 1882 by Father Michael J. McGivney to provide financial protection for families and engage in works of charity. It is an organization of Catholic men committed to their faith, family, community, and country, guided by the principles of Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism

Legion of Mary—The primary work of the Legion of Mary has been door-to-door evangelization. The family visits involve the sharing of concerns, good fellowship and prayer. Various literature is provided to include holy medals and rosaries. Time is spent explaining these items so that a proper understanding of the literature or holy medal is understood.

AROUND OUR PARISH

Light of Jesus Family—We hold a monthly prayer gathering every second Sunday at Holy Spirit Catholic Church in Jacksonville, Florida. LOJF is a community that celebrates faith, friendship, and family. Our mission is to provide life-changing spiritual nourishment to those seeking growth and transformation in their walk with God. Each gathering features inspiring video talks by our co-founder and preacher, Brother Bo Sanchez. Through his teachings, God's Word and encouragement reach the hearts of all who join us.

Men's Club—Men in Action Helping Others. That's the moto of the Men's Club which describes exactly what we do. We are a non-fraternal group of men in good standing with the Catholic Church that come together to provide good fellowship, good food and assist the parish and the school with financial assistance and whatever needs to be done with projects.

Parish Nurse and Health Ministry—we are a faith based ministry that has a focus on the health and physical needs of people within our parish.

Prayer Blanket Ministry—our ministry provides prayer blankets which get distributed to the sick and needy. Our blankets are blessed and are available at the church office or in the FLC

Quilts for Vets—Quilts for Vets Ministry is comprised of a group of ladies who enjoy making patriotic quilts to honor and thank our military men and women. We encompass skilled and beginner quilters. We host a yearly Veterans' Day Luncheon during which we gift the quilts we have worked on during the year to Veterans via a lottery process. We work independently on our quilts and meet once a month to spend some time in fellowship, show each other our ongoing work and also cooperate on certain yearly fundraising projects. We have also offered quilting classes.

Rosary Ministry—The rosary is prayed 30 minutes before the Saturday and Sunday Masses. This helps us grow in our devotion to Mary and grow closer to Christ through her intercession.

Scouts—Discovery is at the heart of Scouting. Whether it's a campout, derby car race, or hike on the trail, we believe every adventure helps us uncover a little more about ourselves. We build the foundations for humility and compassion—strengthening character through actions—to prepare youth for a lifetime of leadership.

Youth Ministry—The mission of our parish youth ministry is to lead teens closer to Christ. Our core team of leaders is willing and trained to meet the teens where they are, develop healthy relationships, and walk with them as they grow closer to Christ. This is accomplished through activities, teachings, small group sharing and prayer time. The Core Team presents topics rooted in the catechism and Scripture exploring the sacraments, vocation, mental health, the Creed, Saints, friendships, social justice, the Ten Commandments and much more - presented in ways relevant for teenagers growing in faith.

Society of Divine—we are responsible for praying the Divine Mercy Chapelt at 3pm in the chapel during the weekdays and on Good Friday, increasing our devotion to the Divine Mercy of Christ

St. Paul Street Evangelization—public ministry that helps educate people about our faith along with building relationships

St. Vincent de Paul Society—A network of friends, inspired by Gospel values, growing in Holiness and building a more just world through personal relationships with and service to people in need. The purpose of the Society is Spiritual growth of its members serve those in need and bring them closer to God. This is done by person to person encounters assisting with food, services and assisted income if necessary.

Wine & Cheese—a social ministry that hosts our Wine & Cheese Social on the first Saturday of every month after the evening Mass encouraging fellowship

Holy Spirit Religious Education (CCD, VBS, Family Faith Formation, Sacramental Prep)—This ministry helps guide children to a closer relationship with God and a deeper understanding of the teachings of the Church. Students are prepared for the sacraments of Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation. Retreats are held to gather CCD and Holy Spirit School students for final preparations for the sacraments. Vacation Bible School is held during the summer to keep the students connected to their faith and have a little fun in the process.

Extraordinary Ministers Of Holy Communion—Assists in the distribution of the Eucharist (the consecrated bread and wine) during Mass and also take the Eucharist to those who are sick or homebound. The key duties of a Eucharistic Minister include - Distributing the Body and Blood of Christ at Mass by helping the priest and deacon distribute Holy Communion to the congregation during Mass. They also assist with the Sick and Homebound by taking the Eucharist to those who are unable to attend Mass due to illness, or other reasons.
