ROSARY SCHEDULE UPDATE FOR WEEKEND MASSES

By Father's request, our parish has recently begun praying two special forms of the rosary: the Patriotic Rosary and the Angelic Rosary (Chaplet of St. Michael the Archangel).

Because these devotions are longer than the traditional rosary, we will now begin reciting them 40 minutes before the start of each weekend Mass.

Monthly Schedule:

- Patriotic Rosary Recited on the first weekend of every month. If a national holiday falls near the first weekend (such as Presidents' Day, Memorial Day, etc.), the Patriotic Rosary will be prayed on the weekend before that holiday.
- Angelic Rosary (Chaplet of St. Michael the Archangel) Recited on the second weekend of each month.

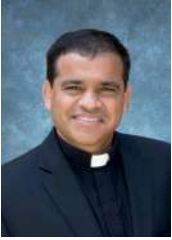

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We begin the cycle of ordinary Sundays of the year - a time when the Church once again focuses our attention on the reality of God's kingdom present among us in the life and ministry of Jesus.

In the gospel passage we read that St. John the Baptist identifying Jesus as "God's Chosen One," the servant spoken about by the prophet Isaiah. He is the One who is "a light to the nations" so that the salvation planned by our God may reach the ends of the earth.

As we know that through our baptism, you and I have been incorporated into God's saving plan. As St. Paul tells us, we are "called to be a holy people, consecrated in Christ Jesus." We are members of his Church and therefore part of Jesus' continuing presence in the world. We share in his prophetic mission to be "a light to the nations," announcing the good news of salvation to the ends of the earth.

It's very easy to forget that you and I have an obligation to be light to the nations, even though most of us have little contact with "the ends of the earth." We must remind ourselves frequently that we are essential parts of the body of Christ. While we may not be able to reach very far physically, we can give strength to those who do. The power of our prayer for those who minister in the Missions and for God's people is invaluable. How often our Missionaries of Saint Francis de Sales who minister in 34 Countries have thanked us for your prayers and support, which give them the strength they need to carry on their Missionary work for the Mother Church.



Today might be a good time to renew our efforts of prayer on their behalf and all the missionaries around the world. We might even take a few minutes at every given opportunity to remember and offer our prayers for them. As we ready to celebrate the feast of Saint Francis de Sales on January 24th, we might offer a day of prayer for our 'Fransalian Missionaries' who serve far from home, our Fransalian Associates and all those who are part of our family. In this way, we can stir up in our own hearts a sense of connection with the Mission of the Church and, in the process, assist others in coming to know Jesus as God's Chosen One.

On a lighter note, Our Parish 'Ministry Fair' is happening this weekend after all the masses at the 'Family Life Center'. Everyone one is invited to participate and see what you can do to enhance our parish life and ministry. Your participation is very much appreciated to fulfill the Missionary Mandate that we are called to be the 'Intentional Disciples' and are encouraged go out to bring people around the 'Eucharistic Table of the Lord'.
