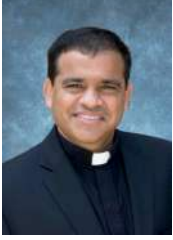

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Palm Sunday

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We enter the Holy Week through Palm Sunday or Passion Sunday wherein the Church invites us not only to rejoice in Christ's triumphal entry Jerusalem, but also to walk with Him into His passion and death. In Matthew 26:14–66, we witness betrayal, abandonment, injustice, and suffering. At the center of it all stands Jesus Christ—calm, obedient, and faithful to the Father.

First, this Gospel reveals the reality of sin and human weakness. Judas betrays Jesus, the disciples fall asleep, Peter denies Him, and the leaders condemn Him unjustly. This shows us that suffering is often connected to sin, either our own or that of others. Yet Jesus does not respond with hatred or revenge. Instead, He chooses love and obedience.

Second, we see the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. Jesus gives us His Body and Blood, saying, "This is my body... this is my blood of the covenant." Here we learn a central Catholic truth: the Eucharist is not a symbol, but the real gift of Christ Himself. Even as betrayal is unfolding, Jesus gives Himself completely. This shows us that God's love is always greater than our sin.

Third, Jesus teaches us how to face our own suffering. In the Garden of Gethsemane, He experiences fear and anguish. This reminds us that feeling pain, anxiety, or sorrow is not a sin. But Jesus also prays. He turns to the Father. So must we. Prayer gives strength, clarity, and trust in God even in dark moments.

Fourth, we learn about faithfulness under trial. Jesus is falsely accused before the council, mocked, and struck, yet He remains silent and steadfast. In our lives, we too may face misunderstanding, rejection, or hardship. This Gospel calls us to remain faithful to truth and to God, even when it is difficult.

Finally, this passage invites us to examine our own hearts. Are we like Judas, choosing selfish gain? Like Peter, weak in courage? Or are we striving to be like Christ—trusting, obedient, and loving even in suffering?

When we experience suffering—whether physical pain, emotional struggle, or injustice—we are invited not to despair but to unite it with Christ. Offer it in prayer. Trust that God can bring good even from pain. As Catholics, we believe that no suffering is wasted when it is joined to the Cross of Christ.

Palm Sunday reminds us that the road to resurrection passes through the Cross of Mount Calvary. By walking with Jesus in His suffering, we learn that love is stronger than sin, and hope is stronger than despair. Let us enter this Holy Week with humility, gratitude, and deeper love for Christ, who gave everything for our salvation.

HOLY WEEK

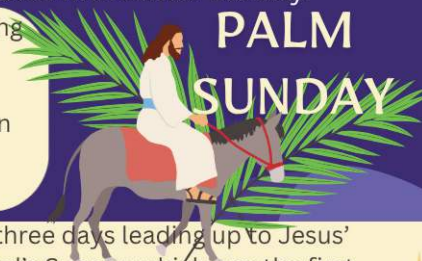

The season of Lent gives way to the celebration of Easter in Holy Week, the most sacred period of the liturgical calendar. Holy Week includes both the Church's most solemn observances and joyous feasts. Unique, beautiful liturgies fill the period of time that begins on Palm Sunday and culminates with Easter Sunday.

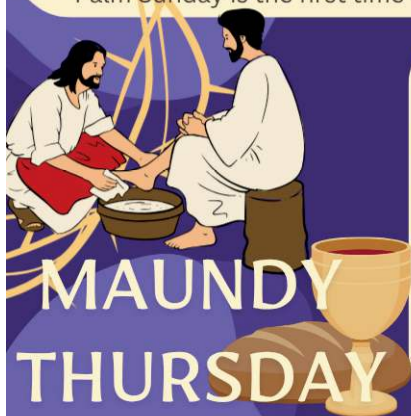
Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday, a distinct liturgy that begins with a Gospel reading of Jesus's journey to Jerusalem at the entrance of the worship space.

Those attending the service receive palms, a reminder of Scripture telling us that people welcomed Jesus by laying down their cloaks and waving palm branches (John 12:13).

Palm Sunday is the first time we hear the Lord's Passion in the liturgical calendar.



PALM SUNDAY



MAUNDY THURSDAY

Holy Thursday begins the Easter Triduum—the three days leading up to Jesus' Resurrection. Its formal name is Mass of the Lord's Supper, which was the first celebration of the Eucharist. Other branches of Christianity refer to this day as Maundy Thursday. This liturgy includes the reception of the Holy Oils, in which the Oil of the Sick, the Oil of Catechumens, and the Holy Chrism are processed through the church, to be used for the rest of the year. These oils are all blessed by the local bishop shortly before the liturgy. Also notable at the Holy Thursday service is the washing of the feet, in which the priest washes the feet of 12 parishioners. Jesus did this to demonstrate to his disciples how they are to serve others through selfless love. At the end of Mass, consecrated hosts remain on the altar while everything else is stripped away. As incense fills the church, the priest, donning a special garb called a humeral veil, takes the Blessed Sacrament and processes out of the church to a chapel or other area for adoration.

Good Friday of the Lord's Passion, commonly known as Good Friday, is the only day in the entire year in which no Mass is celebrated. It's a solemn day that calls for fasting and abstinence.

Stations of the Cross are popular on Good Friday. The main service on Good Friday features no procession. The Passion is read and the Eucharist (consecrated on Thursday) is distributed. Veneration of the Cross and solemn intercessions—a set of shared prayer intentions offered universally on this day—are other unique elements to the Good Friday service.



GOOD FRIDAY

HOLY SATURDAY

The Mass on Holy Saturday is the Easter Vigil, though its full reference on the USCCB schedule of daily reading is "Easter Sunday The Resurrection of the Lord Holy Saturday At the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night of Easter." This is the most unique and perhaps most important liturgy of the year. The Easter Vigil ends the Triduum and begins Easter celebrations.

The service can only begin once the sun has set. Outside the church, a fire lights the Paschal candle, and the flame is shared throughout the church to individual handheld candles. The Liturgy of the Word, which normally includes nine readings, begins in darkness. The readings demonstrate the connection between the Old and New Testaments and how Jesus fulfilled Scripture and achieved salvation for all humanity. The Liturgy of Baptism, which follows the Gospel and homily, marks the culmination of the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) program. Catechumens, who have been preparing to enter the Church, are baptized, confirmed, and later receive their first Holy Communion. The Easter Vigil is a joyous, celebratory liturgy, filled with rich songs.

EASTER SUNDAY

Compared to other Holy Week services, Easter Sunday Masses are most similar to those that occur during Ordinary Time. The festive atmosphere continues from the Easter Vigil, with the worship space decorated with beautiful flowers, especially white lilies.

Of course, many parishioners wear special outfits to celebrate the day. Easter, the biggest feast that the Church has, is also among the most well-attended services of the year.

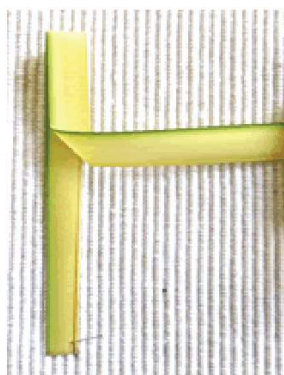
MAKE PALM CROSSES

Everyone always wants to know how to make palm crosses. Here is a simple way—a little tricky, perhaps, but once you've mastered it, it will be easy to do. Enjoy!

Most palm fronds are actually double; split the frond into two long separate strips. Remove any stringy bits.



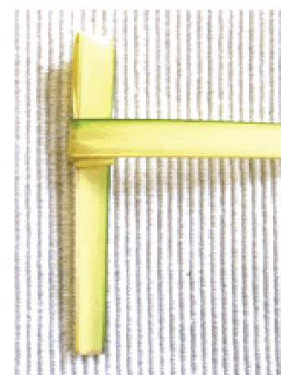
1. Hold palm pointing up; about 5-6 inches from the bottom, fold top over keeping the long part toward you.



2. About 1½-inches from the top, fold long end on the diagonal to the right, making a right angle.



3. Wrap the long end around the upright 2½ times; this is important!



4. Flip it over.



5. Make an arm about 1½–2-inches, folding the long end toward you.



6. Make second arm, folding on the left.



7. Make a diagonal fold so the long end points up.



8. Slip the point of the long end behind the center loops.



9. Loop the long end a 2nd time behind the center loops; pull taut to secure the cross. The top piece may be adjusted by pulling on the base.
