## June 24: Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist

This solemnity is one of the only saints' birthdays observed in the Christian liturgical calendar, positioned exactly six months before Christmas to align with the summer solstice. The date is tied to the Gospel of Luke, which notes that John was six months older than Jesus. The Church established his birth at the summer solstice and Jesus's birth at the winter solstice. John is highly venerated as the Forerunner, the final prophet of the Old Testament, and the bridge to the New Testament who prepared the way for Jesus Christ and baptized him.

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

## RECLAIMING FATHERHOOD



The altercation took place outside after Mass one bright Sunday morning just before Christmas. “These are my people,” insisted one young priest. “No, they’re mine!” retorted the other, light-heartedly, but in earnest.

### Guarding Their “Territory”:

One was the assistant pastor of the parish, ordained less than two years. The other was the chaplain of a nearby Catholic high school where many in the town sent their children. He was also vocations director of the diocese and keenly interested in uncovering the priestly vocations God was calling to serve these Catholics in the coming decades. Thus, both had a claim on being shepherds to this particular parish, whose pastor had departed for a short respite before the demands of the holidays intensified.

Being fond of both, people enjoyed the exchange, but there was a deeper meaning, which only became evident upon reflection later in the day. What were they fighting over? To what reality were they laying claim in view of “whose people” these were? It was none other than the loving concern of a “father,” which both men felt strongly as more than just an age-old title or word mumbled by generations of parochial school children. By the very reality of their ordinations to the priesthood, these two men — young as they were — sincerely embraced a spiritual fatherhood that indicated a call to protect and provide for a given “family” in a territorial way.

### The Essential Vocation of Fathers:

St. Pope John Paul II wrote about fatherhood early in his pontificate. Looking at the vocation of each father as being of “unique and irreplaceable importance,” he warned that, “[a]s experience teaches, the absence of a father causes psychological and moral imbalance and notable difficulties in family relationships” (*Familiaris Consortio*, 25). Or, in the simple words of the woman being profiled, “It’s not easy for a single woman to take care of children alone. It’s very hard.”

To extrapolate this one story on families, we can look at the staggering statistics on divorce, child abandonment, and poverty. To consider the spiritual dimension, we would look at the hardships of the faithful who have suffered from priests who have strayed — from their own moral integrity, from diligence to their responsibilities to form and protect their parish families, or from the demands of Holy Orders completely — leaving their brides, the local parish communities in myriad places, to a life that is “very hard.”

St. Joseph: A Reflection of the Fatherhood of God:

Today, St. Joseph is more necessary than ever. In fact, he appears to Gaspard as an “imposing figure,” symbolizing the omnipotence of God the Father. This is precisely his mission: to reflect the fatherhood of God.

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

St. Joseph was an excellent father because he always tried to resemble God the Father, living an intimate union with his Will. It is this turning to the Father and His will which saves man. When we turn away from the Father, then we falter. As Our Lord did His Father's will so must we follow such an example.



St. Joseph expected everything of God and asked everything of Him, promptly obeyed Him, without investigating the designs that God had for him. Furthermore, St. Joseph was an excellent father because he was in close, indeed very close, contact with the Son, Jesus, who allowed him to exercise his paternity, giving him all the love he was capable of, teaching him to walk, to work, indulging Him in his Will to humble himself. This Great Saint, therefore, wants to tell us that if we really want to be authentic fathers we must let ourselves be taught by God Himself, hoping and trusting in Him alone.

Let us pray for fathers everywhere. We can thank the fathers of families and faithful priests who have worked quietly and diligently for the good of their flocks. We can speak out when fatherhood is disparaged or mocked. We can forgive those who have not responded to God's graces and still encourage them to fulfill their "irreplaceable" responsibilities. We can celebrate the Fatherhood of God from Whom all fathers take their name. We can honor their legitimate authority through cheerful obedience and loving support.

As families and parish communities struggle, we must recognize that there is a dark force working to marginalize the very protection that would shield souls from it. Men struggle to meet their commitments but need supernatural help — as does everyone. Prayer and sacrifice for the vocation of fatherhood would be an excellent intention for every season, and one that would give back to the entire Body of Christ in immeasurable ways. Let's do it together - for the family. **HAPPY FATHER'S DAY!**

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

## Updates on FLC usage from Fr. John Peter

Father John Peter has updated our guideline uses of the Family Life Center. Father has enforced that all non-sacramental related events are not permitted in the FLC as seen in **Guideline #6** along with an emphasis on stewardship as being part of the community.

Anyone who has already planned an event before this update is not affected by these guidelines. Please see the updated Guidelines below.

### GUIDELINES FOR USE OF THE FAMILY LIFE CENTER

- 1) The following guidelines have been put in place to assist in planning all events to ensure our Family Life Center serves the needs of our parish and remains in good condition for our faith community. Please contact the office if in need of further help.
- 2) All parish ministries use of the FLC must be scheduled in advance with the church office. In case of a conflicting date, the first request will be honored.
- 3) Request forms are available in the office and must be submitted/approved for each event except for recurring ministry/parish board meetings. These only require an initial request.
- 4) The church office will assign the event space in the FLC to ensure the most efficient use.
- 5) First scheduling priority: Parish functions as well as ministry meetings and events. This includes but is not limited to ministry and committee meetings, faith formation, youth ministry events, parish family nights, and funeral, wedding, or baptism receptions, for funerals, weddings, or baptisms held at Holy Spirit Catholic Church.
- 6) Second scheduling priority: Sacramental celebrations and receptions (such as Baptisms and Weddings) for **active registered parishioners that consistently support the parish with their time, talent, and financial support, and family members of a registered parishioner living in the same household and/or dependent on the parishioner for support.**
- 7) The Pastor will have final approval of all requests.
- 8) Events will be required to pay for certain fees, such as a damage deposit, usage/utilities fee and diocesan liability insurance. Details of all charges will be reviewed for each event by the church office.
- 9) No events/celebrations are permitted during Mass times.

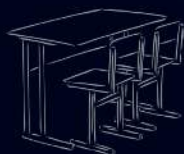

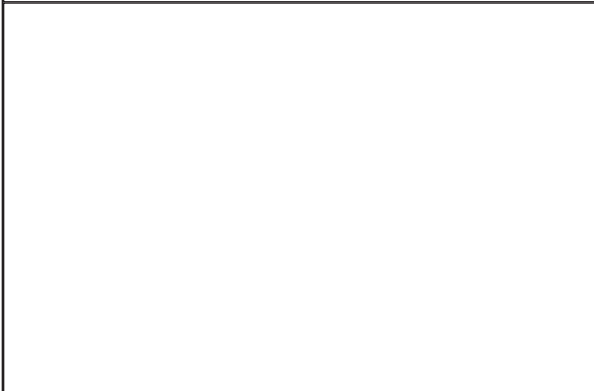
