

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

ORIGIN OF DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY THE DIVINE MERCY IMAGE, THE CHAPLET, AND THE NOVENA



Saint Faustina: Mankind's need for the message of Divine Mercy took on dire urgency in the 20th Century, when civilization began to experience an "eclipse of the sense of God" and, therefore to lose the understanding of the sanctity and inherent dignity of human life. In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary.

St. John Paul II explains: This was precisely the time when those ideologies of evil, nazism and communism, were taking shape. Sister Faustina became the herald of the one message capable of off-setting the evil of those ideologies, that fact that God is mercy—the truth of the merciful Christ. And for this reason, when I was called to the See of Peter, I felt impelled to pass on those experiences of a fellow Pole that deserve a place in the treasury of the universal Church. ~ Pope Saint John Paul II, Memory and Identity (2005)

Divine Mercy Sunday: St. Faustina's Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) be observed, for example:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. ... Let no soul fear to draw near to Me.

... It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy. (Diary, no. 699)

On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

The Image: Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, no. 48) and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls" (Diary, no. 742).

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy: The Chaplet was also given to St. Faustina with this promise: "Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you" (Diary, no. 1541). "Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. ... Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy. I desire that the whole world know My infinite mercy" (Diary, no. 687).

The Divine Mercy Novena: Jesus gave St. Faustina nine intentions for which to pray the Chaplet beginning on Good Friday and ending on the Saturday before Divine Mercy Sunday.

From our Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

I express my sincere thanks to everyone who has been worshipping with us through Facebook: *aHolySpiritJax.* and Website <u>https://www.holyspiritchurchjax.org</u>!



While it is not the same as worshipping together physically, we are able to connect virtually and celebrate God's word and grace. Please continue to pray for an end to this virus and for each other so we may once again celebrate the sacraments together. I look forward to worshipping with you!

In the wake of Jesus' crucifixion and death, the apostles were locked away together in fear. They were afraid that they might suffer the same fate as their teacher.

Despite their anxious seclusion, Jesus breaks into their lives: not merely into the physical space in which they were taking refuge; Jesus also breaks into the core of their minds and hearts. Jesus attempts to calm their fears; he challenges them to be at peace; he does this in a rather confrontational and mysterious manner: by showing them the wounds in his hands and side.

The experience of resurrection did not remove the scars of Jesus' woundedness, the lasting marks of pain, disappointment, misunderstanding, rejection, humiliation, abandonment, suffering and death. Notwithstanding these wounds, however, Christ's resurrection powerfully demonstrated that pain, sadness, suffering and injustice did not, ultimately, enjoy the last word. While suffering is clearly a part of life, there is much more to life than suffering.

St. Francis de Sales wrote: "We must often recall that our Lord has saved us by his suffering and endurance, and that we must work out our salvation by sufferings and afflictions, enduring with all possible forbearance the injuries, denials and discomforts we meet." (Introduction to the Devout Life, Part III, Chapter 3)

All of us bear the wounds of failure, deception, betrayal, disappointment and loss. Our hearts, our minds, our memories - our souls - bear the scars to prove it. Like the apostles, we, too, are tempted to withdraw from others, to lock ourselves away in some secluded emotional or spiritual corner, living in fear of what other pain or disappointments may come our way. Of course, in withdrawing from life, we figuratively - in some cases, even literally - die.

Jesus clearly demonstrates in his own life that our wounds do not necessarily need to overwhelm or disable us. While these wounds may be permanent, they need not rob us of the power and promise of recovery, of renewal - of resurrection - unless we despair, unless we allow ourselves to be defeated by the nails of negativity.

It is a healing love that many people in the midst of this global pandemic need right now. That's why it's important to remember the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of the Divine Mercy.

By practicing the devotions attached to that feast day, we can allow God's merciful love to flow through us and into the world. In the words of Pope John Paul II, who established Divine Mercy Sunday: "Do not abandon yourselves to despair. We are the Easter people and hallelujah is our song."

The wounds of our past continue to leave their mark in our present: they don't necessarily determine the course of our future. Turn to the love of Jesus who knows what it means to be wounded and who shows us how to move through and beyond them. St. Francis de Sales wrote: "Look often on Christ, crucified, naked, blasphemed, slandered, forsaken, and overwhelmed by every kind of weariness, sadness, sorrow and labor." Jesus triumphed over the wounds of his humanity: so, too, with God's help, can we.

To be sure, life can be tough. As was in the case as Jesus, however, we, too, can be tougher.


PART-TIME MUSIC TEACHER NEEDED

COVID -19 TIPS



<u>Serving Others</u> <u>while Social</u> <u>Distancing</u>

- Coach, mentor or tutor using phone or video technology
- Write encouraging notes to neighbors and put in their mailboxes (only your first name and no address). Don't forget the mailman!
- Write notes of appreciation and encouragement to senior citizens in nursing homes, military, healthcare workers and other essential workers that cannot stay home during this time (only include first name and no address).
- Call or email elderly parishioners or those with poor health to check on them and see how they are doing. You can spend time talking to them, praying with them or finding a way to provide comfort. Parents may have an old church directory around. Any needs for a priest or church services can be communicated to the church office.
- See if your local senior center has a senior pen pals
 or buddies program and sign up. You can write letters to your new "grand-friend".
- Clean up or do yard work around the church grounds, a neighbor's yard, your own community or park keeping a safe distance from people. Use gloves, trash bags and grabber pole (dollar tree has them for \$1).
- If you have sewing skills, make facial masks for healthcare workers, and have an adult deliver them to a local hospital or clinic.
- If you have a musical or other talent, record a video and send it or post, with parent permission, to cheer people up and bring happiness to others.
- Raise funds or collect canned goods and donate to our church for the St. Vincent de Paul food pantry.
- Research how to lead a Rosary then coordinate a virtual prayer group and lead a Rosary by phone or video.
- Make rosaries and give them to others while practicing social distancing.
- Research what small businesses are open for business in your community and notify others in your community encouraging them to support local businesses near you.
- Cook a meal for a friend, family member or neighbor who can't or doesn't cook.

An important reminder to be particularly vigilant and protective with your personal information and financial resources during this difficult time.

Nothing brings out the scam-



mers like "free money," and the recent decision on Economic Impact Payments (or "Stimulus Checks") being sent out by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) as tax credit under The "Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act" or the "CARES Act" has scammers already coming up with schemes to defraud taxpayers and small businesses of their money and important personal identification data. Specifically, identity thieves are using confusion over the stimulus checks and associated bank loans. They are also appealing to faith groups and individuals offering special aid for churches that are scams and Catholics are prime targets.

When it comes to the IRS and taxes, remember that **the IRS** will never:

- Call to demand immediate payment over the phone, nor will the agency call about taxes owed without first having mailed you a bill.
- Threaten to immediately bring in local police or other lawenforcement groups to have you arrested.
- Demand that you pay taxes without allowing you to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.
- Require you to use a specific payment method for your taxes, such as a prepaid debit card, gift card, or wire transfer.

• Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone. If you should be contacted by anyone representing the IRS (or anyone representing a government agency) and looking for your personal information, suspicion is warranted. When in doubt, assume it's a scam.
