FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

I WILL HEAR WHAT THE LORD HAS TO SAY.

What a challenging gospel we have this weekend. Jesus told his disciples that when a community rejected them, they should stop outside the village, and shake the dust of that experience off their feet. It was a symbolic action against the village and a healing action for the disciples teaching them how to live.

What healing action is in it for me? Jesus is instructing us how to handle our experiences of failures. In four words Jesus says: "Shake off the dust." No one's life is an unbroken chain of victories. We all experience setbacks, defeats, losses, and failures.

Since failure is common to all of us, one of the most important life-skills we can learn is how to respond to it. Mature people know how to turn every failure into a learning experience, a steppingstone for future success.

The first thing to do is to analyze why you experienced failure. Although there may be variety of reasons (many are out of your control) here are five common causes of failure:

- 1. When you don't plan ahead. Remember, Noah had to start building the ark before it started raining! "A sensible man watches for problems ahead and prepares to meet them." Proverbs 27:12
- 2. When we think we have "arrived". Remember the lesson of the whale: just when you get to the top, and you start to blow that's when you get harpooned! "Pride leads to destruction, and arrogance leads to downfall". Proverbs 16:18.
- 3. When we are afraid to take necessary risks. The fear of failure can cause failure. We worry about what others will think of us if we fail, so we don't even try. "Fear of man is a dangerous trap". Proverbs 29:25.
- 4. When you give up too soon. Remember, the game is often won in the final seconds. Many times, success is just around the corner. "A lazy fellow has trouble all through life." Proverbs 15: 19.
- 5. When we ignore God's advice. The Bible is filled with practical instructions and guidelines for work, home, finances, relationships and health. When we fail to follow these, we're asking for trouble. "There is a way that sems right to a man, but in the end, it leads to death." Proverbs 14:12.

Remember failure is never final unless we let it be! If you've experienced failure, here are five steps for starting over.

- 1. Accept responsibility for your own failure. If you've made a mistake, admit it! "Aman who refuses to admit his mistakes can never be successful. But if he confesses and forsakes them, he gets another chance." Proverbs 28:13.
- 2. Recognize the benefits of failure. For instance, it shows you what doesn't work. "Don't call it a failure. Call it an education!" Thomas Edison. "It was good for me to be afflicted, in order to learn your statutes." Psalms 119:71.
- 3. Failure prevents arrogance and egotism. Failure is one way God gets us to reflect on the direction of our lives. "Sometimes it takes a painful experience to make us change our ways." Proverbs 20:30
- 4. Ask God for wisdom to understand the cause for the failure. Ask, "Why did I fail? Is there any reason I might have set myself up to fail?" "Trust the Lord with all your heart, and don't depend on your own understanding. Remember the Lord in all you do, and he will give you success." Proverbs 3:5-6.
- 5. Forget the past and focus on the future. Your past is past! You can't change it so you may as well stop worrying about it. "Brothers and sisters, I cannot consider myself a winner yet. This is what I do: I don't look back, I lengthen my stride, and I run straight toward the goal to win the prize that God's heavenly call offers in Christ Jesus." Philippians 3: 13-14.

AROUND THE DIOCESE

Synods and Synodality

What will be the work of the Synodality Steering Committee?

Bishop Estévez has appointed a committee with vast representation from across the diocese to enact our local diocesan synod consultation over the next several months. Over the next week months, you will be reading more about this 3- step process. The first step will be held in every diocese across the world. The second step will be a national consultation. The third step will be held in Rome in 2023. The official kick off weekend across the world will be Sunday, October 17. Our event will be held at St. Joseph Parish, starting with a 2:00 pm Mass, followed by formation and information.

Where does the word synod come from?

The word "synod" has deep roots within the Church's tradition. It is a two-part Greek word: syn, meaning "together" and hodos meaning the "road or the way." Putting the two parts together, we get the meaning of walking together along the way. We see in the Scriptures, that Jesus often taught His disciples while they walked "along the way." This idea became such a part of the community, that the followers of Jesus became known as "followers of the way."

Where in the Scriptures can we find the concept of synodality?

The story of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus is a good Scriptural example of how Jesus sought to listen to others as he walked with them. In the story, Jesus asks them to tell him their story which reveals some misunderstandings about him. Then, Jesus accompanies them to dinner, breaking open the Word of God with them and revealing himself in the breaking of the bread. This is how these disciples understood that Jesus was accompanying them on "their way." (Lk 24:13-35)

How does Acts of the Apostles give example of synodal thinking?

Throughout the history found in Acts of the Apostles, we see the concept of synodality, the entire community in conversation when important decisions need to be made that affect all. In Acts 1:15 we read that about 120 people gathered with Peter to discern a replacement for Judas. Later in Acts (15:1-35) we read about the first Council of the Church at Jerusalem wherein the Apostles and presbyters, "in agreement with the whole church" decide on several matters that affected the Gentiles as they sought to join the Church.

What is a Synod of Bishops?

Almost every two years since 1967, the Church has celebrated a Synod of Bishops. This is a special and unique moment in the life of the Church. Bishops from all over the world gather to assist the Bishop of Rome with "providing for the good of the universal Church". In each Synod, the Church "journeys together", along a specific path, focusing on a theme chosen by the Pope. In the end, the Pope "confirms his brethren in the faith" regarding "matters and situations that bear upon the internal life of the Church and upon the kind of action (s) that the Church should be carrying on in today's world" (Pope St. Paul VI)



As the synod process continues in our diocese, more information will be provided the following weeks.
