



NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL: EUCHARISTIC LESSONS

Eucharistic

DID YOU KNOW? According to a Pew study in the fall of 2019, only 30% of Catholics understand the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

As we go through the three year Eucharistic revival, we will be consistently providing lessons about the Eucharist from Sacred Tradition and Sacred Scripture and the meaning of this Revival. Let's continue:

The Mission of the Eucharistic Revival

To renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

The Vision of the Eucharistic Revival

To inspire a movement of Catholics across the United States who are healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—and who are then sent out on mission "for the life of the world."

The Four Phases of the Eucharistic Revival

Year of Diocesan Revival: June 2022-June 2023

Launched on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, or Corpus Christi, the first year invites diocesan staff, bishops, and priests to what Pope Francis has described as "a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ"—particularly the transforming power and mercy of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. Each Diocese will offer events that encourage the faithful to grow in their understanding and devotion to Christ in the Eucharist, complemented by online formation and resources that will raise up Eucharistic Missionaries at all levels of the Church! Please join us in prayer for the renewal and healing of the United States as we answer this historic call to revival.



Year of Parish Revival: June 2023-June 2024

The second phase will foster eucharistic devotion at the parish level, strengthening our liturgical life through eucharistic adoration, missions, resources, preaching, and organic movements of the Holy Spirit. These local efforts will help convert hearts and minds to fall more deeply in love with Jesus Christ, truly present in the Holy Eucharist.

National Eucharistic Congress

At this historic event, more than 80,000 Catholics of all ages will gather in Indianapolis to worship our Risen Lord in his humble disguise. The Holy Spirit will enkindle a missionary fire in the heart of our nation as we reconsecrate ourselves to the source and summit of our faith.



National Year of Mission

From the Congress in 2024 through Pentecost of 2025, the entire American Church will be sent on mission to share the gift of our Eucharistic Lord with their local communities and beyond. Let the light shine forth!


FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Is Jesus the light of your life?

When everything is in darkness because of a power failure we then appreciate the light. What a relief when the power returns and everything is lit up again. Jesus is the light of the world, but we will not appreciate 'this light until we appreciate the darkness in which we as human beings live. Until we feel the emptiness of life and the absolute frailty of human existence, we will have no need for Christ. We will be satisfied with what we have, thinking we are in the light. When the power is gone, and we read by the light of a candle we can become so used to this that we don't think of the electric light. In the same way we can get so used to the life we have, that we don't see the need for Christ.

Mother Teresa gives us a beautiful example of a man who was brought out of darkness into the light. One day in Melbourne, Australia, she visited a poor man whom nobody knew existed. The room in which he was living was in a terrible state of untidiness and neglect. There was no light in the room. The man hardly ever opened the blinds. He hadn't had a friend in the world. She started to clean and tidy the room. At first, he protested, saying, "Leave it alone. It's all right as it is." But she went ahead anyway. Under a pile of rubbish, she found a beautiful oil lamp, but it was covered with dirt. She cleaned and polished it. Then she asked him, "How come you never light the lamp?" "Why should I light it?" he replied. "No one ever comes to see me. I never see anybody." "Will you promise to light it if one of my sisters comes to see you?" "Yes," he replied. "If I hear a human voice, I'll light the lamp." Two of Mother Teresa's nuns began to visit him on a regular basis. Things gradually improved for him. — Then one day he said to the nuns, "Sisters, I'll be able to manage on my own from now on. But do me a favor. Tell that first Sister, who came to see me, that the light she lit in my life is still burning."

"Is our religion for you a matter of practices, rituals, rules and prayers or is it a life of love with Jesus? Is Jesus someone real for you? Do you live with him, work with him and do everything for him: Is Jesus the light of your life?




