How do we fast?

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat **one full meal**, as well as **two smaller meals** that together are **NOT** equal to a full meal.

What is Abstinence?

Abstinence is **refraining from eating meat** that comes from animals such as chickens, cows, sheep or pigs — all of which live on land. Birds are also considered meat. On the other hand, **fish** are a different category of animal. Salt and freshwater species of fish, amphibians, reptiles, (cold-blooded animals) and shellfish **are permitted**.

*Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the **physically** or **mentally ill** including individuals suffering from **chronic illnesses** such as diabetes. Also excluded are **pregnant** or **nursing women**.



LENTEN DISCIPLINE: SPIRITUALLY HEALTHY AND HAPPY LIFE

As we enter into the first Sunday of Lent, we hear of Jesus being led by the Spirit out into the wilderness when He fasted for 40 days.





In the book of Exodus, the Israelites wandered in the wilderness for 40 years for them to learn that God is their Provider and Savior, even though they failed in their faith in God, time and again.

Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness where God was His only security and protection and after




which he had to face the devil's temptations. But Jesus overcame the devil. Physically drained but spiritually strengthened, He rebutted and rebuked the devil.



What is it?

Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God.

How can we live it?

- Meditation of Holy Scripture, writings of the saints, fathers of the Church, spiritual authors, etc.
- Receiving the sacraments
- Daily acts of consecration or personal devotion
- Attending retreats, spiritual exercises, etc.

Examples for Lent:

- Praying the Stations of the Cross
- Daily reflection on Passion of Christ
- Attend Mass during the week other than Sunday
- Go to confession
- Increase personal prayer

FASTING

Fasting is the restriction of consumption so

as to grow in gratitude for what God has provided and to further focus on God.

How can we live it?

- Moderation in eating and drinking
- Reducing expenses on material things or luxurious things or events
- Abstaining from the internet, TV and other forms of entertainment for certain periods of time
- Fasting from slothfulness, gluttony, lust, gossip or other vices

Examples for Lent:

- Offer some food or drink that you like for Lent
- Fast from phone use
- Give up one of your social media apps for Lent
- Avoid cursing, gossiping or unnecessary speech

Almsgiving is the act of donating money, service or goods to the poor or performing other acts of charity.

How can we live it?

- Dedicate time to your family, studies, or work
- Helping others through service or material goods
- Doing an act of charity
- Be generous with your virtues and gifts that God has given you

- Donating food or clothing to St. Vincent de Paul
- Offer your time in a ministry or event at the parish like the Fish Fry
- Dedicate your time at home to help another family member with a chore
- Listen to someone's story with love
