FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



STEWARDSHIP FOOD FOR THOUGHT: 2ND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

In today's first reading, we hear Samuel respond eagerly, "Here I am!" each time the Lord calls him. May we, too, be listening for the call of God in our lives and be ready to say like the psalmist, "Here I am, Lord; I come to do your will."

WHAT IS COLLECTION MONEY USED FOR?

There is a serious obligation for a pastor to report each year on how the offerings or tithings of parishioners and other donors have been used. The Code of Canon Law urges pastors and other administrators of the Church's goods to be "good householders," and lists some resulting obligations (see Canon 1284). Among these is the responsibility to "draw up a report of the administration at the end of each year." Transparency in financial administration and accountability to donors are important values in the administration of Church goods.

Canon 1287 requires that this annual report be given to the "local ordinary" (in most dioceses, the diocesan bishop) and also to the parishioners. This canon could not be more explicit about this: "Administrators are to render an account to the faithful concerning the goods offered by the faithful to the Church."

Expenses can vary according to the size of a parish, its ministries — whether it has a parish school, for instance — and location.

That having been said, in almost every parish, as in most not-for-profit organizations, the largest single set of expenses is staff: wages and benefits for parish employees. Typically, the second largest set of expenses is funding for Catholic education: support for schools and programs of religious education for children and adults.

In many dioceses, a percentage of parish income is taxed by the



diocese as a means of providing operating funds for the central offices and ministries of the bishop. Let's not forget that it also costs money to turn on the lights; to operate heating and air conditioning; to keep water flowing; to maintain the buildings, grounds, and parking lots; to insure the parish property, pay any state or local taxes that are assessed; and even to provide hosts and wine for Mass.

Many parishes also use a portion of the weekly tithing or offering for charitable assistance outside of the parish. This is sometimes called "tithing the tithe" and takes the form of direct assistance to a mission project, or to another parish in need, or to a Catholic social service agency, whether nearby or far away.

It is also good stewardship for a parish to maintain savings in case of unplanned events — a leaky roof or equipment failure, for instance. Many parishes, if possible, try to put a bit of money away each year in savings for this purpose.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Ordinary Time of the Year!



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We begin the ordinary time of the year in the liturgical calendar of the Church after all the joyful and exciting celebrations of the seasons of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany. "Ordinary" does not mean routine, dull, boring, or non-exciting time in the Church's life of prayer and worship. It is 33 or 34 weeks of ordinary time or "Tempus Per Annum" in Latin, meaning "time throughout the year." This is the time between Christmas and Lent and between Easter and Advent. They are called "ordinary days" because they are ordered and numbered, since Sundays of ordinary time are expressed numerically.

The liturgical year follows the natural rhythms of life - periods of intense concentration and celebration followed by times of quiet reflection and maturation. Ordinary time challenges us to live the mysteries we celebrated during the great seasons in extraordinary ways as we continue our spiritual journey. We set aside the major anniversaries and remembrances of our faith and concentrate on our own intimacy with Christ to live the message of the gospels in down to earth, practical ways as we go about doing our daily chores and fulfilling our responsibilities, with all our limitations, imperfections, failures, and shortfalls.

The liturgical year of the Church is made up of six seasons:

Advent: Four weeks of preparation before Christmas, the celebration of the birth of Jesus.

Christmas: Recalling the Nativity of Jesus Christ and his manifestation to the peoples of the world.

Lent: Six-week period of Spiritual Discipline of prayer, penance, and almsgiving before Easter.

Sacred Paschal Triduum: The holiest "Three Days" of the Church's Year, remembering the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

Easter: 50 days of joyful celebration of the Lord's resurrection from the dead and his sending forth of the Holy Spirit.

Ordinary Time: 34 weeks, divided into two sections: (1)4-8 weeks after Christmas Time and (2) 26-30 weeks, about six months after Easter Time, remembering and reliving the fullness of Jesus' teachings and works among his people.

Seasons, saints, and celebrations during the liturgical year are laid out in a yearly liturgical calendar called ORDO, published every year.

"What are you looking for?

This weekend liturgy of the word invites us to reflect and meditate upon several questions in our lives...

Are you looking for the best in life? Are you looking for the worst in life? Are you looking for meaning and purpose in life? Are you looking to just get by in life? Are you looking for a God who is always present to you? Are you looking for a God found only in special places or once-in-a lifetime events? Are you looking for peace? Are you looking for division? Are you looking for reconciliation? Are you looking for alienation? Are you looking for hope? Are you looking for despair? Are you looking for light? Are you looking for darkness? Are you looking for revenge? Are you looking for redemption?

Why are these questions – and so many others like them – so important? Why? Because we tend to more easily or quickly see those things for which we are looking. We frequently fail to see or recognize those things for which we are not looking.

The Salesian tradition challenges us to look for a God who calls us by name, who loves us, who cherishes us, who pursues us, who forgives us, who strengthens us...and who calls us to do the same for one another.

And so, at this point in your life, ask yourself - what are you, in fact, looking for?

"Be not afraid of doubts and questions! By doubting we come to the question, and by seeking we may come upon the truth".

Dear Friends in Christ,

The national effort for a Eucharistic Revival has been underway for over a year. At the heart of every effort is a desire to respond more fully to God's invitation. The same God who gives us life wants to nourish us for our human journey. We live in a world filled with joys and challenges. We must respond, but the path forward is often difficult and uncertain. God does not abandon those who call out to him. He responds to give us strength as we follow the narrow way, as we carry our crosses alongside Jesus.

No part of human existence brings us as near to Jesus as the Eucharist. He tells us in very direct words, "Unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood, you have no life in you." "I am the Bread of Life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." (John 6)

As powerful a promise as Jesus makes, we can easily remain indifferent. The Eucharistic Revival is meant to awaken our hearts and minds so that we receive the gift of God that gives abundant life. Every time we gather for Mass, we enter a privileged place for intimate contact with our Living God.

For this reason, I am asking every parish to begin a more direct preparation for the encounter with Jesus at Mass. I ask every parish to create a more intentional environment of prayer before Mass begins. The main area of the church, especially around the altar, should preserve silence before Mass. The goal of this silence is not merely a greater quiet. This silence should promote a kind of prayer that turns the heart to God in anticipation. Enter your parish church with expectation for the gifts that God gives. Bring your joys and sorrows to the altar. Take time before Mass to speak with the Lord in your heart. Pray for your intentions. Surrender your burdens. Open your heart and mind to the Word of God in the Scriptures.

I am also asking those who plan the liturgy and those who serve as ushers and greeters to look for ways to promote quiet prayer in the final minutes before Mass begins. While we also value the welcoming nature of our parishes, it is possible to promote both friendly interaction and intentional preparation to meet the Lord in the Eucharist. We can better use the spaces outside of the sanctuary and the time after Mass for strengthening our community.

My hope is that the Eucharistic Revival can teach us a deeper prayer, especially in the privileged location of our churches. With this initiative we are also releasing some materials to guide our prayer. Because we are easily distracted, we need help to turn our minds to God as we prepare for Mass. Please take advantage of the guidance these materials provide and develop a habit of arriving early enough to silence your heart and turn your attention to God.

Our encounter with the Lord in the silence of our hearts takes practice and is well worth the effort. Together, let us Seek First the Kingdom of God, joining in prayer for the many needs of our world and the conversion of our hearts.
