

GUIDELINES FOR USE OF THE FAMILY LIFE CENTER

- The following guidelines have been put in place to assist in planning all events to ensure our Family Life Center serves the needs of our parish. Please contact the office if need further help.
- All use of the FLC must be scheduled in advance with the church office. In case of a conflicting date, the first request will be honored.
- Request forms are available in the office and must be submitted and approved for each event except for recurring ministry/parish board meetings. These only require an initial request.
- 4) The church office will assign the event space in the FLC to ensure the most efficient use.
- 5) First scheduling priority: Parish functions as well as ministry meetings and events. This includes but is not limited to ministry and committee meetings, faith formation, youth ministry events, family nights, and funeral/wedding receptions for funerals/weddings held in Holy Spirit Church.
- 6) Second scheduling priority: Celebrations of milestone life events for parishioners, and family members of a registered parishioner living in the same household and/or dependent on the parishioner for support. Events include birthdays limited to years 1, 16, 18, 21, 50, 60, 70, and above, Baptism, First Communion, baby showers, wedding anniversaries 1, 25, 50 and over, and retirements.
- 7) Third Scheduling Priority: Non-profit and charitable groups associated with DOSA.
- 8) The Pastor will have final approval of all requests and based upon availability may be able to hold some events in the gym.
- 9) Events will be required to pay for certain fees, such as a cleaning fee and insurance. Details of all charges will be reviewed for each event by the church office.
- 10) No events/celebrations during Mass times.

St. Patrick— March 17

This Prayer of St. Patrick is also known as the Breastplate Prayer or "Lorica" Prayer – Latin for "a Roman cuirass of

leather or metal." It is a beautiful prayer to say in the morning and remind yourself of the strength of Christ that works through you, and of course, an excellent prayer for St. Patrick's Day.

Many variations shorten the bolded portion of the full prayer below into a shorter prayer:

Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ in me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ on my right, Christ on my left, Christ when I lie down, Christ when I sit down, Christ in the heart of every man who thinks of me, Christ in the mouth of every man who speaks of me, Christ in the eye that sees me, Christ in the ear that hears me. Amen.

St. Joseph, Husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary— March 19

Saint Joseph occupies a special place among the cloud of witnesses in heaven. In the Collect (opening prayer in Mass) for the Solemnity of Saint Joseph on March 19, the Church recalls how he watched over the beginnings of the mysteries of

human salvation in the life of Christ. Christ wills to repeat those very same mysteries in our lives. In us, Christ wills to be born, to die, to rise, and to ascend to the Father's right hand. Saint Joseph, who faithfully cared for the beginnings of these mysteries, faithfully cares for us as these mysteries are perpetuated in our hearts, homes, and communities. Below is a prayer to St. Joseph:

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust with you Christ became man. Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.





FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Sir, we would like to see Jesus"...

Yes, all of us would like to see Jesus...for any number of reasons. Where do we look for Jesus? Do we look for Jesus up in the sky? Do we look for Jesus in faraway places? Do we look for Jesus in special people? Do we look for Jesus in extraordinary experiences? Do we look for Jesus in once-in-a-lifetime events? St. Francis de Sales suggests that we start closer to home:

"God is everywhere and in everything. There is no place or thing in this world in which God is not very really present. God is not only in the place in which you find yourself, but God, in a very special way, dwells in the depths of your heart." (Introduction to the Devout Life, II, 2)

If we want to see Jesus, we must first recognize him in ourselves. After all, we are created in God's – Christ's – the Spirit's – image and likeness. Christ dwells in our minds, hearts, affections, attitudes, and actions. Christ dwells amid our daily responsibilities, successes, and setbacks. Christ dwells in our spouses, children, parents, families, friends, neighbors, co-workers, and classmates. Wherever we "are", there Jesus "is".

Lent is a season for sharpening our eyesight, for clearing our vision and for focusing our perception of a God who is with us – always and in all ways! Do you want to see Jesus? Then, open your eyes! Open your ears! Open your hearts! Open your minds! Open your attitudes! Open your lives! Allow others to see in you The One for whom you look in others! Today!

St. Patrick, Bishop

Patron Saint of Ireland and invoked against snake bites.

Quote:

I, Patrick, a sinner, a most simple countryman, the least of all the faithful and most contemptible to many...was taken captive. I was at that time about sixteen years of age. I did not, indeed, know the true God; and I was taken into captivity in Ireland with many thousands of people...And there the Lord opened my mind to an awareness of my unbelief, in order that, even so late, I might remember my transgressions and turn with all my heart to the Lord my God... ~Confession of Saint Patrick



Prayer: Saint Patrick, you were captured and made a slave. God used that captivity to change your heart and draw you to Himself. Once converted, you chose to become a holy slave of Christ, bringing His saving message to a hostile and pagan land. Please pray for us, that we may imitate your conversion and place ourselves at the service of the will of God. Saint Patrick, pray for us!

Saint Joseph, Husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Solemnity

Patron Saint of the Universal Church, fathers, carpenters, and a happy death

As we honor Saint Joseph as the husband of Mary today, ponder the effect of that unique marriage bond. Saint Joseph was not perfect, but his absolute obedience to the Father's will and his unity in marriage to the Mother of God makes him our father, just as he was the father of Jesus. As a loving father, he will direct us with the authority of God the Father, will protect us in times of trouble as he did for Jesus and Mary, and must always be seen as one uniquely chosen to be the father of the family to which we belong. Saint Joseph, pray for us.

A Guide to





BEFORE YOU GO

Examine your conscience, that is, reflect on what sins you have committed. To guide you, take an "Examination of Conscience" guide from the gathering area or just Google one. Preparing to receive the sacrament helps us open ourselves to God's grace and mercy.



INTRODUCTION

When you come before the priest whether sitting face to face or behind the screen, begin by making the Sign of the Cross, and continue by saying, "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been (how long) since my last confession. My sins are..."



CONFESSION

List the sins you've committed that came to mind during your examination of conscience or any that also come to mind during this time. Don't be too general ("I haven't been a good person"), but also don't be too detailed (you don't need to tell the whole story of how a sin came about). If you're not sure, ask the priest. Remember that this is not professional counseling, but the sacrament of Confession.



PENANCE

The priest will then give you something to do or pray as your penance. Penance is your response to God's mercy. You'll have to remember what this is and do it after the confession is over, so pay attention.



ACT OF CONTRITION

The priest will then ask you to pray out loud the "Act of Contrition": My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy.



ABSOLUTION

After you pray the Act of Contrition, the priest will extend his hands and pray the Prayer of Absolution. Here, the priest acts in the person of Christ, so as to forgive your sins. Remember it's still God that is forgiving your sins, but he priest acts in the person of Christ at this moment.



CONCLUSION

The priest will then say some conclusion such as "Go in peace," and you can respond, "Thanks be to God." Don't forget to do your penance. If it is saying certain prayers, the best is to do it right away before you leave the church or before you forget.


