FR. AMAR'S UPDATE

Dear parishioners: I am writing you today to update you on a few things happening around our parish. First of all, I want to thank you all for participating in our daily and Sunday Liturgies. It is a joy as a priest to be united with our parish family even from a distance.

I am glad to let you know that as of May 5, 2020, Bishop Felipe Estevez, has granted us permission to begin the reopening of public Masses the weekend of 16/17 May and for weekday Masses beginning the week of 18 May! However, there is no obligation to attend Mass in the diocese of Saint Augustine until further notice. Our Live Stream will remain available.

Our first public Mass at Holy Spirit will be the **5PM Vigil Saturday**, **May 16th. Our regular Sunday schedule will begin on May 17th** with 8:15am and 11am Masses. Daily Masses will remain at 8:30am Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday and 7pm on Wednesday.

Physical distancing and seating. This is part of Phase 1 of our parish reopening and will have **many new protocols** that all parishioners **must follow to attend Mass**. We must abide by State and Local laws and restrictions that pertain to physical distancing. The requirement of physical distancing will impose restrictions on the capacity of the number of the faithful participating in Masses. We may increase the number of the weekend Masses depending on the need. Thank you for your patience and cooperation.

I am humbled by the generosity and support of our parish family during this crisis. To those who have supported us during the closure of the parish, a heartfelt thank you. While the parish is closed to public masses and events, we continue to have the normal expenses for facilities and salaries and could not maintain our staff or campus without your help. I also ask that you continue to pray for myself and all of our staff and volunteers, as we continue to look for creative ways to stay connected with our parishioners and ministries. I have been encouraged by the innovative ways of our staff and our volunteers who have been able to maintain outreach efforts. Our school and Religious education program is in full force with online studies and continue to progress toward their sacraments this year. While the RCIA candidates did not have the opportunity to celebrate the Eucharist at the Easter Vigil, they also continue to learn more about our faith through tireless efforts of Deacon Ed and appreciate your prayers as they anticipate the time in which they will come into full communion with our parish.

Please know that I continue to pray for each of you, that you are doing well and are in good health. Unfortunately, we know several of our parish families will be touched by this pandemic, whether it be illness, loss of a loved one or loss of a job. Please know that we are here for you and together, we will get through this crisis.

HOMILY BY BISHOP FELIPE J. ESTEVEZ

Homily by Bishop Felipe J. Estévez for the Fifth Sunday of Easter

Dear Faithful of the Diocese of St. Augustine:

"In every age, you have been our refuge ... you have been our hope."

Those words are from a popular Catholic hymn that brings hope for many who hear it! Perhaps it is what they sense as they gather in their faith communities and feel some personal loss or distress – and for many, solace from gathering with fellow followers of Jesus when they hear it at the Eucharist.

We all gather at the table of God's beloved son and pray for one another – even if we don't know one another present that day at Mass – we join together – we rely on one another.

The words of that hymn remind me to look back into the scriptures and read the story of salvation, and we will find ourselves there. It is all about hope.

As I write to you, I am keenly aware that tens of thousands in our own country have died because of the coronavirus – and so many more across the globe, in every nation. Unemployment and financial challenges that are unprecedented since the Great Depression in the early 20th century in our own country's history impact us now, and the effects we now experience will affect our lives for many years.

We should pray earnestly for wisdom for our nation's leaders – prayer for the welfare of our country – that not only are wise decisions made for the welfare and health of our needs in the USA – but all children of God.

As your shepherd, I know how much hope we need now.

We certainly need a lot of assurance of hope these days. I recently learned that one of our parishes had changed its annual May crowning of Mary for both its school and religious education program. Typically, children bring flowers which are then made into arrangements and shared with the elderly in nursing homes. This year, they plan a drive-by dropping off food for the needy to serve those most affected by this medical crisis – the most affected and the most vulnerable. Rather than flowers, I am sure the Lord's Mother will smile lovingly on such an effort.

May we all hear what is told Philip in the Gospel today – and hear the Lord speak and remind each one of us – that he IS the "way" – indeed, we follow the Good Shepherd who shows us the way. I see and hear how so many are following the "Way."

Be assured of my remembrance of all of you at my daily Mass during these difficult days.

When I think of a mother, I think of the home. "Be it ever so humble, there's no place like home." "Home is where the heart is." Home has always been a gathering place, shelter, and sanctuary, providing escape from the busyness and intrusiveness of the world. We might reasonably suppose, therefore, that home is a readily understood concept and source of universally positive feelings.

In recent times, with stay-at-home order, home has become a more problematic notion. Many of us have wisely decided to stay at home and avoid crowds and the risk of either catching the virus or unintentionally infecting other people. You may find yourself feeling isolated, depressed, bored, worried, ruminating, and hopeless. But still home is home.

It is the love that welcomes us that makes a home and we all need one. That is where we belong, where we can relax and be our selves. Life is a journey to our home. God has manifested himself in the man from Nazareth. Jesus is God living among us. In today's gospel He said; "I and the Father are one". "To have seen me is to have seen the Father".

The God of the Universe is humble. One of us, a man, he invites us to trust in him and become his friend. It is unbelievable but true. We are given this life here as the time to choose him by word and deed. He will take his friends to his home and as members of the family – the family of God – they will live forever. He wants his friends to be where he is.

Jesus is the way to the home of God because it is our friendship, our relationship, with him, which is heaven. Friendship with Jesus is the way to God. He is a man and through him we go to the Father who is pure Spirit. The father and Jesus are one God. By being one with Jesus now, we are already with God but in the darkness of faith.

Jesus tells his disciples this but they are bewildered as is revealed by the questions of Thomas and then of Philip. Maybe you feel bewildered too. Jesus and his Father are one in the Holy Spirit who is the Love between them. The Holy Spirit knows the depths of God and he comes to us. He will reveal everything about God to us. Understanding is not so important. Loving Jesus in faith is crucial.

The father lives in Jesus and Jesus lives in us. Jesus is now with his father and equal in every way with Him and he is in us. It is Jesus who works through us and so Jesus has promised that we will do the same works as he did. When we hear this, we often think of miracles but the greatest miracle we can perform for people is to love them with a love that is sincere and comes from our heart. May we allow Jesus to love people through us. This more than any sensational miracle will touch the hearts of men and women who haven't yet known Jesus.

Do you see Jesus as real person who invites you to look for him in faith? How do you respond in faith to his call for friendship? Do you experience Jesus in you when you deal with others? Does he love others through you?

Protect those doctors, nurses, health workers and volunteers who are on the frontline of this emergency, and are risking their lives to save others. Support their heroic effort and grant them strength, generosity and continued health.

Be close to those who assist the sick night and day, and to priests who, in their pastoral concern and fidelity to the Gospel, are trying to help and support everyone.

Blessed Virgin, illumine the minds of men and women engaged in scientific research, that they may find effective solutions to overcome this virus.

Support national leaders, that with wisdom, solicitude and generosity they may come to the aid of those lacking the basic necessities of life and may devise social and economic solutions inspired by farsightedness and solidarity.

Mary Most Holy, stir our consciences, so that the enormous funds invested in developing and stockpiling arms will instead be spent on promoting effective research on how to prevent similar tragedies from occurring in the future.

Is the Lord Calling You?

Children who remain in their faith have had at least five adults in their lives that walked with them in their faith. Will you be one of those 5 walking with these young people? If so, please volunteer to help in some way. We must have 1 cleared adult for every 8 children or there is no youth group. If the Lord is calling you, here's what you can do:

Adult Core Team

Must be 18 or older, able to pass a background check and attend a Protecting God's Children class. If interested, please submit a volunteer form which will be followed by an interview in order to understand how you would like to help. Ways you can help include planning, preparing meals/snacks, chaperone youth nights and/or field trips, etc.

Youth Leadership Team

We are also putting together a **Youth Leadership Council** for the next school year with youth who will be in the 6th thru 12th grades. There will only be <u>two</u> youth per grade selected to serve on this council which is a peer group that will help plan and execute youth nights.

COVID -19 TIPS

ATTENTION

An important reminder to be particularly vigilant and protective with your personal information and financial resources during this difficult time.



Nothing brings out the scam-

mers like "free money," and the recent decision on Economic Impact Payments (or "Stimulus Checks") being sent out by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) as tax credit under The "Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act" or the "CARES Act" has scammers already coming up with schemes to defraud taxpayers and small businesses of their money and important personal identification data. Specifically, identity thieves are using confusion over the stimulus checks and associated bank loans. They are also appealing to faith groups and individuals offering special aid for churches that are scams and Catholics are prime targets.

When it comes to the IRS and taxes, remember that **the IRS** will never:

- Call to demand immediate payment over the phone, nor will the agency call about taxes owed without first having mailed you a bill.
- Threaten to immediately bring in local police or other lawenforcement groups to have you arrested.
- Demand that you pay taxes without allowing you to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.
- Require you to use a specific payment method for your taxes, such as a prepaid debit card, gift card, or wire transfer.
- Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone. If you should be contacted by anyone representing the IRS (or anyone representing a government agency) and looking for your personal information, suspicion is warranted. When in doubt, assume it's a scam.
