FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK



REST AND RECREATION:

"It's been one year since we lost <u>Msgr. James J. Heslin</u>. Msgr. Heslin, beloved Pastor Emeritus of Holy Spirit, journeyed home on July 23, 2020. He retired as pastor of Holy Spirit on June 30, 2006; he served our parish for 22 years.

Please join me on Friday July 23 at 6pm in the church for a special prayer service on his 1st death anniversary and for reception to follow in the FLC. Eternal rest grant unto your servant, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him! May his soul and souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

We know what the letters RIP stand for. It is often engraved on tombstones and on niches. Of course, in that context as with Msgr. Heslin, it stands for "Rest in Peace". So, it seems that only those who have passed on, those who have died, only they are entitled to rest in peace. But for the living, and that is all of us, we also would like to "RIP", but our "RIP" is in another sense, and that is "Rest If Possible".

About fifteen hundred years ago, St. Benedict gave us the formula for good living. They are PRAYER, WORK and RECREATION. We need to take rest. It is necessary that we have to have R and R (Rest and Recreation or Retreat and Recollection) with our family, friends, and others.

Once a child was talking to her mother thus: "Mommy, please play with me." "I can't," said the mother. "Why can't you play with me?" "It is because I don't have time." "Why don't you have time?" "It is because I've got to go to work." "Why do you have to go to work?" "So, I can earn some money." "Why do you want to earn money?" "So, I can give you something to eat." Here there was a short pause. Then the child said, "But, Mommy, I am not hungry."

Jesus' invitation today, "You must come away to some lonely place, all by yourselves and rest for a while," exemplifies the necessity to take off from the constant routine of duties.

The same message is built into the story of creation. God worked for six days and on the seventh day he rested. If God needs rest, surely, we do also.

The truth is, work, business and other jobs are supposed to give us the living and the meaning for our life and self. But how many of us who become slaves to work, and workaholic understand this? Instead of being masters of our work, we become slaves to it. Work becomes God if it steals the time from our family, friends, God, and others.

Our danger with the fast-paced culture is that we are too busy, always rushing and have no time for pause and reflection. And so, we ignore the importance of the proper use of days off, holidays and Sunday. Sunday should be a day not just for Mass, but if possible different from all other days. A family meal with family and friends is very important. Because there are greater things than money to save: your marriage, your friend-ships, and your sanity. The words of Jesus still make a lot of sense: "You must come away to some lonely place all by yourselves and rest for a while."

There are three reasons for Jesus' call to 'rest for a while'. **The Practical Reason**. His disciples are tired, so they need physical rest to have more energy. They need to slow down so that they will not be burned out and get sick and so we are we. **The Psychological Reason**. We all need space and time to be by ourselves. We need a break from the maddening noise of the crowd. And in order that we do not become grouchy and angry, thus driving people away from Jesus instead of bringing then in. **And the Spiritual Reason**. In a quiet and prayerful atmosphere, we gather our bearings and get inspired again.

At the end Jesus gave rest to His disciples, how considerate are we towards people who work for us? What is your idea of rest? How do you go about with it? Do you set aside some moments for God? How do you react when someone asks for your help when you are exhausted and in need of rest?

Synods and Synodality, part 2

The Role of the Synod of Bishops

In the words of Pope Francis, the Synod of Bishops is a body that, "manifests the solicitude of the College of Bishops for the needs of the People of God and for communion among the Churches." The Synod is a means of gathering information on a particular theme from local Churches. The Synodal Assembly has a "consultative role, offering information and counsel to the Roman Pontiff on various ecclesial questions, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit." (Pope Francis using the words of Pope St. Paul VI). The Synodal Process, then, is to be a suitable instrument to give voice to the entire People of God.

Documents that govern a Synod

There are several documents which govern the workings of a Synod. The Apostolic Letter of Pope St. Paul VI, Apostolica sollecitudo (1965), is a general outline for future synods. Ordo synodi episcoporum (1966) contains the norms regarding how themes are chosen, organizational details as well as some very specific details for the gatherings themselves. This document is updated to reflect current structure or needs. The Code of Canon Law (1983) has a chapter dedicated to the Synod of Bishops. Most recently, People Francis issued Apostolic constituio episcopalis communio (2018) which is the current governing document for Synods. The essential change that Pope Francis made to the previous documents is the inclusion of the entire People of God in both the consultation and implementation phases.

Types of Synod

There are three types of Synods of Bishops:

- 1. Ordinary General Assembly which is called to reflect on matters that pertain to the good of the universal Church. There have been 13 of these Assemblies called the last one being in 2018, Synod on Young People, Faith, and Vocational Discernment.
- 2. Extraordinary General Assembly which, like its name, means an exception to what is normally done. This assembly is called to reflect on matters of a more urgent nature.
- 3. Special Assembly which is called for a particular geographic region and not for the Church Universal. The Synod on the Pan-Amazon Region (2019) would be an example.

The Three Phases of a Synod

Every Synod primary has three phases. The first is a preparatory phase. Normally a preparatory document gathers information from Bishops, congregations of the consecrated, and from the Roman Curia. The second stage is the discussion phase wherein members, experts, auditors, and other people who have been invited attend meetings in Rome. The third phase is the implementation phase wherein the Holy Father, in conversation with the Bishops, create a commission or utilize a current commission to implement the work of the Synod. This is announced by way of an Apostolic Letter.



As the synod process continues in our diocese, more information will be provided the following weeks.
