



FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

Life is about creating yourself!

We begin the holy season of Advent. God comes to save his people. Saving implies some danger or threat from which we are unable to liberate ourselves. In the midst of our work, worries, and cares the Church calls us to turn towards the Lord to be saved by him and to be blessed by him.





The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36).

Stephen Covey, in his book "7 Habits of Highly Effective People" has told us a story about a very strong woodcutter who asked for a job with a timber merchant, and he got it. The wages the timber merchant paid was really good and so were the work conditions. For that reason, the woodcutter was determined to do his best.

His boss gave him an axe and showed him the area where he was supposed to work. The first day, the woodcutter brought 18 trees. "Congratulations," the boss said. "Go on that way! Very motivated by the words of the boss, the woodcutter tried harder the next day, but he only could bring 15 trees. The third day he tried even harder, but he only could bring 10 trees.

Day after day he was bringing less and less trees. "I must be losing my strength," the woodcutter thought. He went to the boss and apologized, saying that he could not understand what was going on.

"When was the last time you sharpened your axe?" the boss asked. "Sharpen? I had no time to sharpen my axe. I have been very busy trying to cut trees..."

We may have been very busy with so many things; we may have neglected our spiritual life. Like the axe that needs sharpening, we also need to sharpen our spirit. Let us sharpen our spirit this Advent by becoming more loving, more praying, more compassionate, more generous and more faithful. Life is not about finding yourself! Life is about creating yourself!
