

FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

Every year, on the Second Sunday of Easter we celebrate the Divine Mercy.

Why do we celebrate a feast for God's mercy? Because, God is so merciful and mercy is His second name. He is merciful to the sinners and saints alike. Today, we are reminded that Jesus gave his spirit to the Church, enabling it to be a forgiving community.

There is a Spanish story about a father and son who had become estranged after years of bitter strife. The son finally ran away. Finding that his son was missing, the father became heartbroken and set off to find him. He searched for months to no avail. Finally, in a last desperate effort, the father placed an advertisement in the city newspaper. The ad read: "Dear Paco, meet me in front of the bell tower in the plaza at noon on Saturday. All is forgiven. I love you. Your father". That Saturday eighty Pacos men and boys showed up in the plaza, looking for forgiveness and love from their fathers. The message of Mercy Sunday is: "All is forgiven. I love you!"

The message of mercy is that God loves us – all of us – no matter how great our sins. He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy. It is a message we can call to mind simply by remembering **ABC**.


A: Ask for His mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.

B: Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.

C: Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.

When life becomes hard, we must remember the promise of the resurrection. We have been told by the Savior that his life and death has promised us life eternal. And Low Sundays don't change that

promise. And unemployment doesn't change that promise. Neither does divorce, or bankruptcy, or cancer, or depression, or failure, or COVID. Through elation and deflation and every emotion in between, this truth remains; we know whose we are and we know where we are going, because the Son of God has promised.

ORIGIN OF DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY THE DIVINE MERCY IMAGE, THE CHAPLET, AND THE NOVENA



Saint Faustina: Mankind's need for the message of Divine Mercy took on dire urgency in the 20th Century, when civilization began to experience an "eclipse of the sense of God" and, therefore to lose the understanding of the sanctity and inherent dignity of human life. In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary.

St. John Paul II explains: This was precisely the time when those ideologies of evil, nazism and communism, were taking shape. Sister Faustina became the herald of the one message capable of off-setting the evil of those ideologies, that fact that God is mercy—the truth of the merciful Christ. And for this reason, when I was called to the See of Peter, I felt impelled to pass on those experiences of a fellow Pole that deserve a place in the treasury of the universal Church. ~ Pope Saint John Paul II, Memory and Identity (2005)

Divine Mercy Sunday: St. Faustina's Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) be observed, for example:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. ... Let no soul fear to draw near to Me. ... It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy. (Diary, no. 699)

On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

The Image: Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, no. 48) and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls" (Diary, no. 742).

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy: The Chaplet was also given to St. Faustina with this promise: "Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you" (Diary, no. 1541). "Whoever will receite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. ... Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy. I desire that the whole world know My infinite mercy" (Diary, no. 687).

The Divine Mercy Novena: Jesus gave St. Faustina nine intentions for which to pray the Chaplet beginning on Good Friday and ending on the Saturday before Divine Mercy Sunday.

STEWARDSHIP COUNCIL MEETING - MARCH 23, 2021

The parish Stewardship Council met for the first time in 13 months to discuss ways in which we can responsibly return to being an active faith community. The shutdown of not just Holy Spirit parish, but social, work, school and entertainment aspects of our lives last March was shocking and sudden! In contrast, the return to "normal" will be very measured and gradual. At our last meeting in February 2020, we were making grand plans for the entire year, with a timeline full of existing and new activities. We all know what happened to almost any plans we had last March! But as more and more people are getting vaccinated, as we have adapted to masks, extra hand sanitizing and social distancing, we and the CDC are seeing a time in the near future when we can gradually open life up and put those plans into action! Now is the time to start preparing!

Some of the first things we plan to do starting mid-May are:
Coffee & donuts after the 8:00, 9:30 and 11:30 am Sunday masses
Wine and Cheese socials once a month after 5 PM Saturday mass
Return the International Mass at 11:30 on Pentecost, May 23 with a picnic following
Family Fun Day idea was mentioned
Movie nights-----Indoor and/or outdoor

Discussions of when and how to slowly begin removing the ropes from church pews took place.

While we have gone from full "normal" to full shutdown, to partial reopening under CDC guidelines your parish has still moved ahead more vigorously than most other churches and businesses with the encouragement of our pastor and ministry heads.

Masses have been live streamed since late March 2020.

H.S. school students have all been able to attend one Mass a week with their classmates throughout this school year.

The church quickly implemented social distancing and masking, added hand sanitizing dispensers and contactless Holy Water and Father Amar added an extra Sunday mass.

A state-of-the-art audio/visual system was installed in the church, the bathrooms were renovated and the parish office interior totally updated. (all the projects were almost entirely donated by generous parishioners)

RCIA, Bible study and CCD continued and our parish website now matches in quality and content that of any parish or national Catholic website.
