A Guide to





BEFORE YOU GO

Examine your conscience, that is, reflect on what sins you have committed. To guide you, take an "Examination of Conscience" guide from the gathering area or just Google one. Preparing to receive the sacrament helps us open ourselves to God's grace and mercy.



INTRODUCTION

When you come before the priest whether sitting face to face or behind the screen, begin by making the Sign of the Cross, and continue by saying, "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been (how long) since my last confession. My sins are..."



CONFESSION

List the sins you've committed that came to mind during your examination of conscience or any that also come to mind during this time. Don't be too general ("I haven't been a good person"), but also don't be too detailed (you don't need to tell the whole story of how a sin came about). If you're not sure, ask the priest. Remember that this is not professional counseling, but the sacrament of Confession.



PENANCE

The priest will then give you something to do or pray as your penance. Penance is your response to God's mercy. You'll have to remember what this is and do it after the confession is over, so pay attention.



ACT OF CONTRITION

The priest will then ask you to pray out loud the "Act of Contrition": My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy.



ABSOLUTION

After you pray the Act of Contrition, the priest will extend his hands and pray the Prayer of Absolution. Here, the priest acts in the person of Christ, so as to forgive your sins. Remember it's still God that is forgiving your sins, but he priest acts in the person of Christ at this moment.



CONCLUSION

The priest will then say some conclusion such as "Go in peace," and you can respond, "Thanks be to God." Don't forget to do your penance. If it is saying certain prayers, the best is to do it right away before you leave the church or before you forget.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Advent a Season of Waiting...

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Advent means coming. It is a time set aside to prepare for the newborn King. These four weeks of Advent represent the four thousand years which preceded the coming of the Messiah. So, for Catholic Christians, nothing is more noble, nothing more honorable than steadfast love. The season of

Advent is a time of joyful, faith-filled waiting. We are invited to consider the weeks of preparation for Christmas as an opportunity for nurturing a spirituality of waiting in expectation - not a passive, inactive, idle and unimaginative presence in space and time - but a dynamic, active and positively imaginative waiting - a spiritual posture of waiting and longing for Christ, praying and preparing for his ultimate appearance among us - a spirituality of hope, simple and pure optimism about us and the world around us.

Each week we are encouraged to deepen our spirituality even further, personally and as a faith community. We are reminded again that our faith in God, our hope in His promises and our love for Him and each other are the greatest wealth that we possess; that we are a privileged people, a people blessed and graced by God's unconditional love revealed in Jesus; that God has not abandoned the world; that God breaks into our history with healing and transforming grace; that the presence of or even the height of evil must not discourage us. The apparent brokenness and disintegration of the world will be healed. God continues to bring about healing, integrity, and wholeness. We are specially reminded that we must live blameless and loving lives as we wait for the Lord's Advent.

Be watchful! Be alert! Be vigilant like the gatekeeper awaiting the master's return: "Watch!" Jesus taught the disciples to be watchful, alert, and awake...to be prepared. He said to them that no one knew the day or the hour when God would break into their history. He added: "I say this to all". Today's Gospel passage taken from St. Mark calls us, all of us, not just those who were listening to Jesus or the readers of St. Mark in his day. All believers are urged to wait patiently and vigilantly for the Lord's coming, not knowing time or space or situation, but joyfully waiting with great expectation. To be waiting means being faithful to who and what you are and to the responsibilities that come forth from your call. Jesus called them to be faithful even in the master's absence, even when no one is watching. Faithfulness is an enduring quality of a person and not just doing duties and fulfilling obligations.

Let this prayer of the prophet become ours during the season of Advent: Lord, remember, return, redeem and renew your people. Come – O come – Emmanuel. Have a blessed Advent!

THANK YOU!

Sixteen years ago, as I was minding my own business, puttering around one of the islands in the parking lot, pulling weeds and picking up fallen tree limbs, Father Ananda spied me and said that he thought the parish needed a "Grounds Minister" and I was it! I was as bewildered as the Apostle Peter or the tax collector Zacchaeus when they were summoned by Jesus, but somewhat stunned, I simply said, "Yes, Father" and then set off to figure out what being a "grounds minister" meant.

At the time, our campus had many more trees, and large areas filled with wild vines, palmettos and thick brush which I referred to as "the jungle". Since I could see that "the jungle" had to be tamed before any new plants and flowers were added, that became my focus for the first few years. But at the same time Father Ananda wanted the "islands" around the church and the Rosary Garden to be made more attractive. I was fortunate that several volunteers were already doing some of that work and was able to recruit more. In the last 16 years several dozen individuals and couples (none more so than Tim & Anne Hergenroether) have generously volunteered their time and talents to adding beauty and color to our parish grounds, while I have been the head weed puller and tree trimmer. With the help of many others I was able to pull countless vines out of our trees, cut down old and diseased trees, trimmed dozens of branches large and small, trimmed hedges at the church, school and rectory, learned what a "Hula hoe" is and how to use it, planted countless flowers and shrubs with my mentor Joe Hess, helped to level and widen the soccer field (again with MUCH help!), climbed ladders, trees and roofs on numerous projects, filled and dumped hundreds of barrels of weeds and wild grass and became proficient with various lawn mowers, edgers, chain saws, pressure washers, pole saws and the "bush hog". Frankly, I'm sure my OCD mindset got me carried away at times! Days when I would tackle a project alone could be very tiring, but the days I had help and companionship I found fun and fulfilling and I almost didn't want them to end! But especially in those times alone, I remembered that Father Ananda hadn't asked me to do a "job", but to be a "minister" so I offered my sweat and effort, as any Fransalian will tell you, as my prayer.

But now at age 77, it's time for me to step aside and let younger people have the joy of this ministry. I hope that those of you reading this will prayerfuly consider whether the "Grounds Ministry" is the way for you to serve your parish and use your labors in God's beautiful world as prayer. There is always work to be done, but the "jungle" is gone and the physical effort required to maintain and improve what has been started is well within the capabilities of almost everyone. What is needed now is consistent maintenance and an eye for adding beauty and color, not heavy labor. Many hands make light work! Next March, when we hold our "Spring Cleanup (or Beautification) Day", with a new "Grounds Minister", I will be happy to be trimming and hoeing with my many friends celebrating 17 years of service to the Lord!
