How do we fast?

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are NOT equal to a full meal.

What is Abstinence?

Abstinence is refraining from eating meat that comes from animals such as chickens, cows, sheep or pigs all of which live on land. Birds are also considered meat. On the other hand, fish are a different category of animal. Salt and freshwater species of fish, amphibians, reptiles, (cold-blooded animals) and shellfish are permitted.

*Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women.

World Day of the Sick

The World Day of the Sick is an awareness day, or observance, in the Catholic Church intended for "prayer and sharing, of offering one's suffering for the good of the Church and of reminding everyone to see in his sick brother or sister the face of Christ". The day was instituted on 13 May 1992 by Pope John Paul II and is celebrated on 11 February, also the memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes.

World Day of the Sick serves as a reminder of the human capacity for compassion and care, especially in the face of suffering and illness. It calls upon individuals, communities, and institutions to extend a helping hand and offer solace to those in need. Whether through acts of service, prayer, or reflection, this day invites us to recognize the inherent dignity of every person and the importance of solidarity in the journey towards healing and well-being.

On World Day of the Sick, let us join in acknowledging the challenges faced by the sick and in expressing our commitment to providing them with the support, love, and care they deserve.

World Marriage Day

World Marriage Day honors husband and wife as the foundation of the family, the basic unit of society. It salutes the beauty of their faithfulness, sacrifice, and joy in daily married life." It is an opportunity to focus on building a culture of life and love that begins with supporting and promoting marriage and the family. This year's theme, "Marriage...one flesh, given and received" highlights the one-flesh union of husband and wife that is willed by God. It also indicates the personal self-gift of each spouse, one to the other. These concepts point to Christ who gives Himself under the appearance of bread and wine—as real flesh and blood.

Prayer: Lord, we thank you for your tremendous gift of the Sacrament of Marriage. Help us to witness its glory by a life of growing intimacy. Teach us the beauty of forgiveness so we may become more and more One in Heart, Mind and Body. Strengthen our communication and help us become living signs of your love. Ash Wednesday on Feb 14 – Lent Begins...

We will begin our Lenten Journey with a cross traced in ashes on the foreheads of all who came to Church on Ash Wednesday. Ashes direct our attention to the transitory character of created realities - that nothing in this world is permanent and nothing in the world of matter is forever.

Be attentive to what is important and what is trivial, what needs action now and what is not really all that important or urgent. Be attentive to whatever is going on beneath the surface. There is always something beyond what seems important or urgent in the moment.

The season of Lent calls us to be attentive to the moments of grace that God puts in front of us. Notice the "moments of grace" in your life. These moments are not just something that happens to you...they are what you can offer someone else - the times that you can be there for someone, listen to someone, compliment someone, help someone - serve someone. Those are the moments in life worth paying attention to - they are moments of Grace and now is the moment of grace.

May this season of Lent enable us to become more attentive, sensitive, and vigilant. Have a Blessed Season of Lent!


